



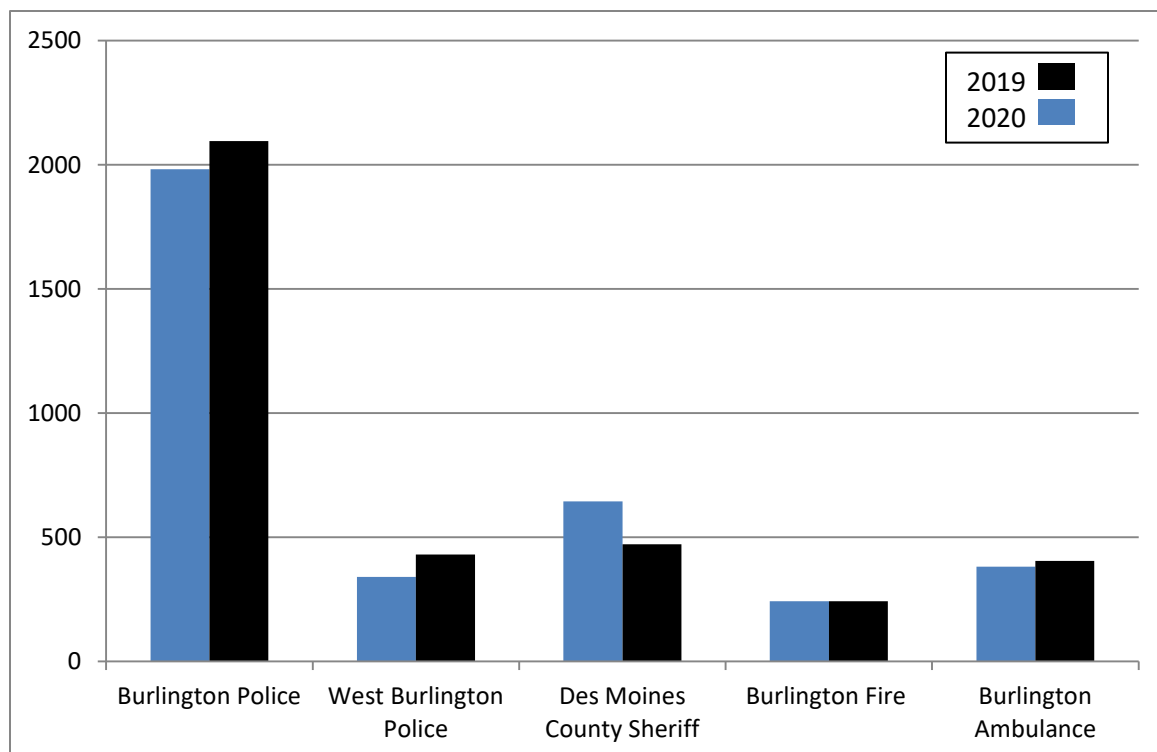

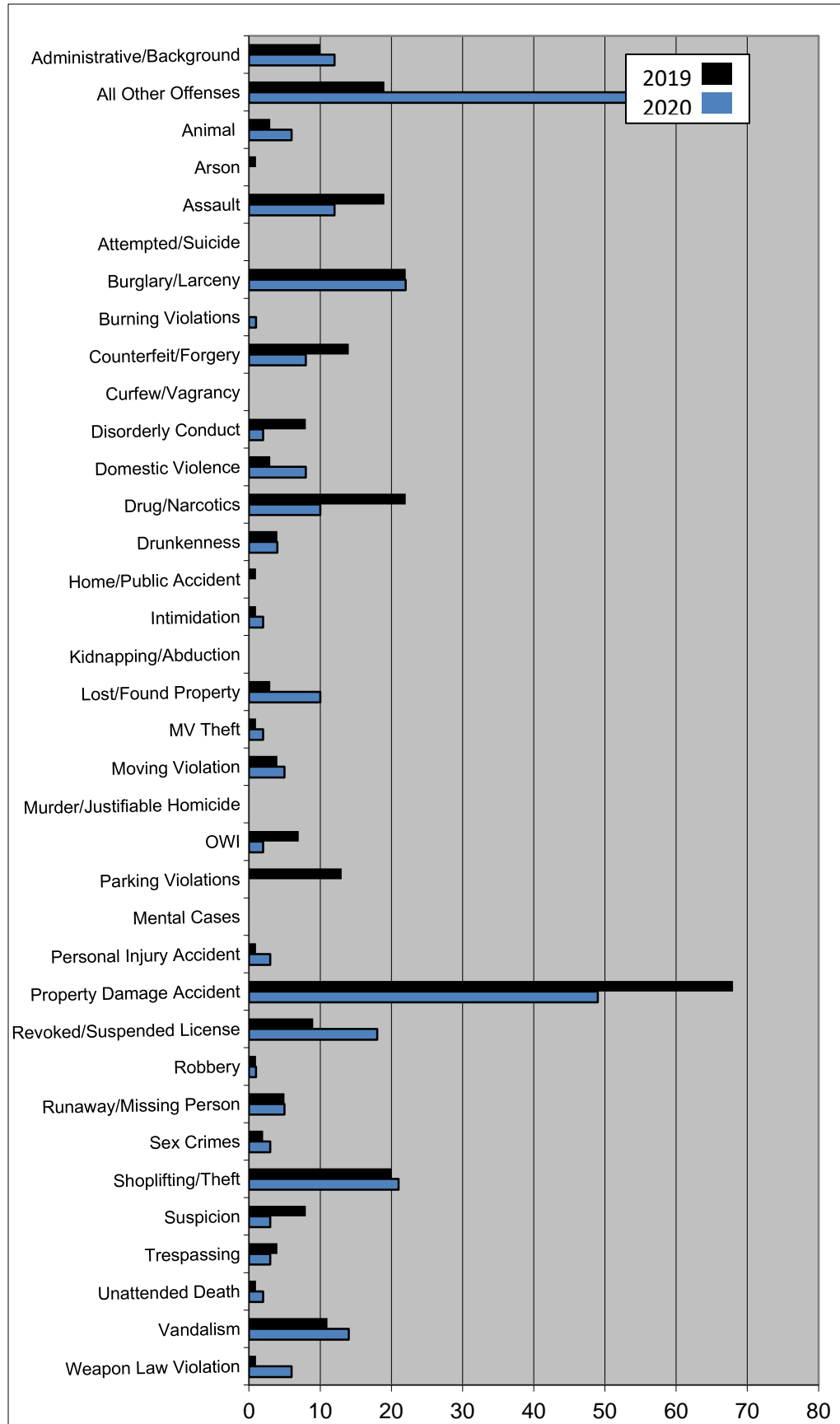
- Annual in-service training for all sworn police officers at BPD

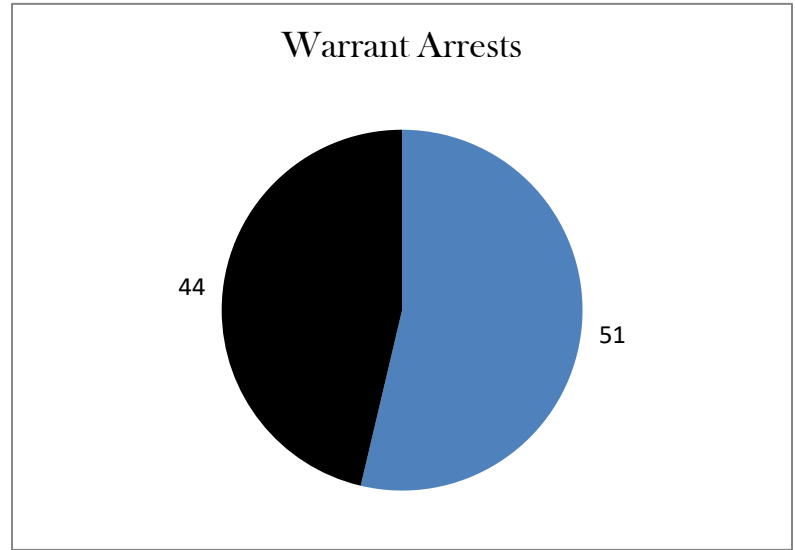
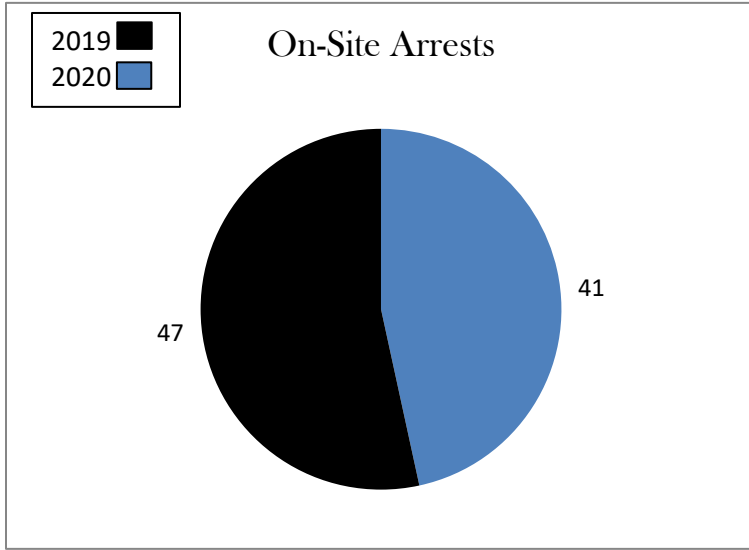
Incidents

February 2019 vs. February 2020



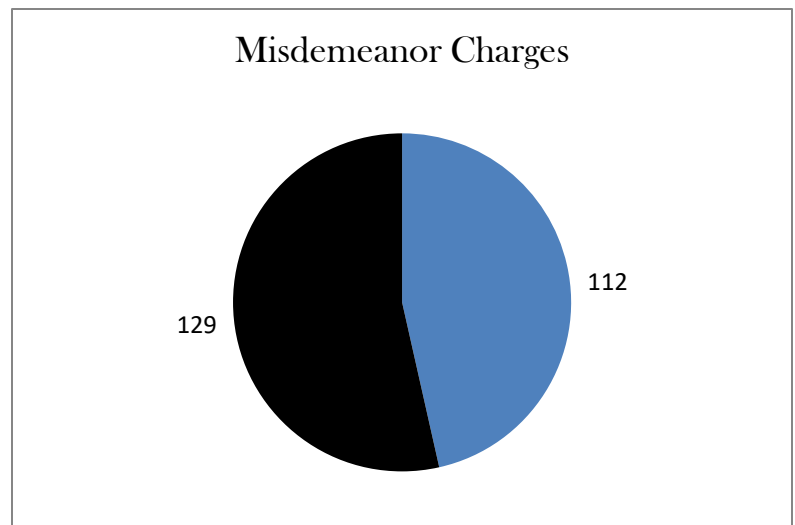
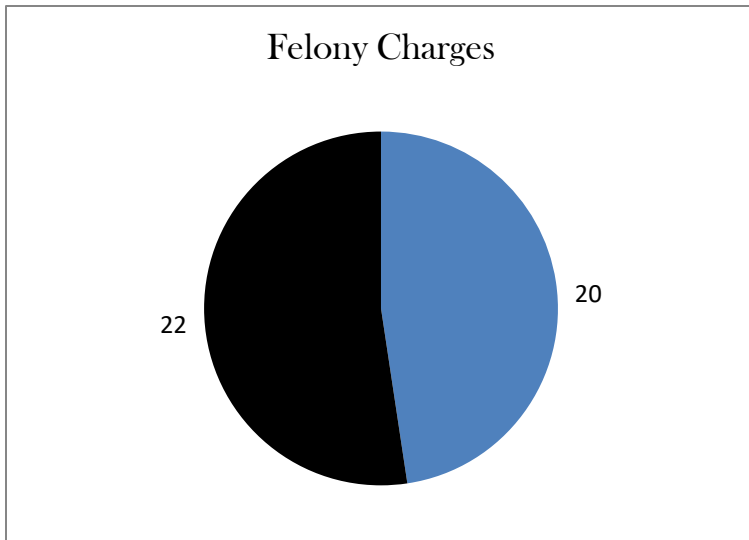
Arrest Types
