



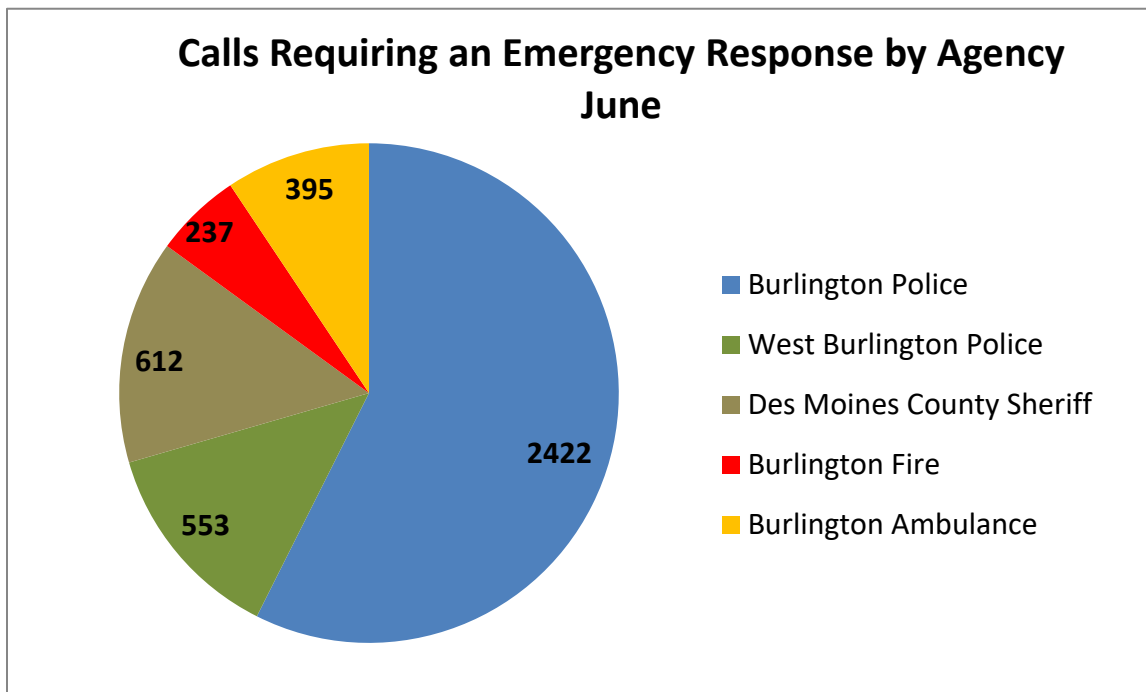

Re: Police Department Activities – June 2019

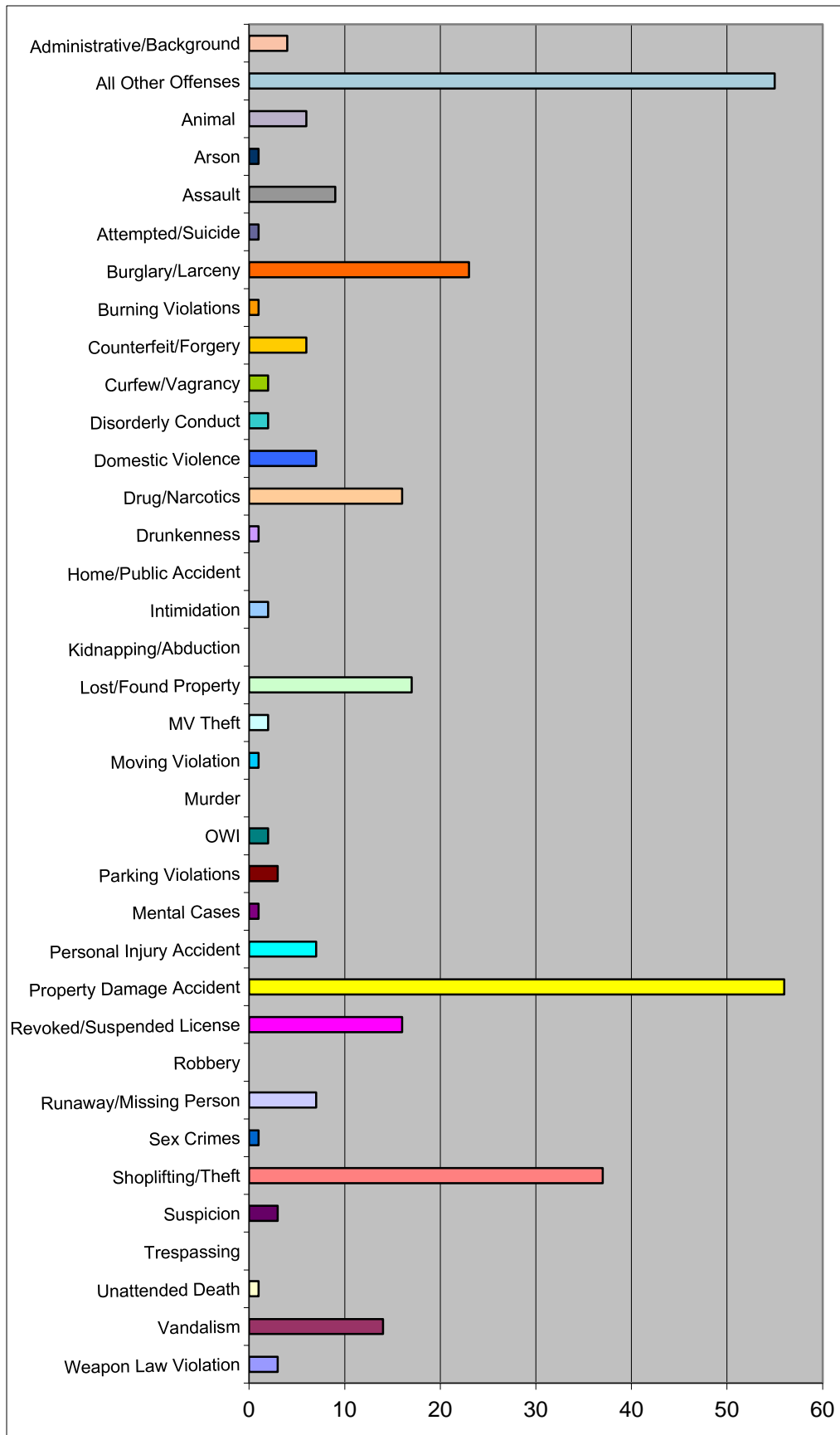
- Chief Kramer or Major Grimshaw attended all City Council Work Session and Meetings.

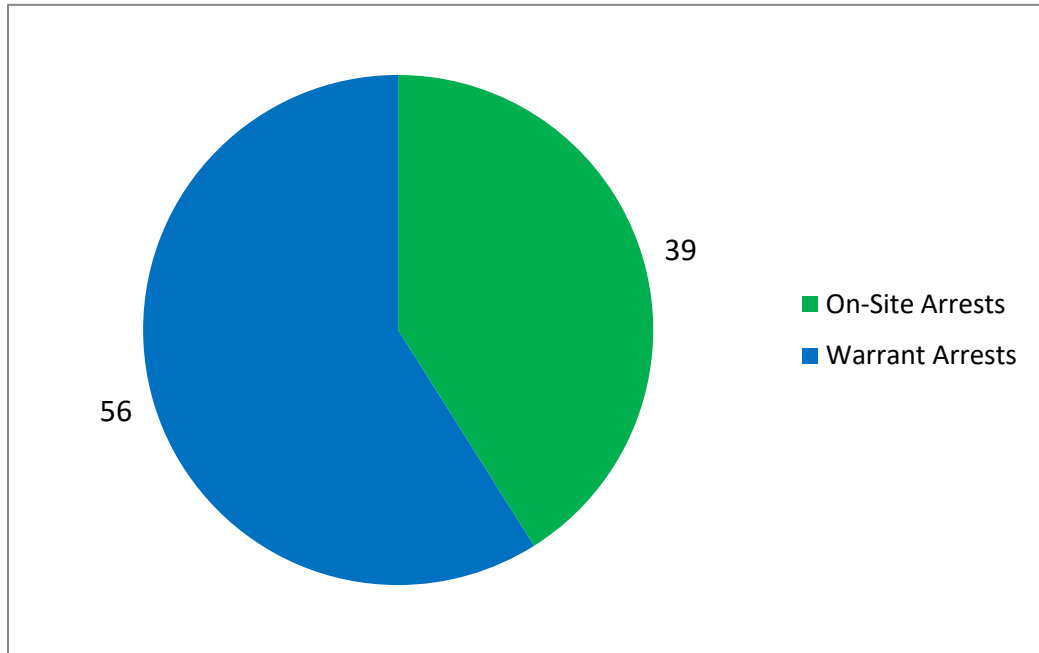
- The Des Moines County Attorney conducted a search and seizure training with for all sworn officers.
