

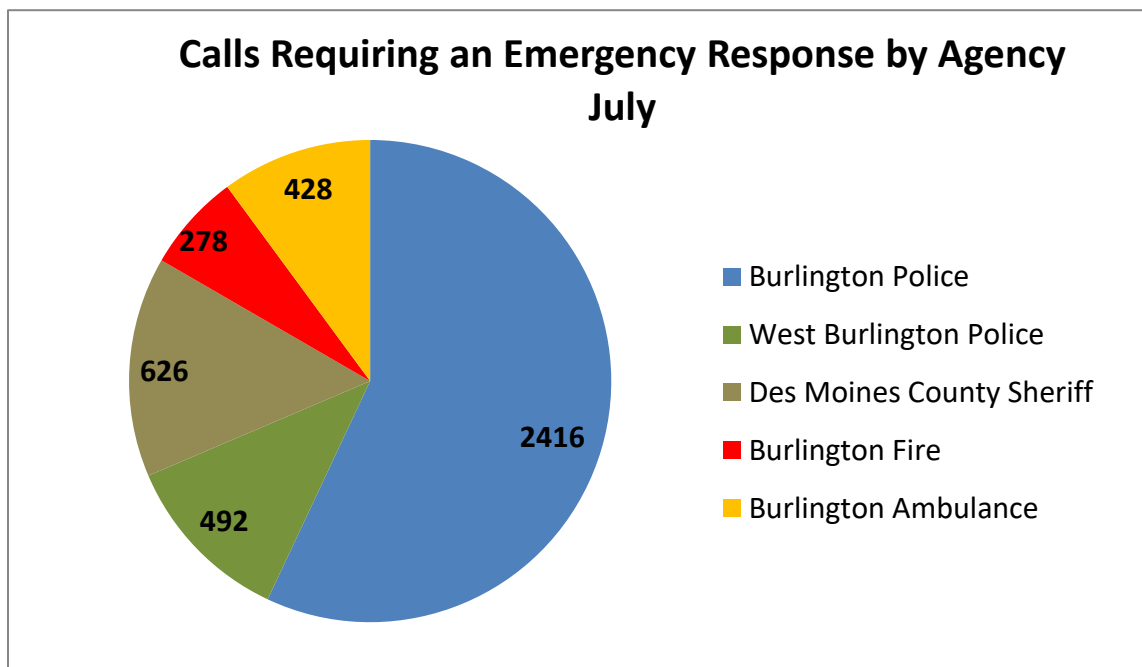

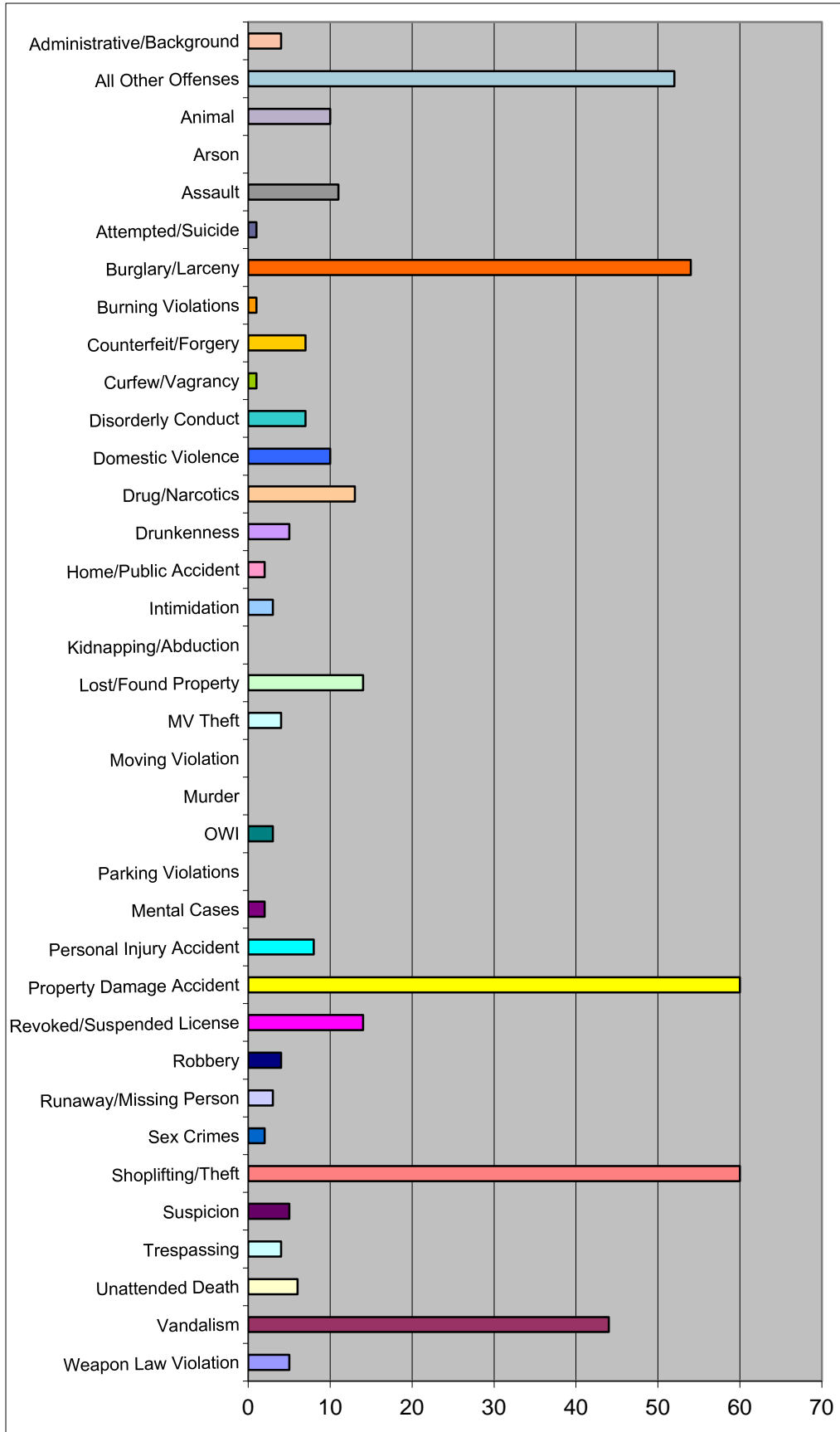

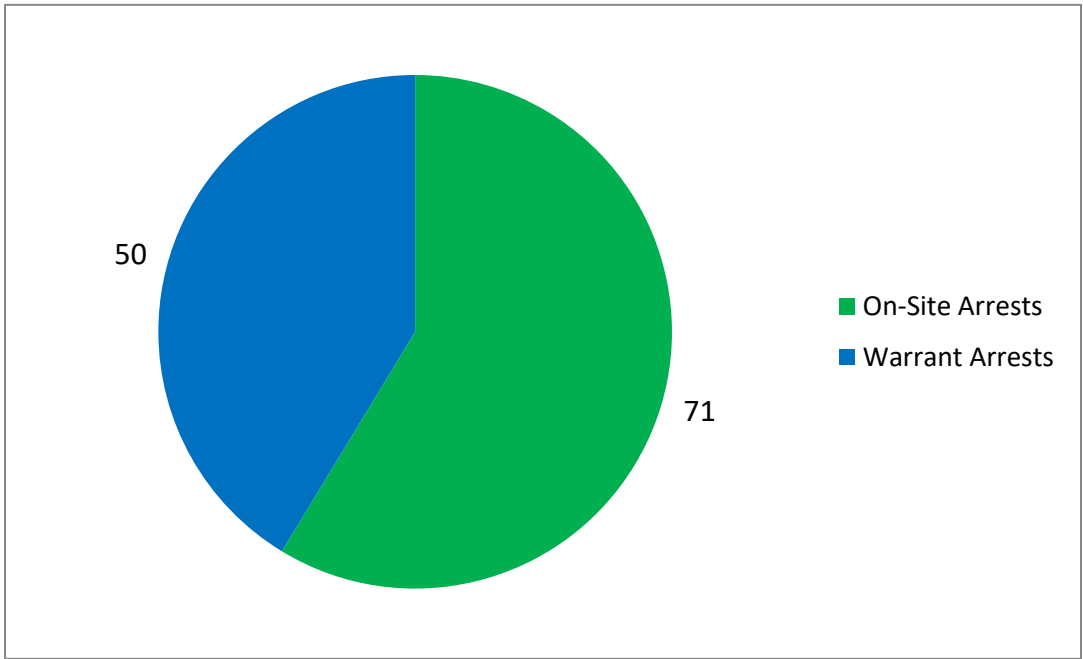
- Downtown Parking meeting

- The Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) of the Burlington Police Department had 7 contacts/calls where their skills were utilized in dealing with a mental subject in June.
