

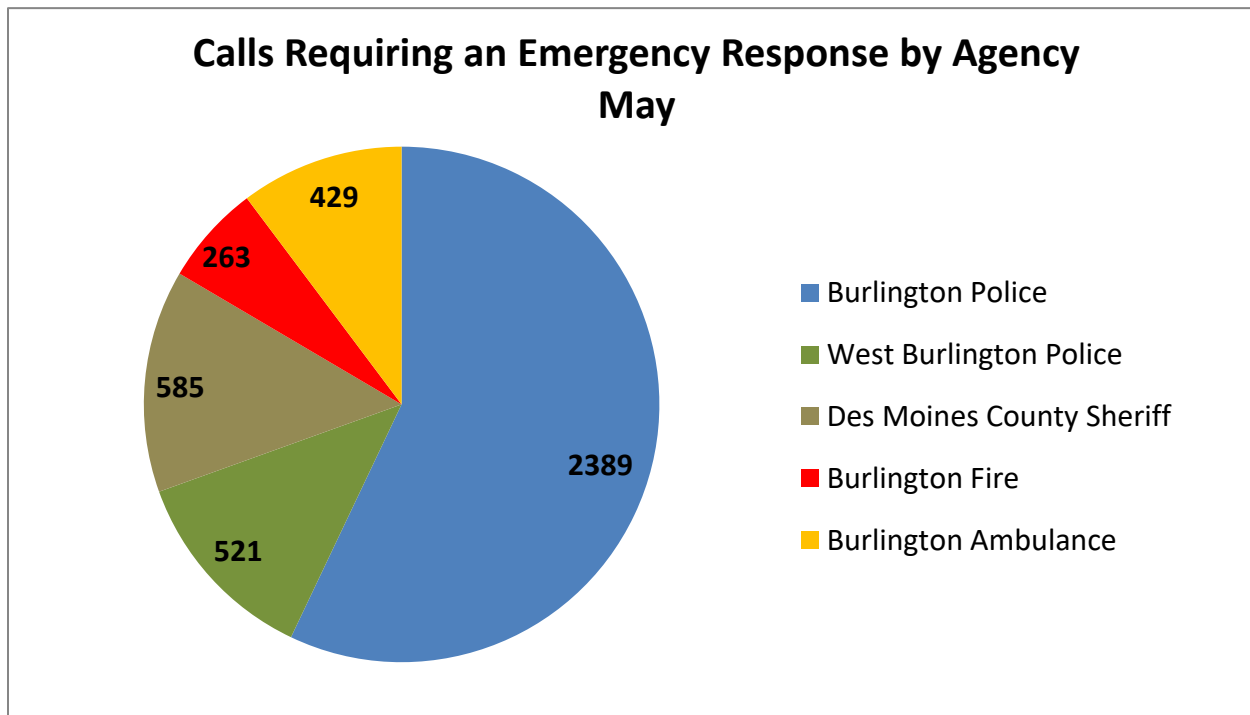

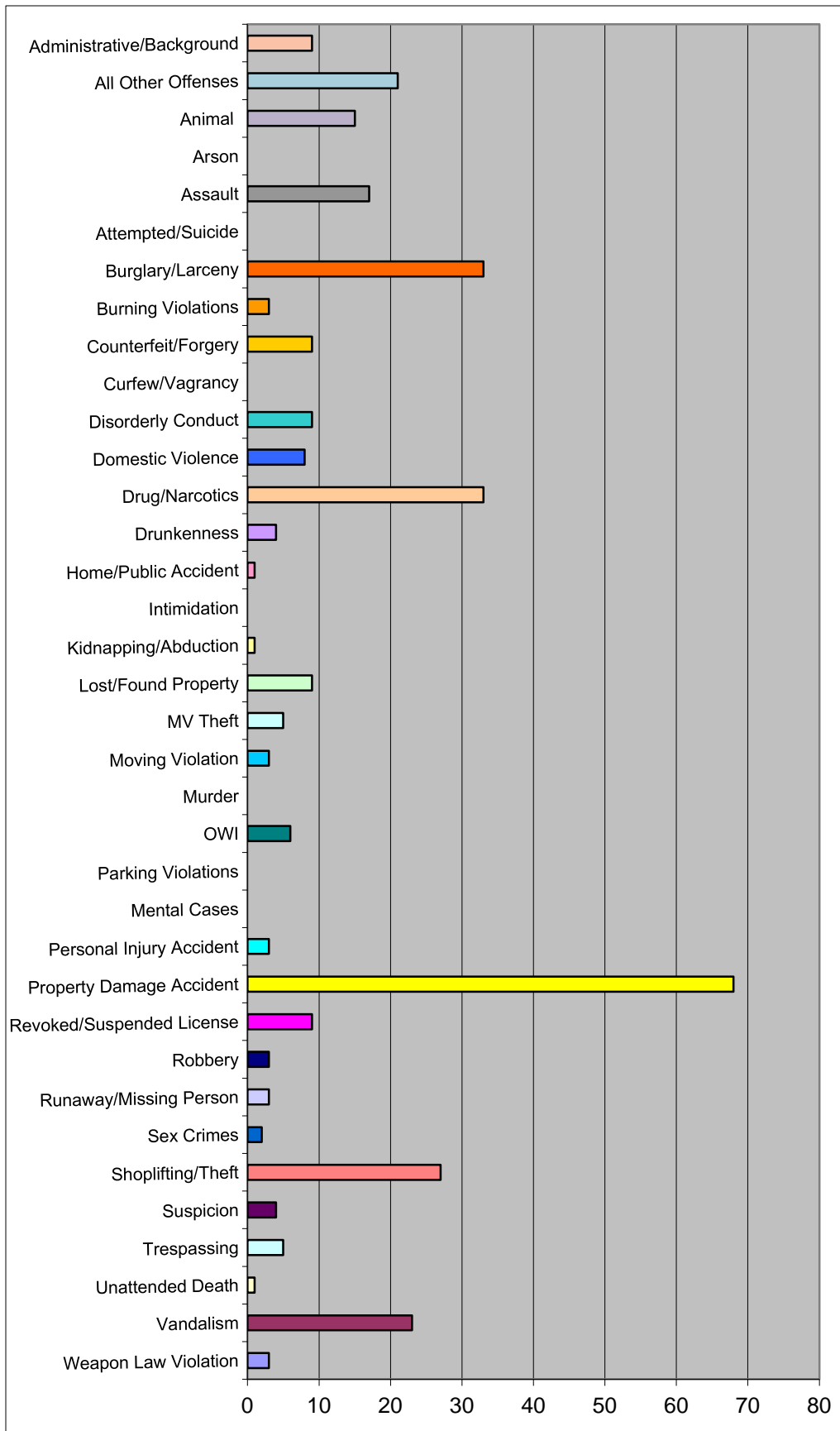

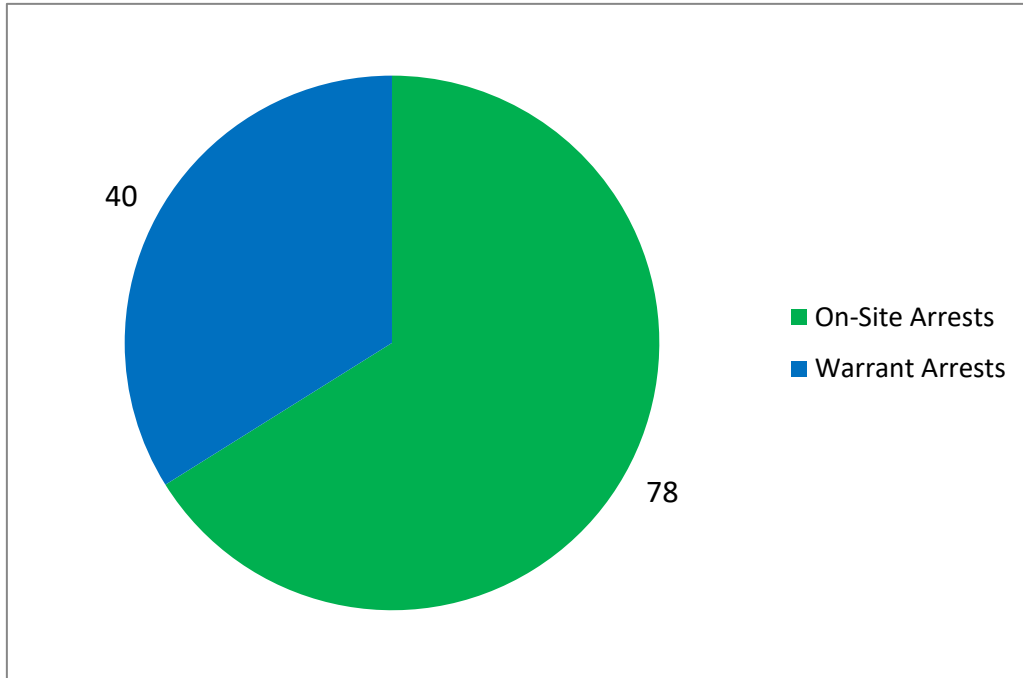
- Several RAGBRAI organizational meetings whereby he is Law Enforcement Chair of the riders overnight stay in Burlington

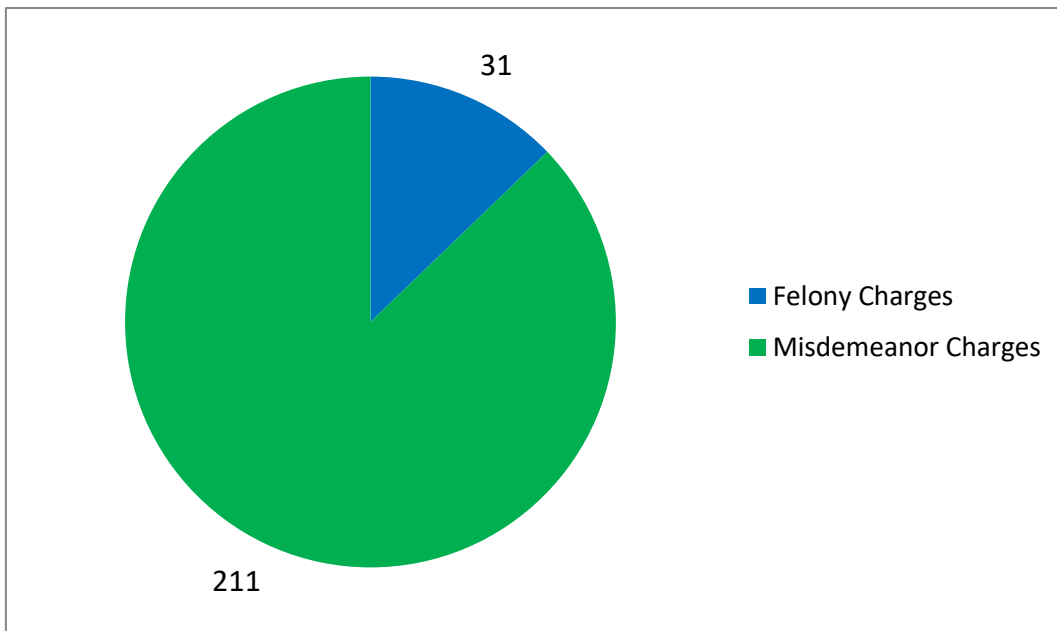
# Incidents May 2019
