

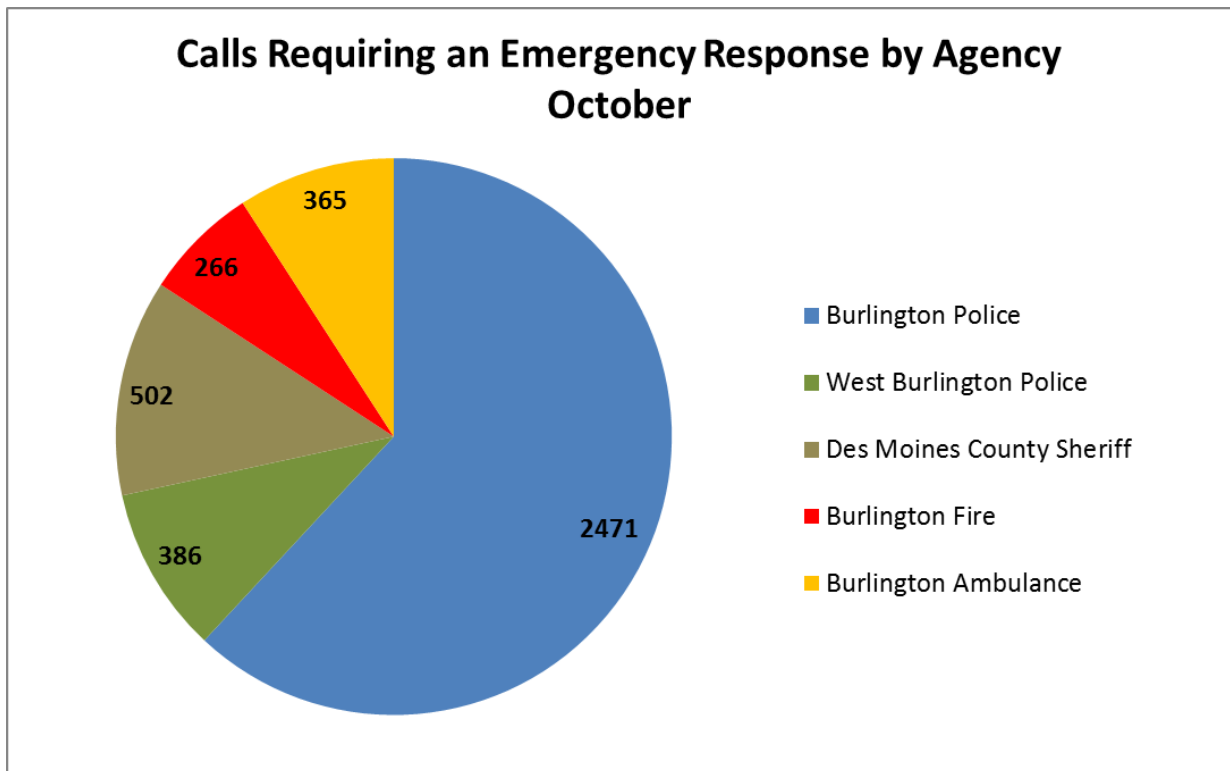

Re: Police Department Activities – October, 2016

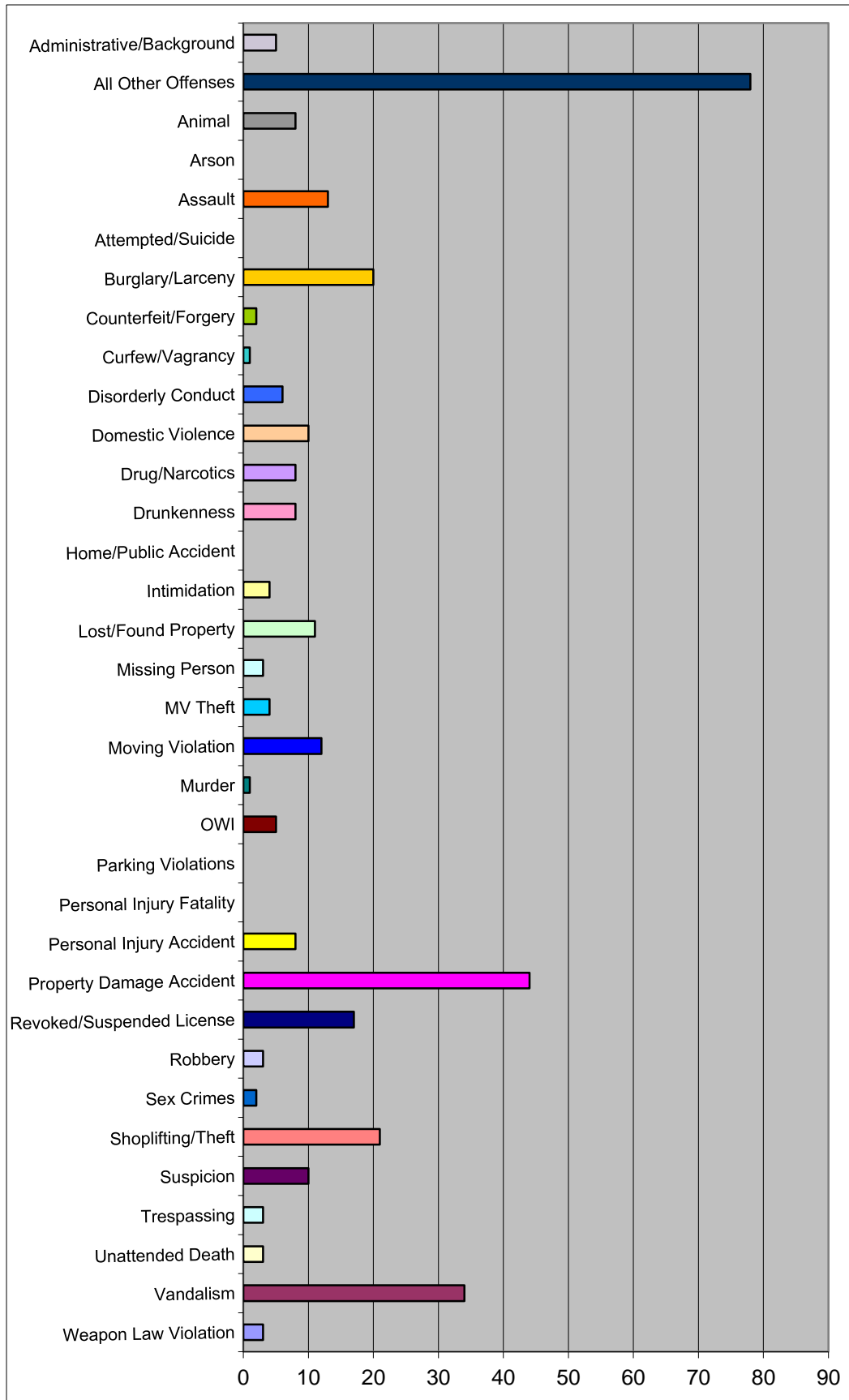


- The Chief attended all City Council Work Session and Meetings.

- Major Grimshaw attended the DesMoines County Living Well Committee meeting.

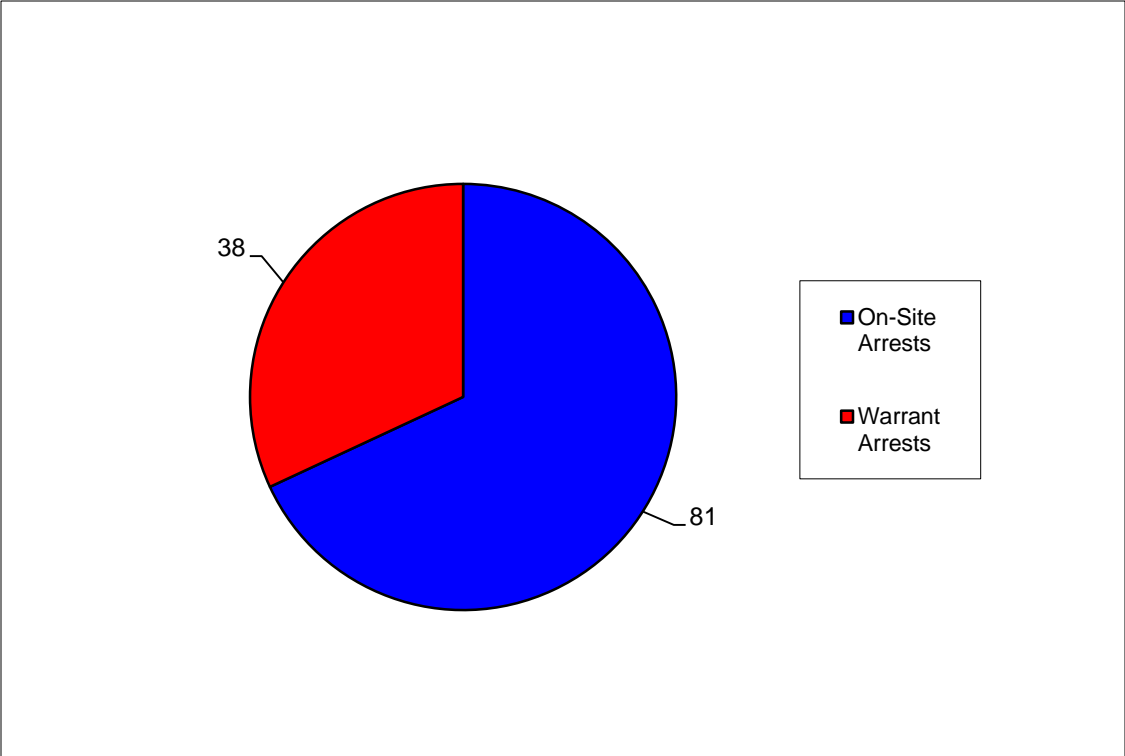
- Promotional exams were held for the ranks of Sergeant, Lieutenant and Major.

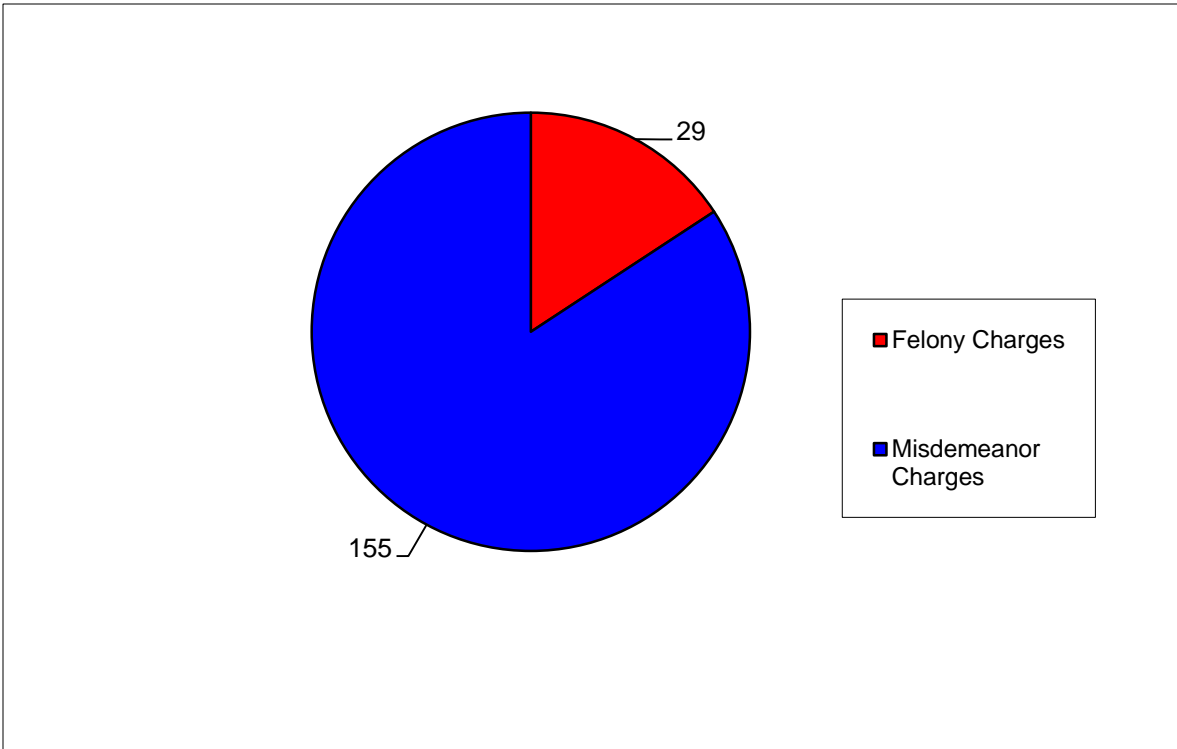
Incidents October 2016
