



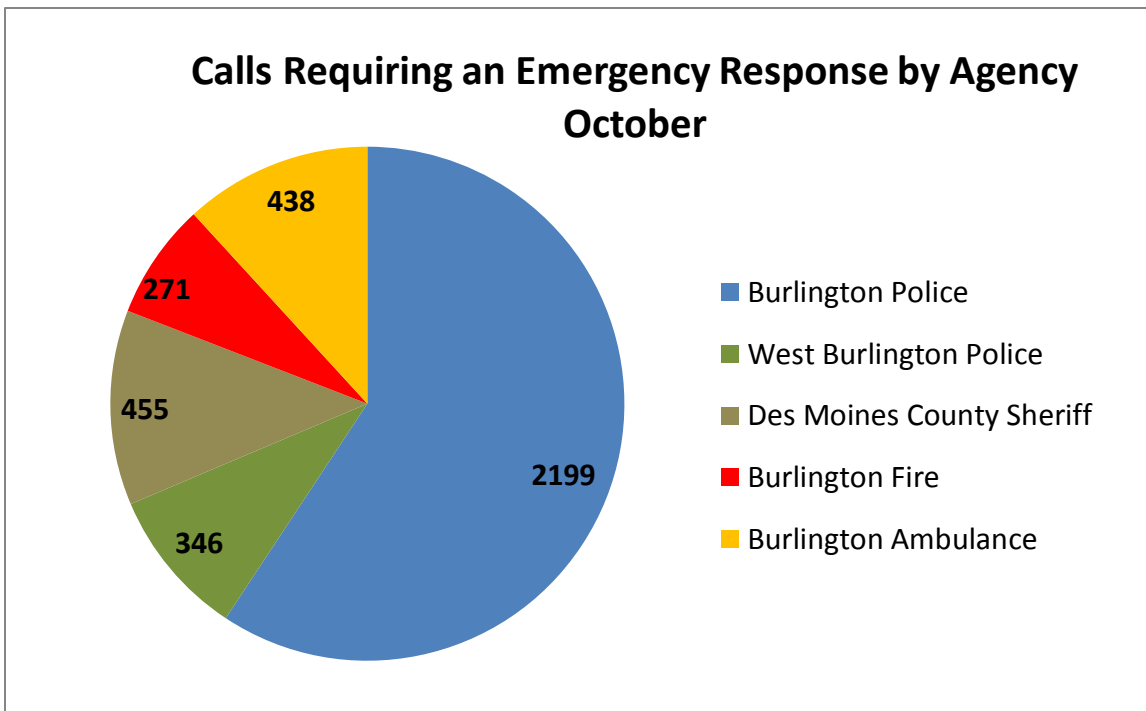

Re: Police Department Activities – October, 2017

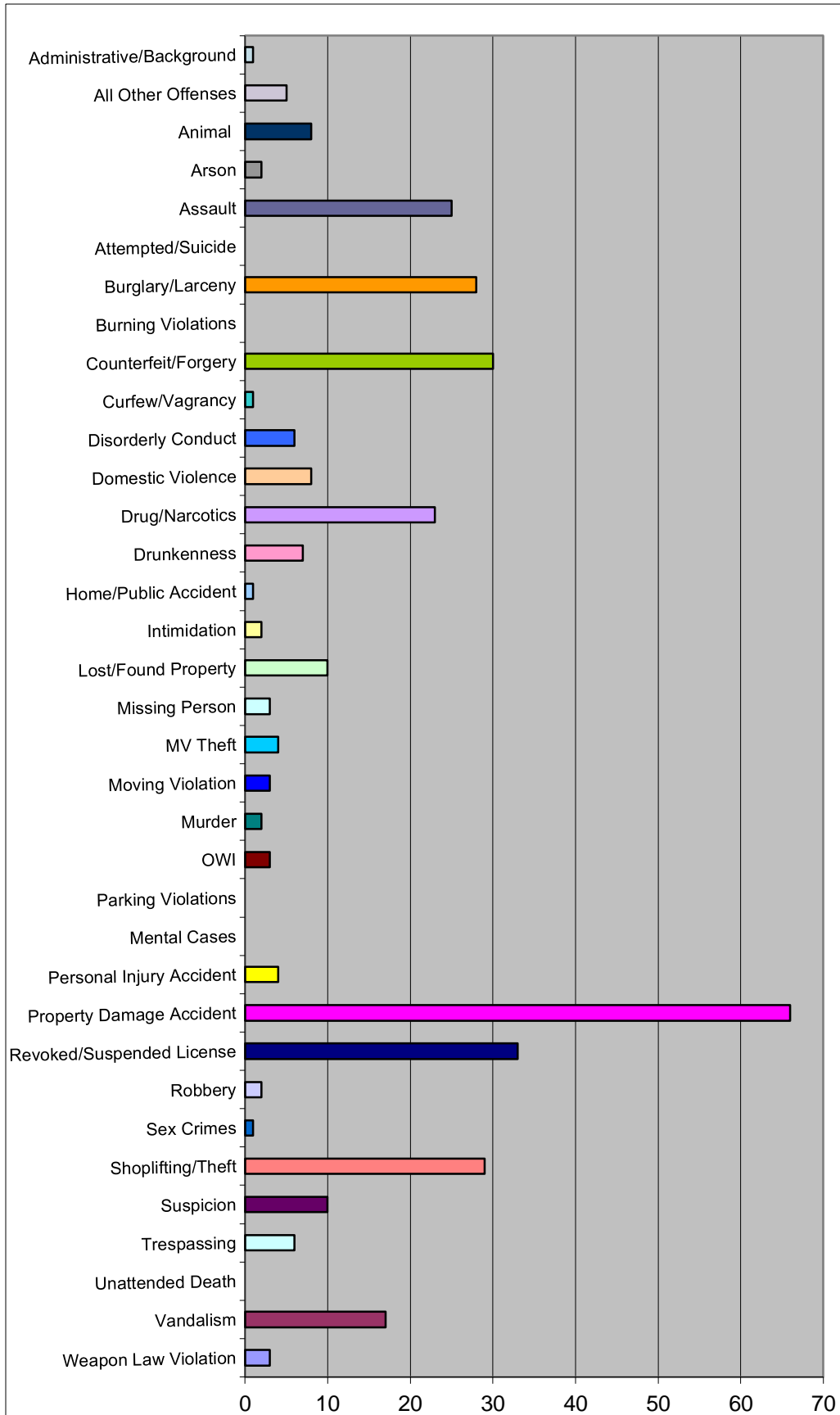
- The Chief attended all City Council Work Session and Meetings.

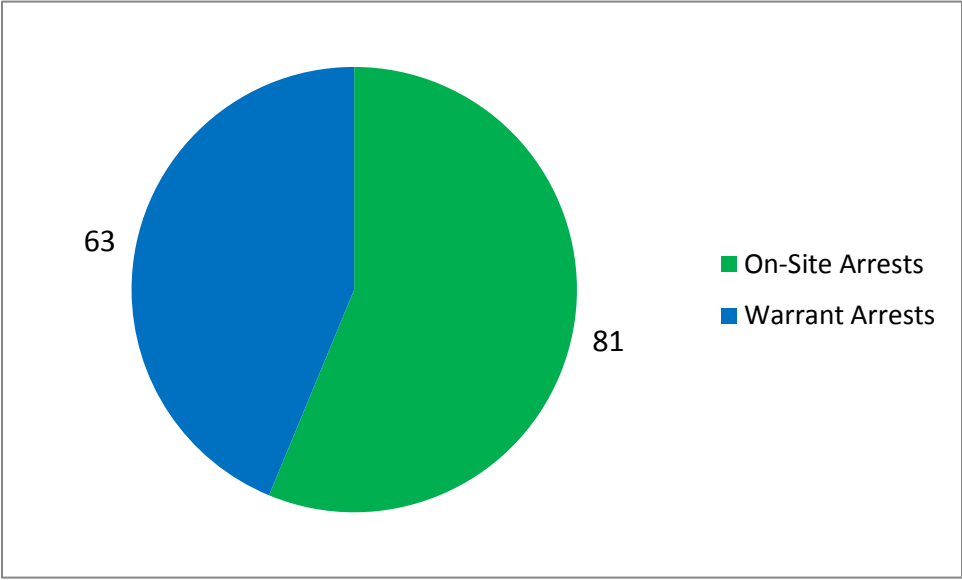

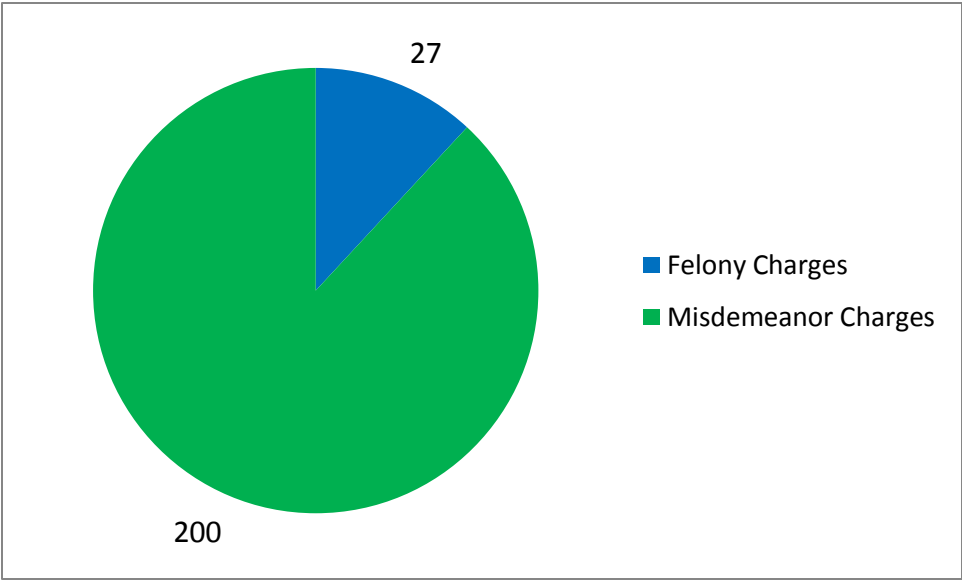
Incidents October 2017
