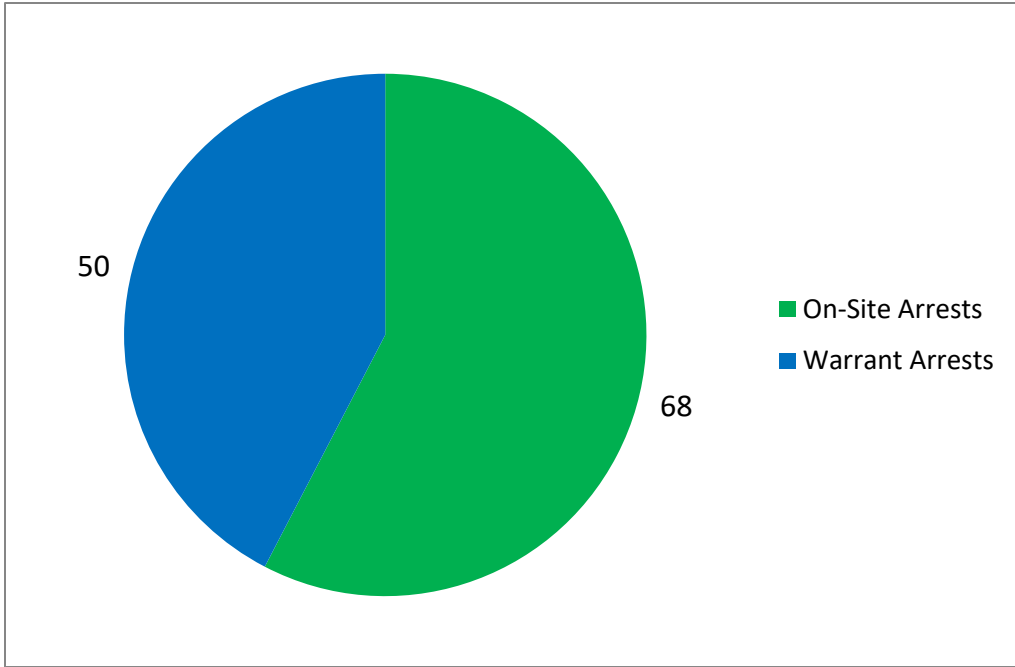

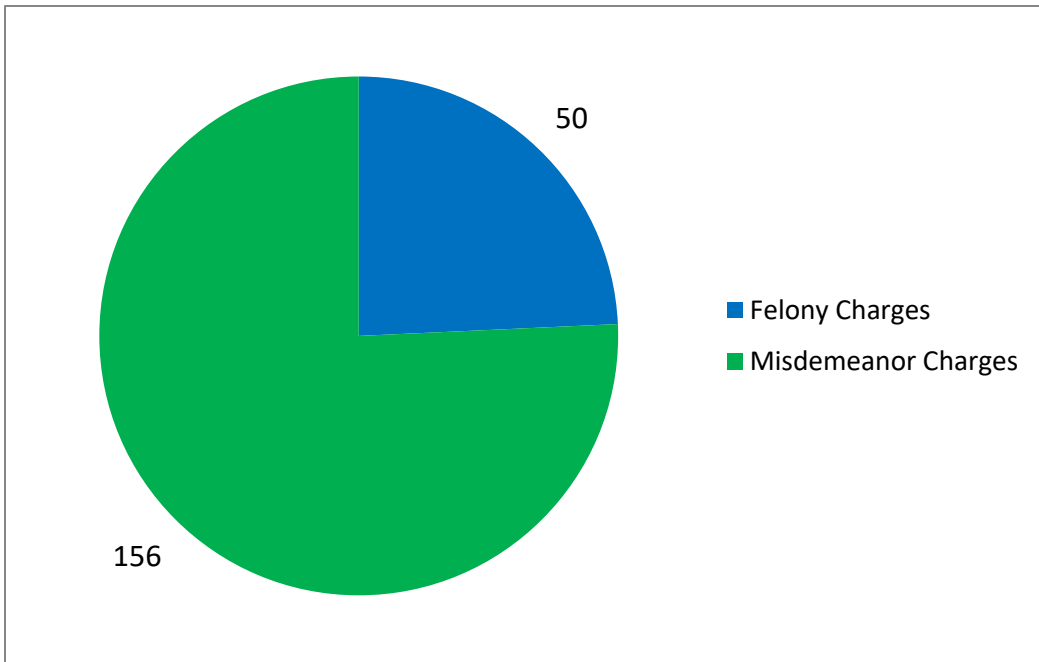
Incidents March 2019
