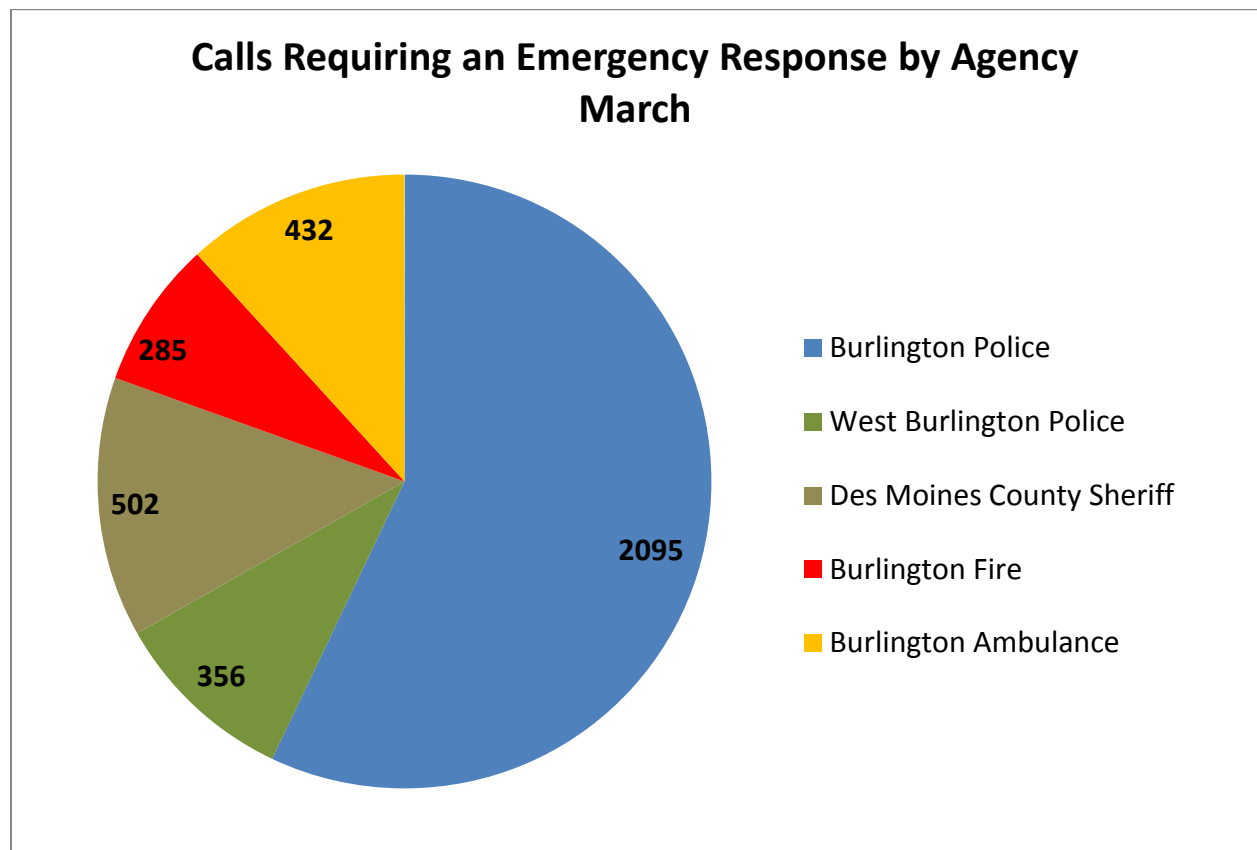

Re: Police Department Activities – March 2018

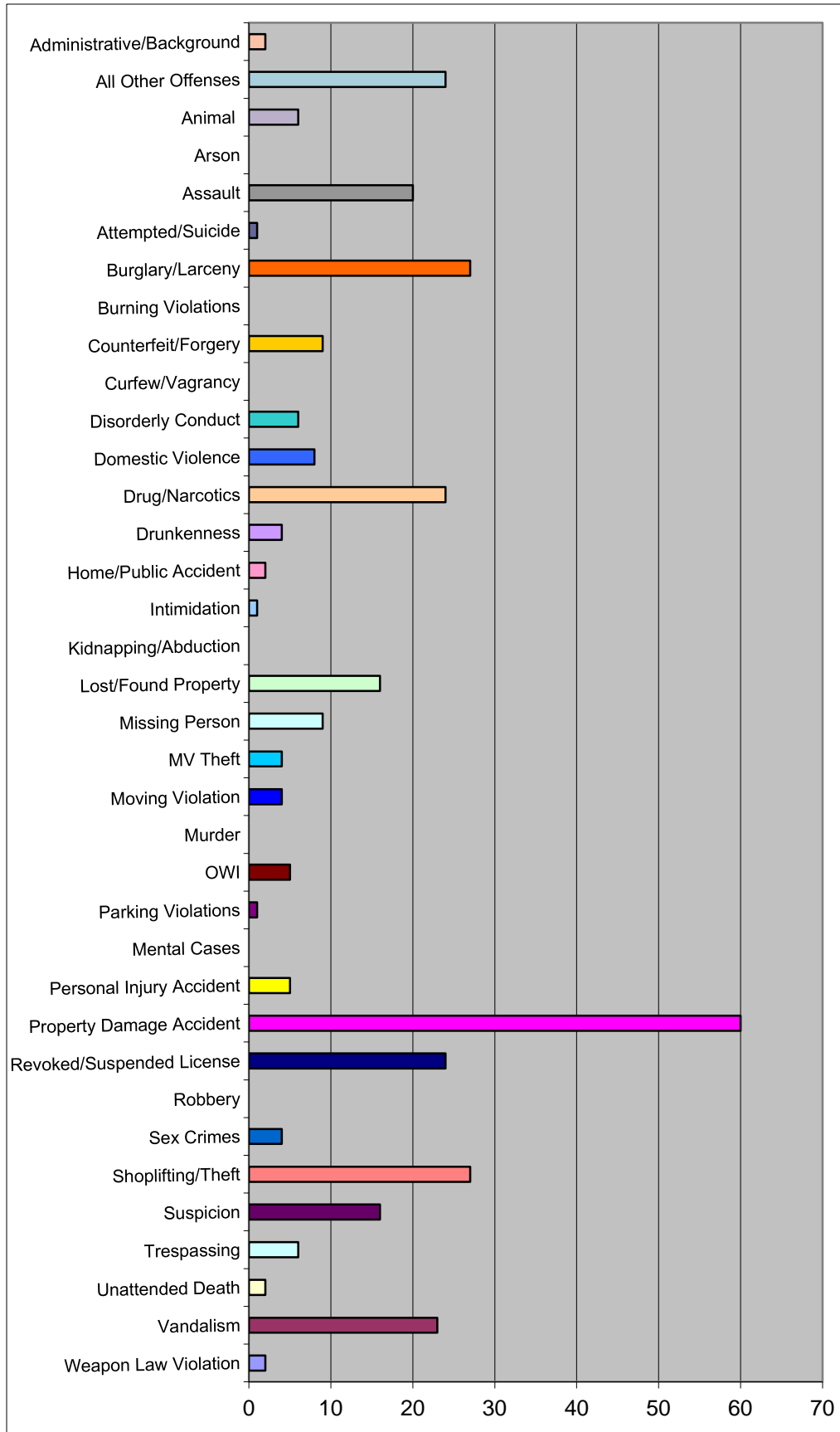
- Chief Beaird attended all City Council Work Session and Meetings.

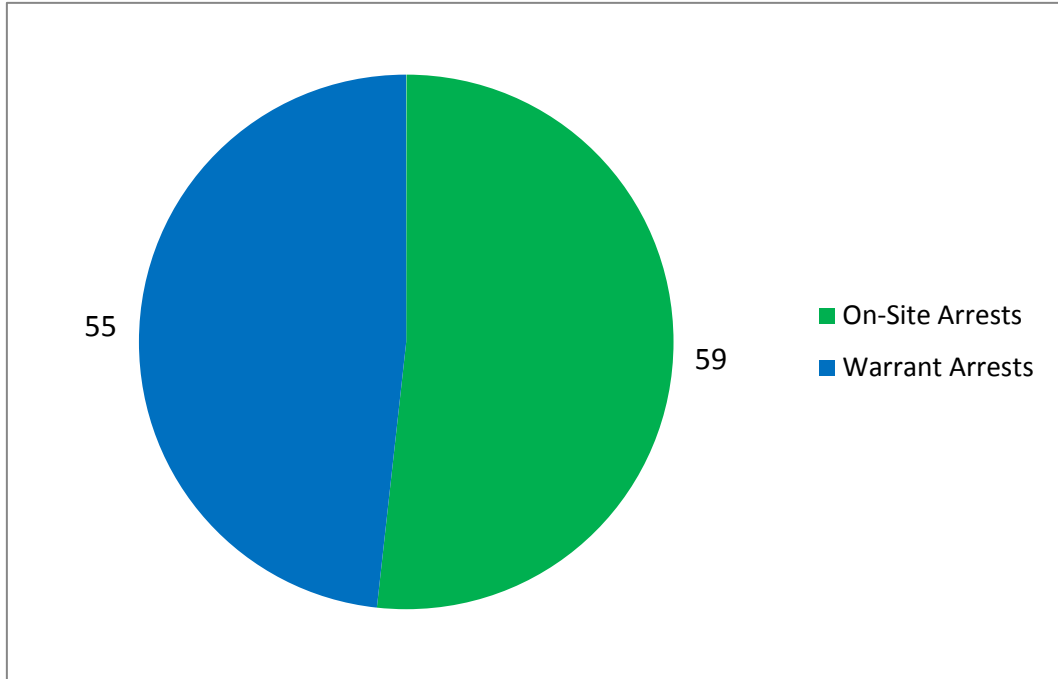

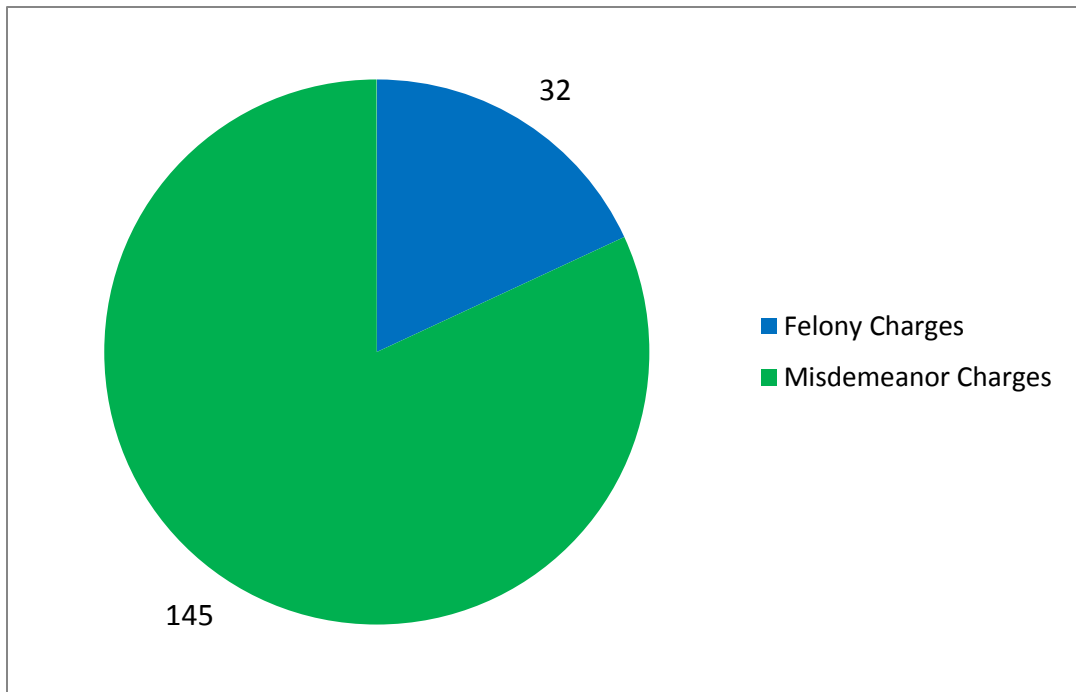
# Incidents March 2018
