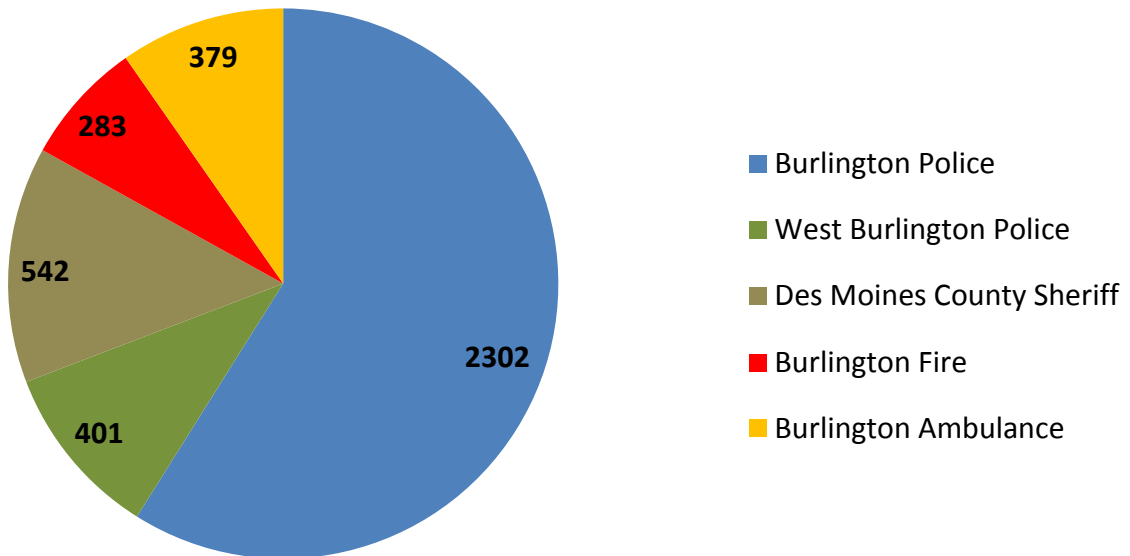

Re: Police Department Activities – August, 2016



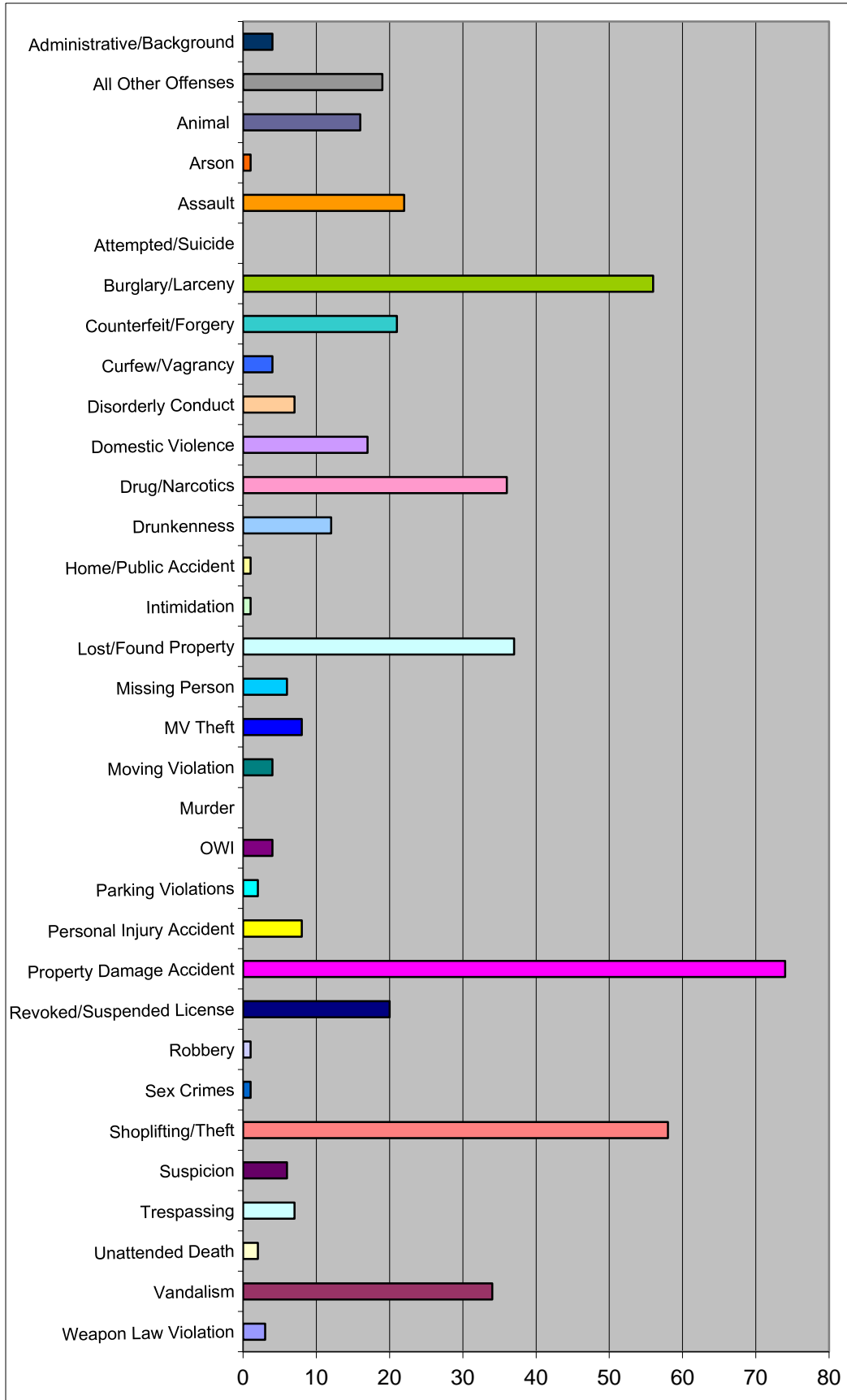
- The Chief attended all City Council Work Session and Meetings.

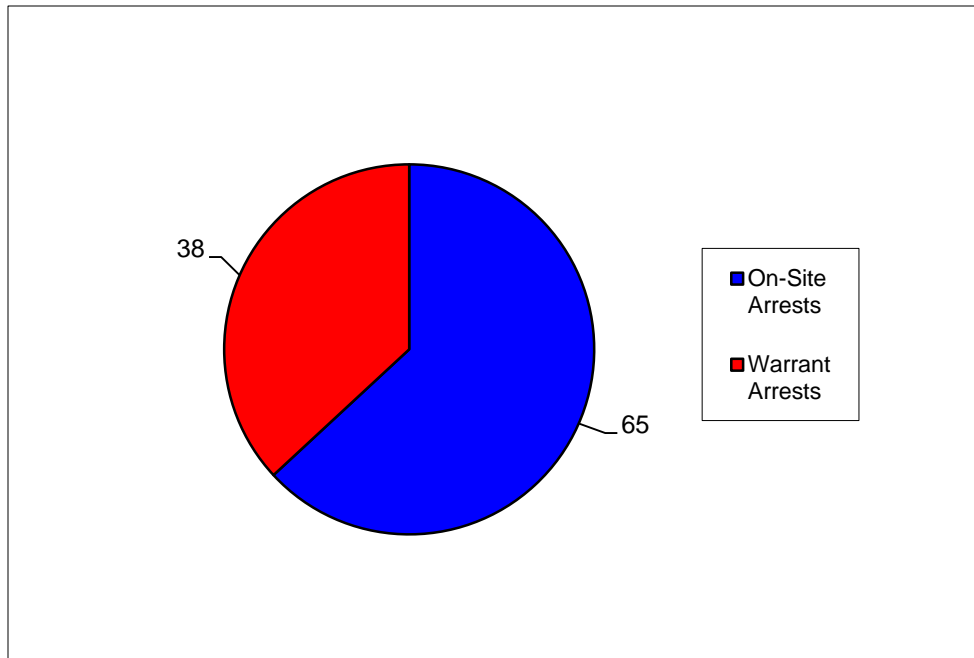
**Calls Requiring an Emergency Response by Agency
August**



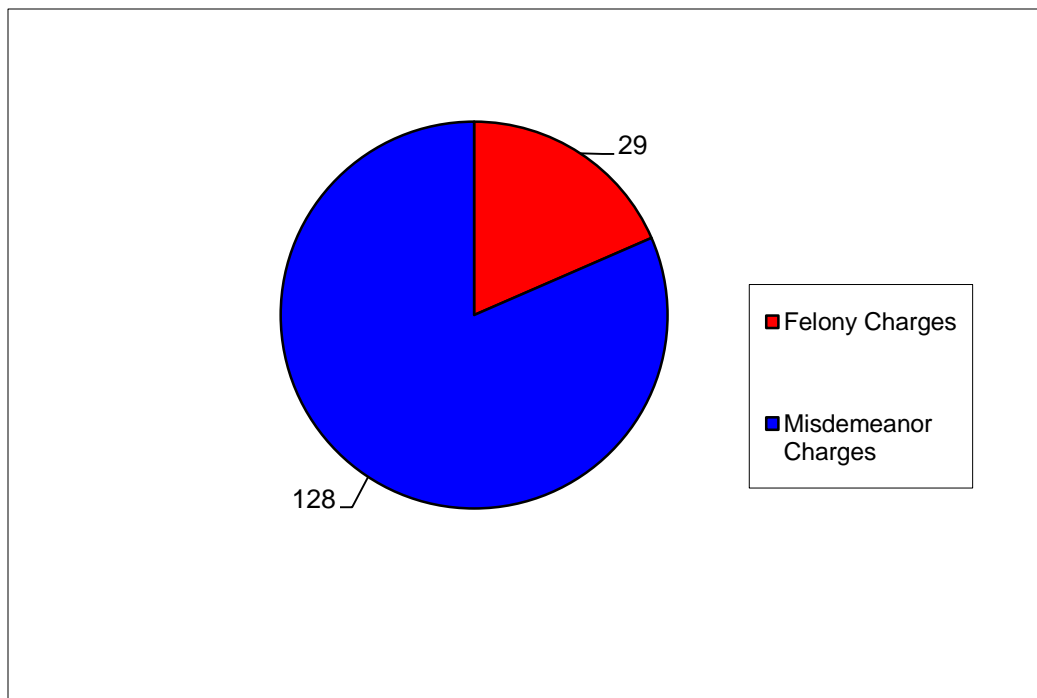
Incidents August 2016
