

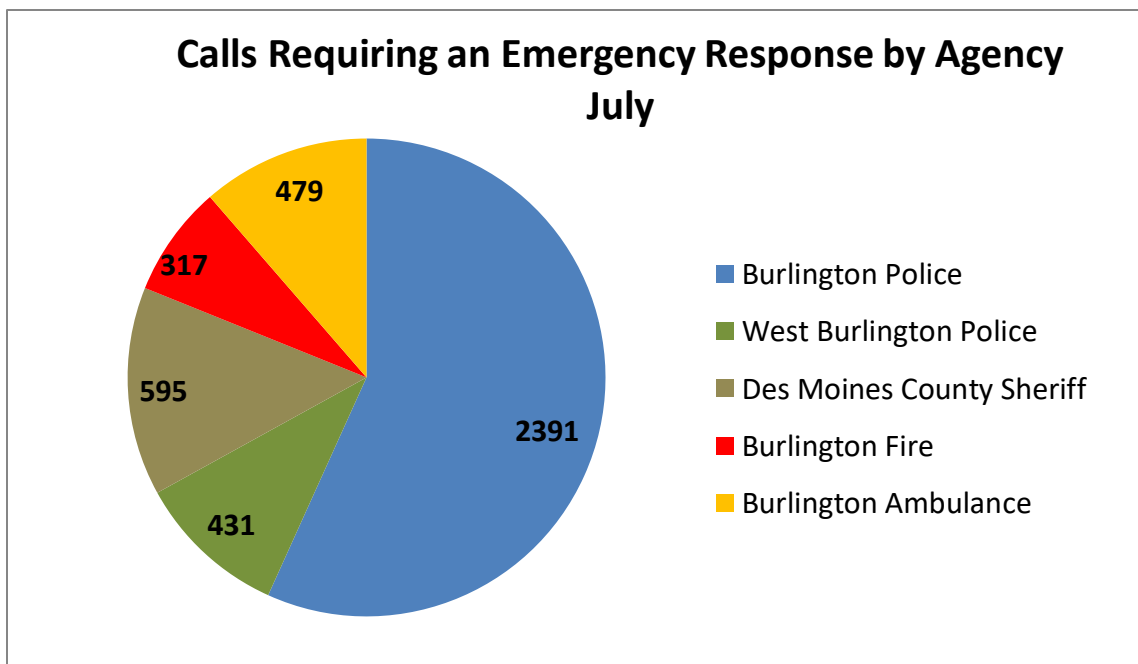

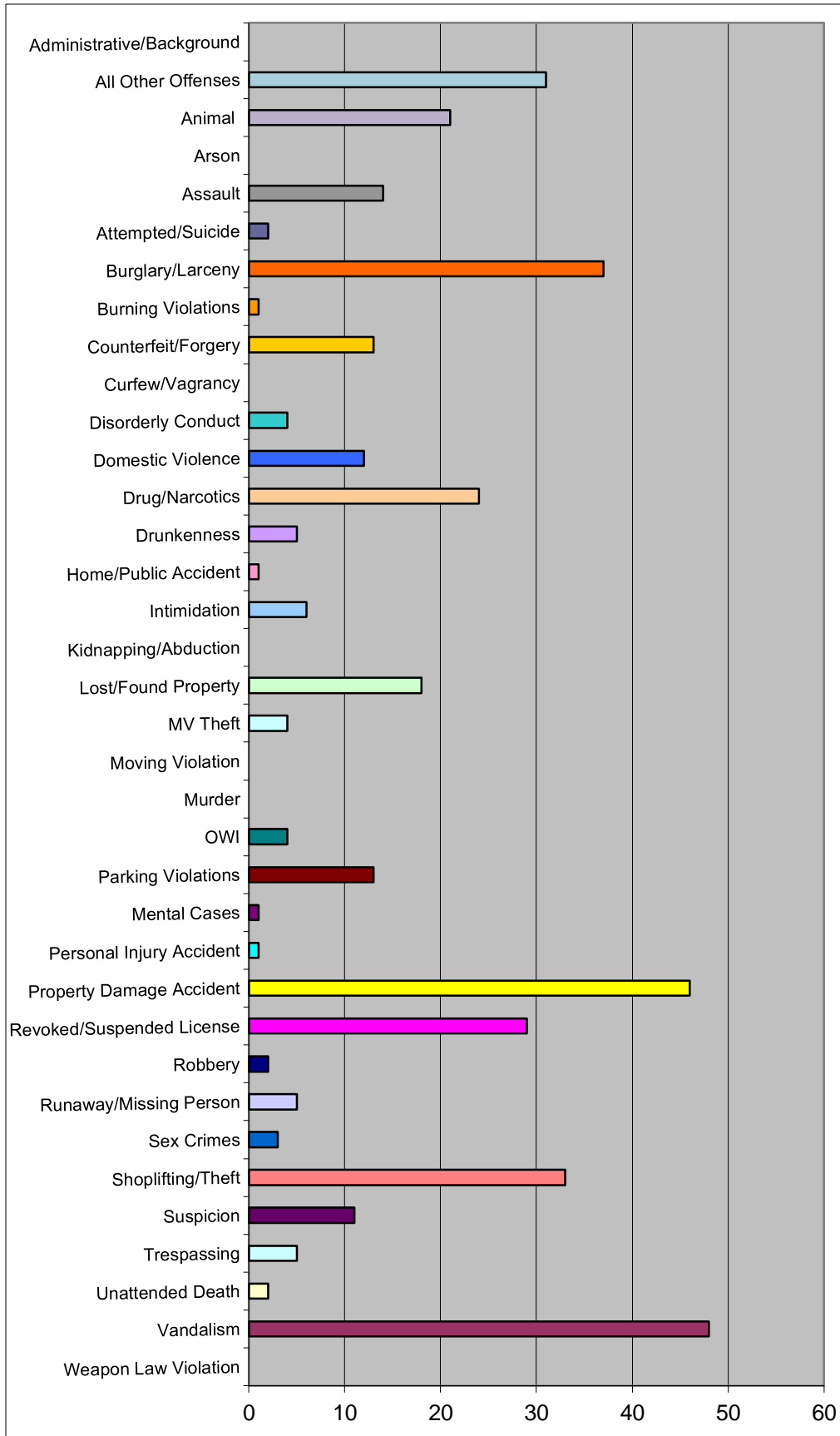

- Police Administration participated in meetings with construction/contractors as well as continued to monitor and assess the various needs and issues yet to be addressed in the new facility.
- Tours of the new facility were given during two public open houses and one open house for retired law enforcement and their families. Estimates of well over 500 people toured the new facility during these three opportunities.
- The Chief attended the Young House Board meeting.

- Major Grimshaw attended the City IT meeting as well as the Crisis Intervention Team meeting in Mt. Pleasant.

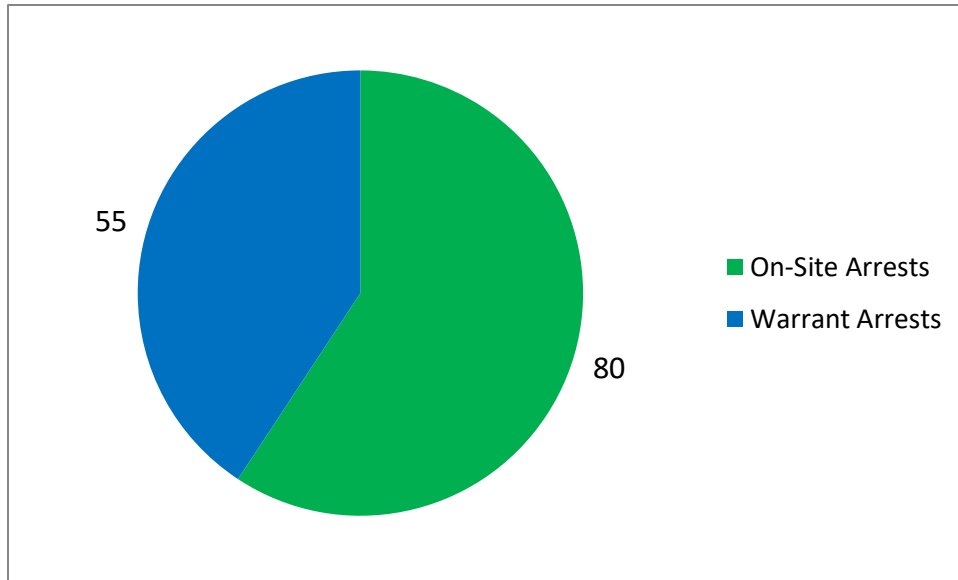
- Major Grimshaw met with the BPD Honor Guard in regard to duties and upcoming opportunities.

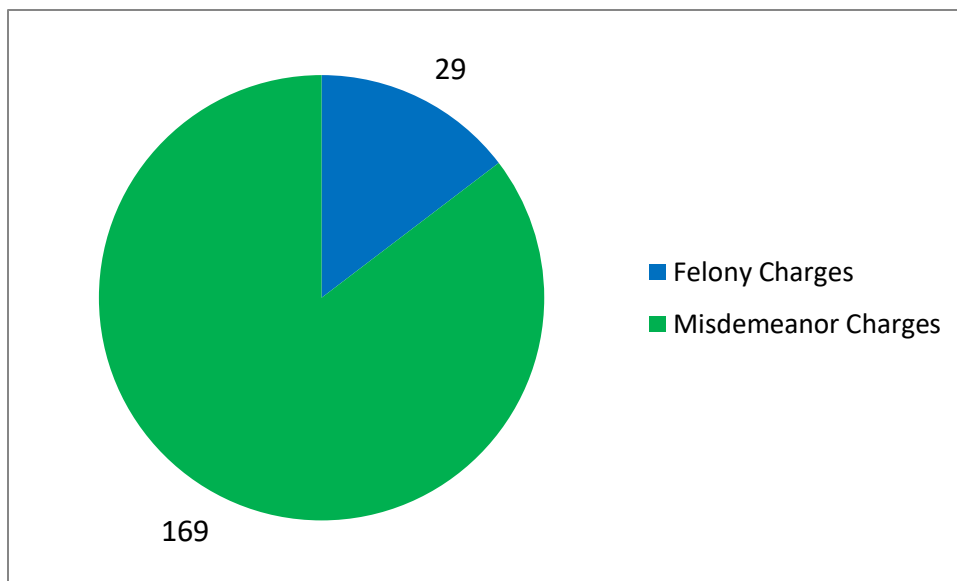
# Incidents July 2018
