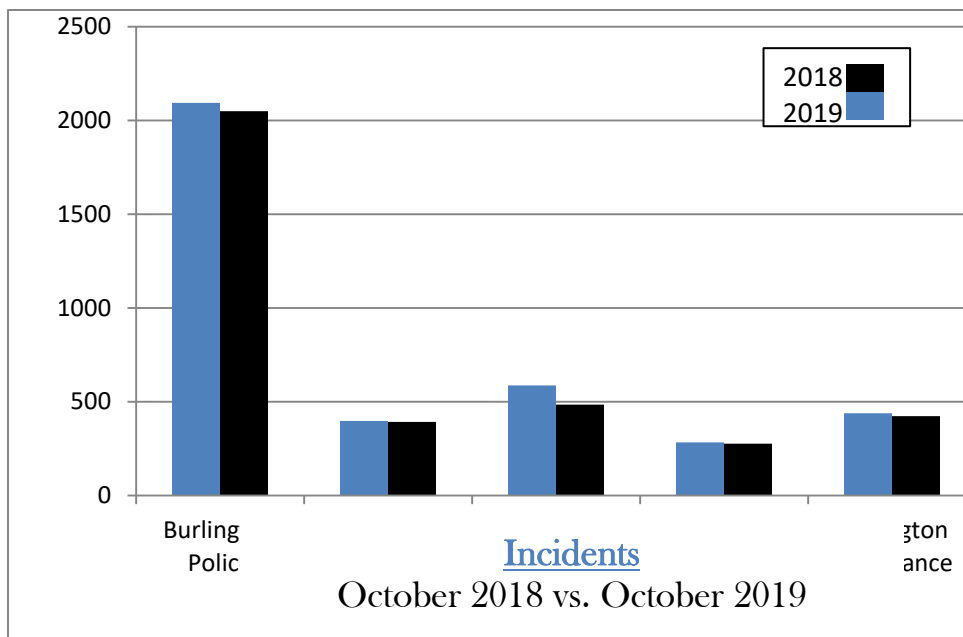

Re: Police Department Activities – October 2019

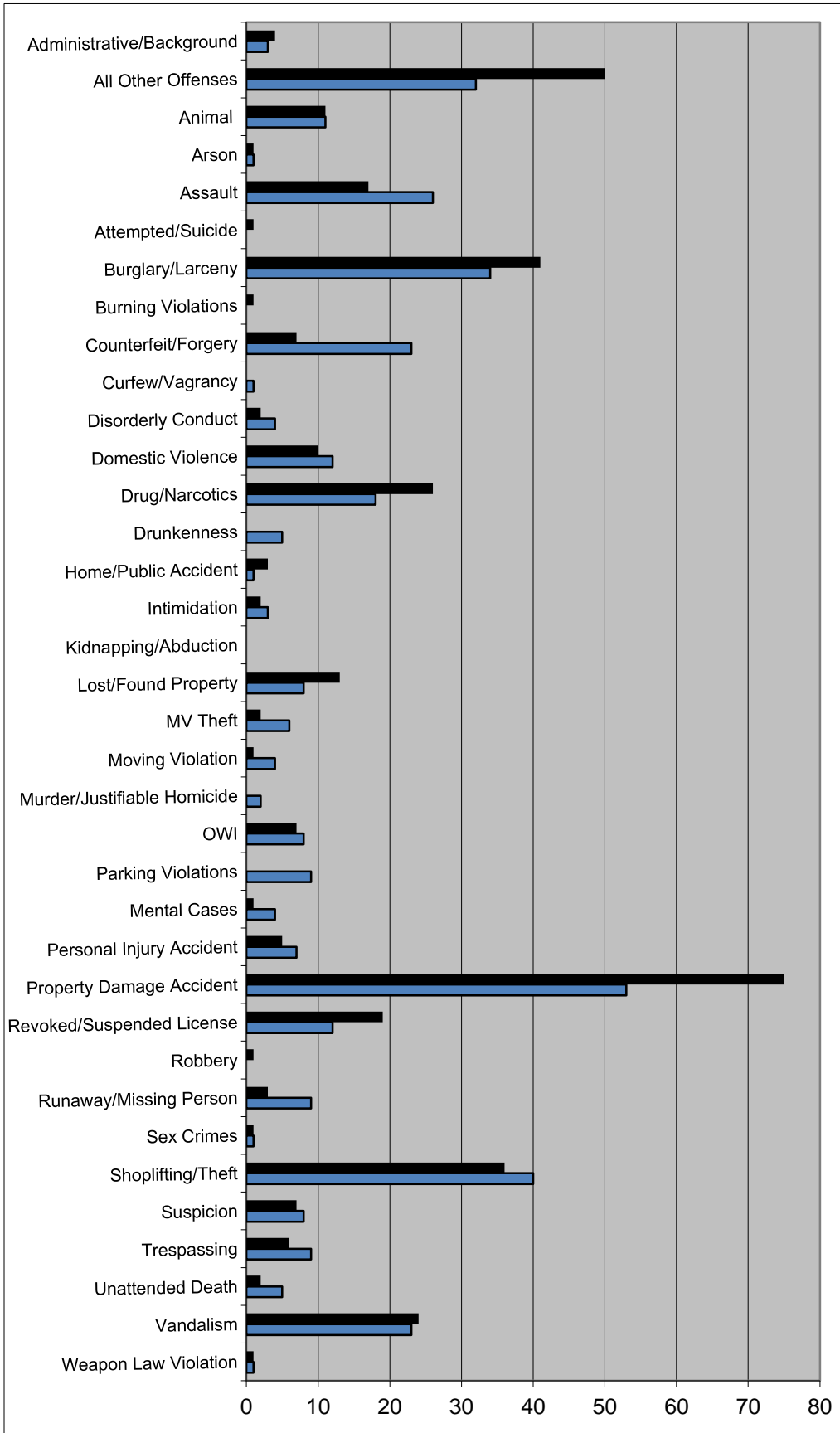
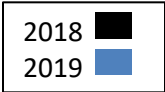
- Chief Kramer or Major Grimshaw attended all City Council Work Session and Meetings.

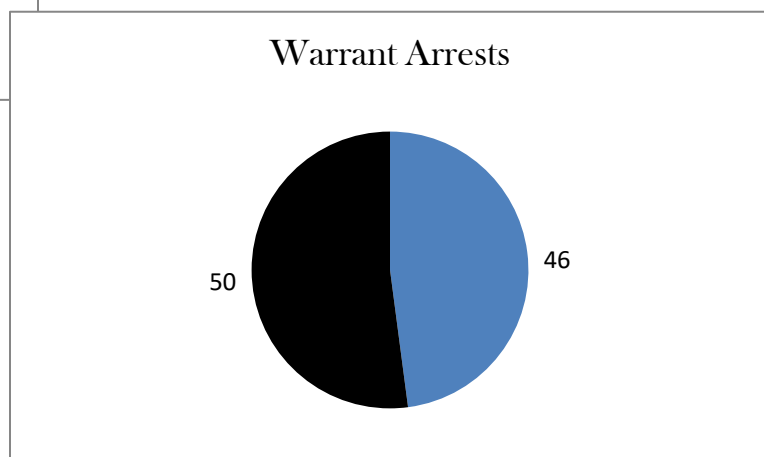
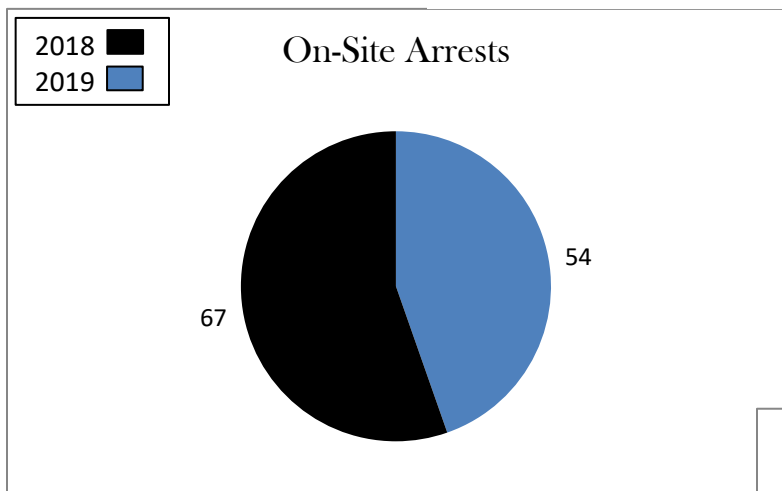

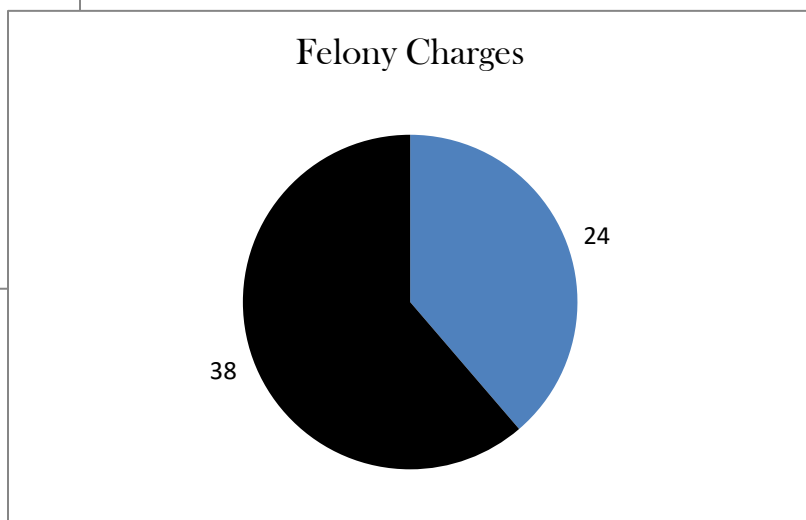
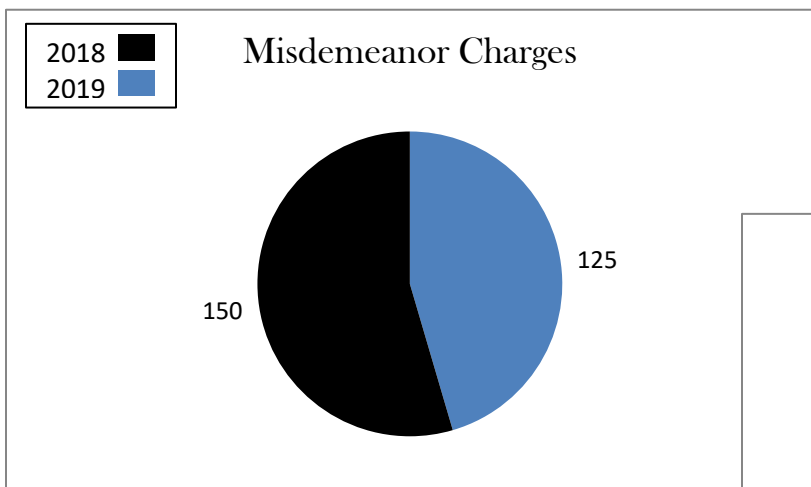
Arrest Types
