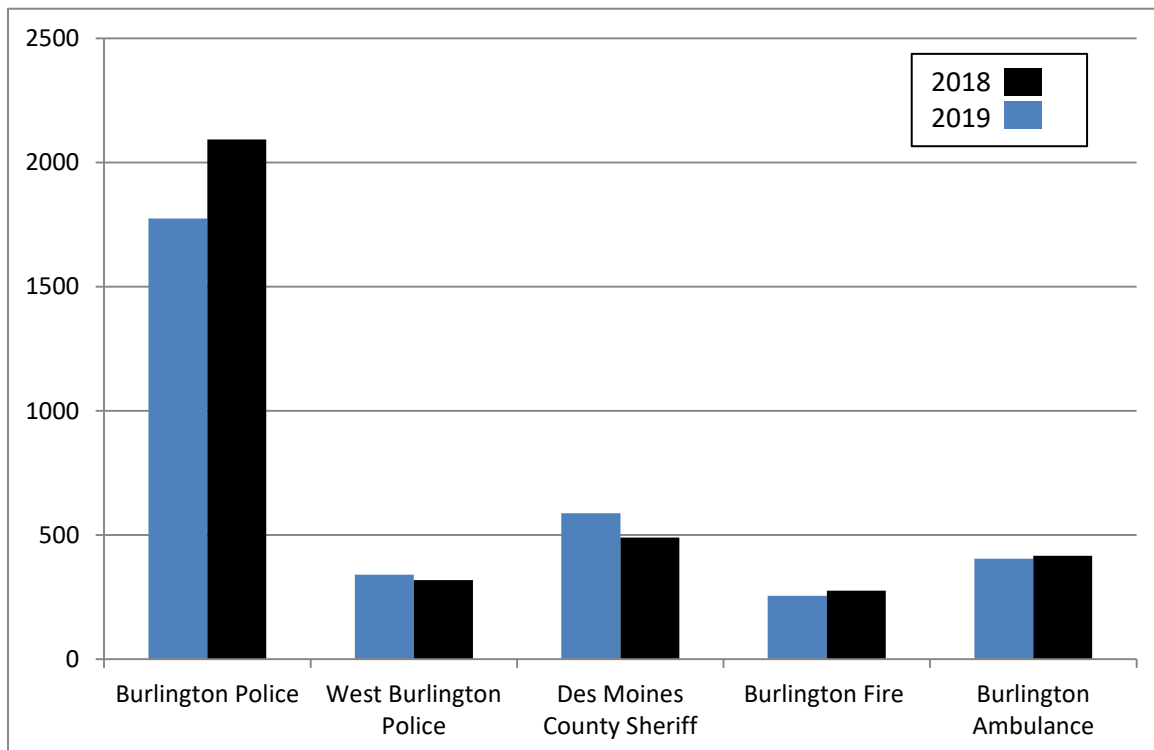

- On November 19th a multi-jurisdiction search and seizure operation took place involving more than 100 law enforcement officers from area agencies, DCI, DNE, FBI in partnership with the Iowa Attorney General’s office. Months of planning went into this operation and included pre-incident briefings, a press conference, numerous search warrants and eight arrests. Police administration, patrol, POP Unit and Southeast Iowa Narcotics Task Force investigators were all involved in this operation.
- The Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) of the Burlington Police Department had 4 contacts/calls where their skills were utilized in dealing with a mental subject in November. Also during the month of November, there were 84 hours dedicated to education/training of officers and there were 7 presentations given to a total of 240 people. The number of animals received during the month of October was 74 and there were 76 during the month of November. 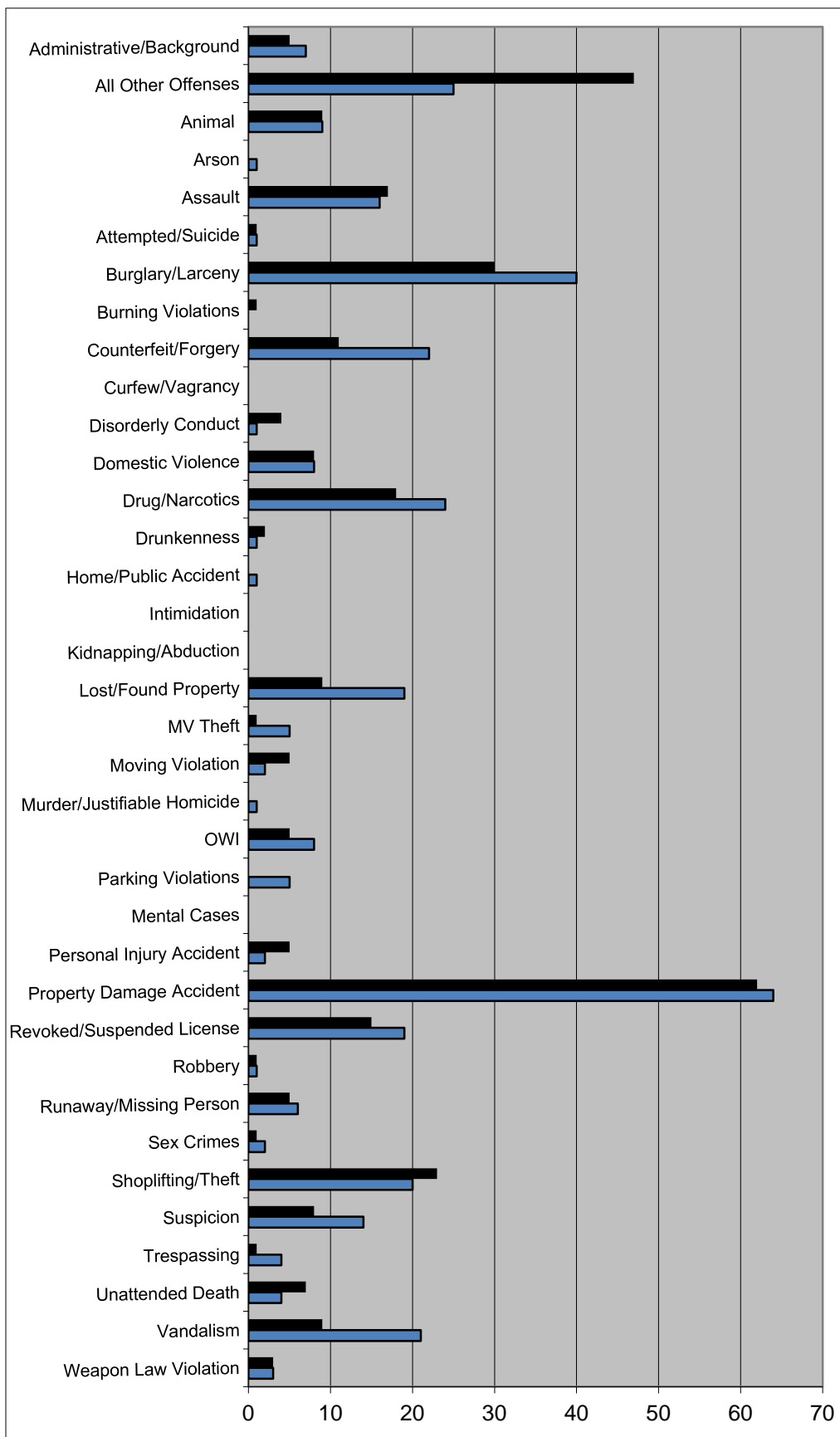

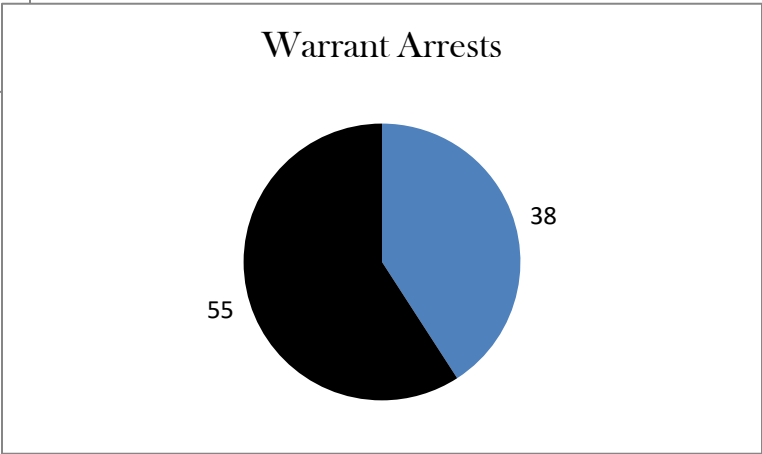
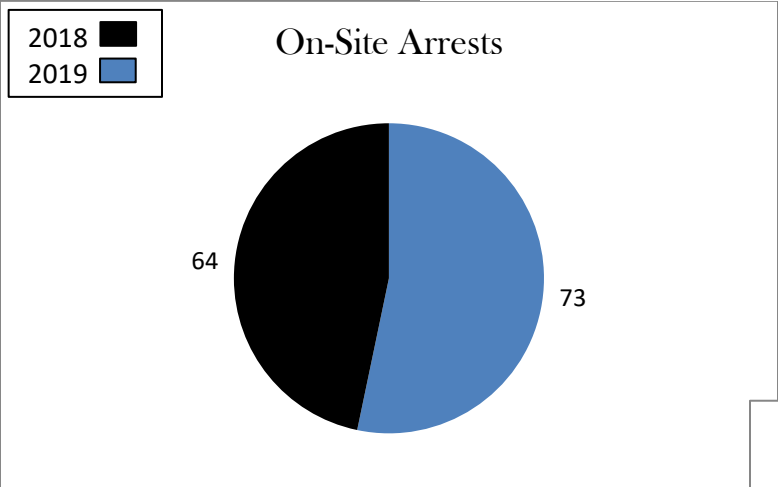
Incidents

November 2018 vs. November 2019



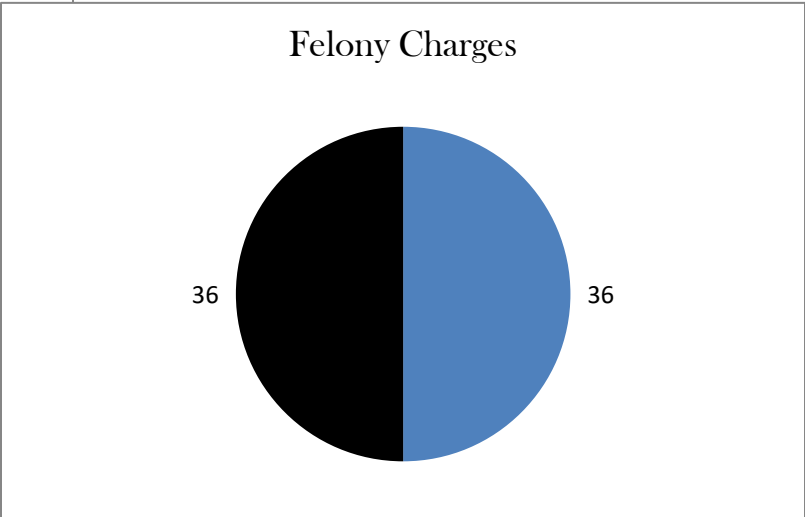
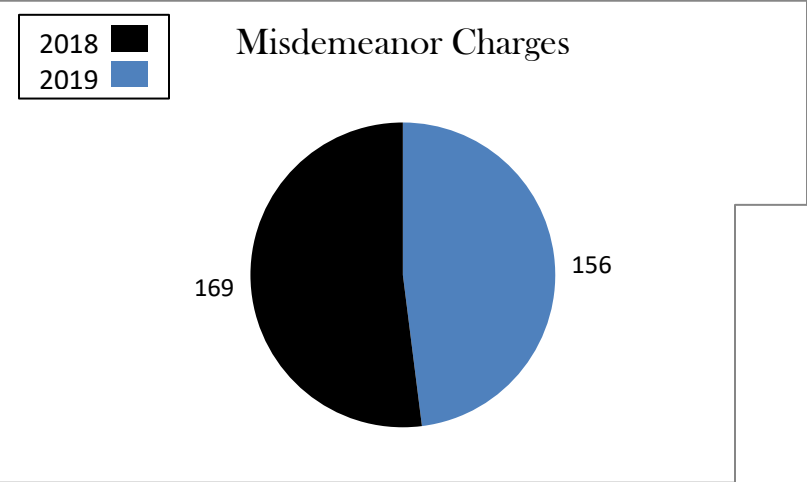
Arrest Types
