Nelson would be managing all 10 contracts for the 2017 Law Enforcement Center Project. Perry Hines stated that Carl A. Nelson would not be bidding on the 2017 Law Enforcement Center Project as they would be managing the project. He stated that the owner plans to refinance her home in the amount of \$58,715.00. He stated that the home is currently assessed at \$83,000.00. He stated that she still has \$3,628.00 remaining on the forgivable lien. He stated that in one year she will have met her requirements of the program and she would not owe any money should she move or sell her home. All present had opportunity to speak and nothing additional was filed in the office of the City Clerk.

4. Resolution Providing for a Salary Adjustment for the City Manager

DISCUSSION: The Director of Human Resources stated the salary adjustment for the City Manager was 2.25%, which was the same salary adjustment that both union and non-union employees were receiving on July 1, 2017. Council Member Scott stated that annually the City Council evaluates the City Manager. He stated that this year it was decided by Council to bypass the evaluation and give the City Manager a 2.25% increase, which was the same increase as both union and non-union employees. He further stated that the City Manager was doing a fine job. Freddie Starling of 517 South 7th Street stated that he had no objection to the City Manager receiving a salary increase, but he wanted to make sure all City employees were receiving a salary increase. He stated his concern for those who are struggling to pay when everything keeps going higher in cost. Mike Elmore of 620 Iowa Street stated that the City Manager makes plenty of money already. He stated that it was not that he did not feel the City Manager didn't deserve an increase, but he felt there was a limit on what people should make in salary. Mayor McCampbell stated that he understood as he is not receiving a raise either, but he stated that this was the rate that City Managers make. He stated that the world we live in everything is constantly going up in price. Council Member Scott stated that he was hoping to keep the City Manager for another year. Council Member Davidson stated that he would be voting no as a matter of principle as he had nothing against the City Manager. All present had opportunity to speak and nothing additional was filed in the office of the City Clerk.

COMMENTS FROM AUDIENCE: Mike Crowner stated that he noticed there were four tables at Dankwardt Park pool without umbrellas. Mayor McCampbell and the Council applauded Mike Crowner and Pepsi Refreshments for the four new umbrellas for the pool. Steve Roland of 2838 South Main Street asked when Cascade Bridge would be replaced and that he hoped the public would be involved in the design. Council Member Fleming stated that he hoped it would be replaced, but there presently was no plan for replacement. All present had opportunity to speak and nothing additional was filed in the office of the City Clerk.
