Re: Police Department Activities – March 2020

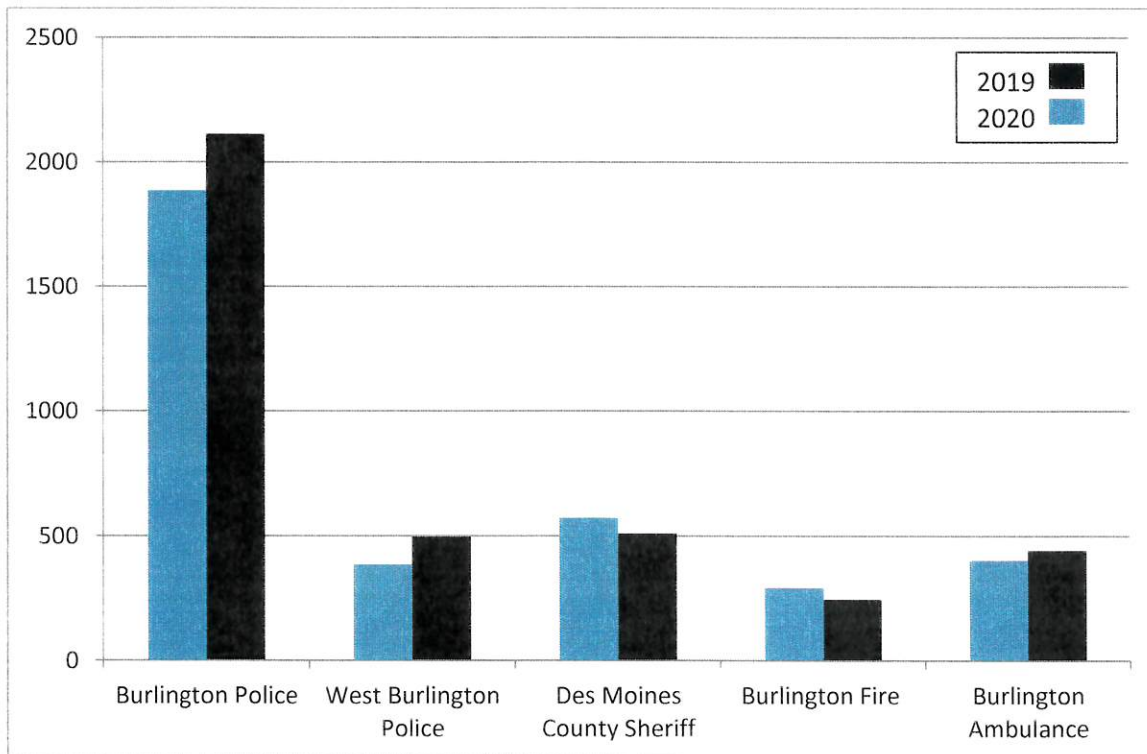

Reynolds on March 17<sup>th</sup> and Mayor Billups Emergency Proclamation also on March 17<sup>th</sup> directly impacted the citizens of the community and daily operations of the Burlington Police Department as can be seen in the following activity report and statistics.***

  - Deer Management meetings

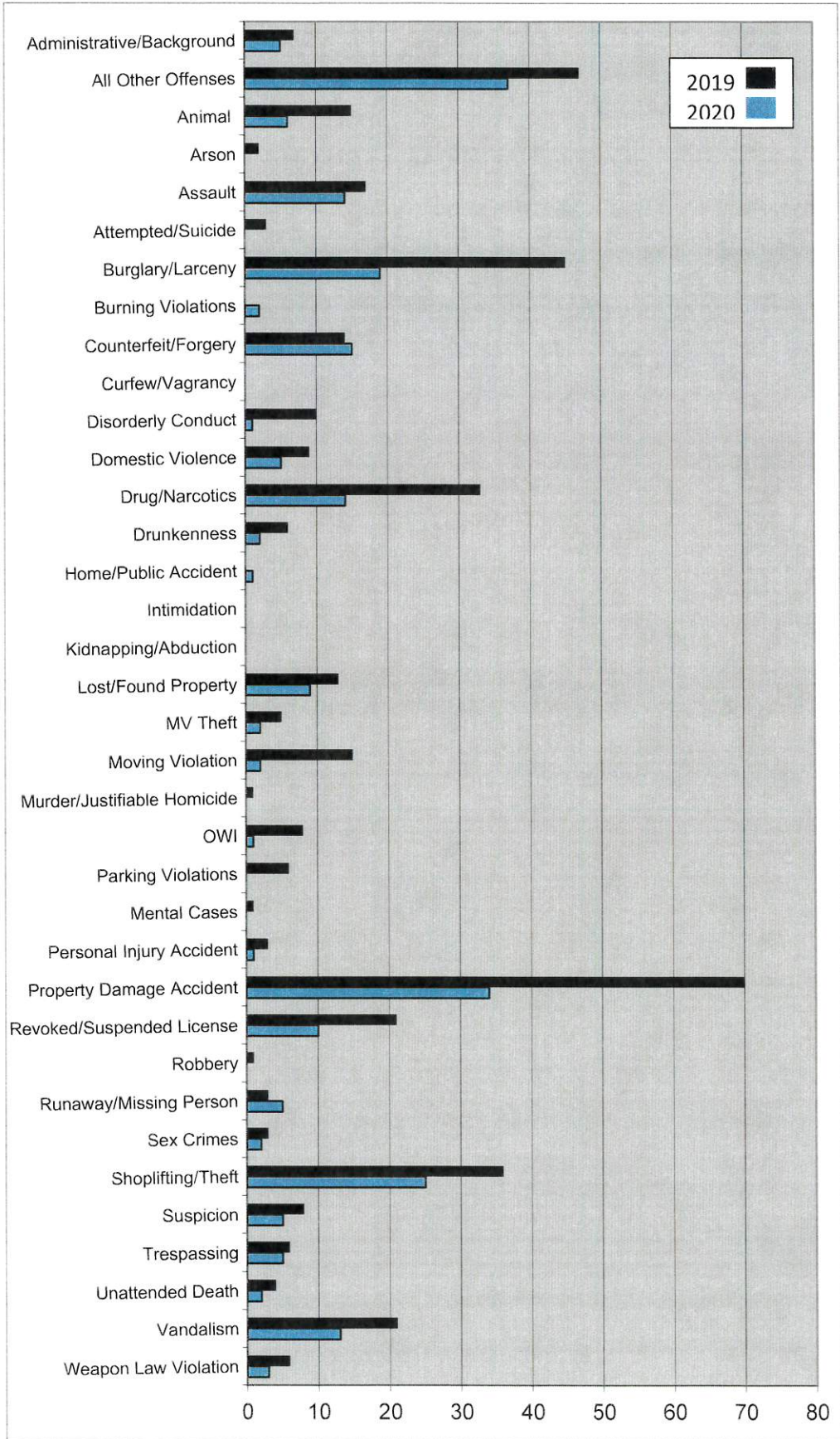
- The BPD Citizen’s Police Academy

March 2020 vs. March 2019



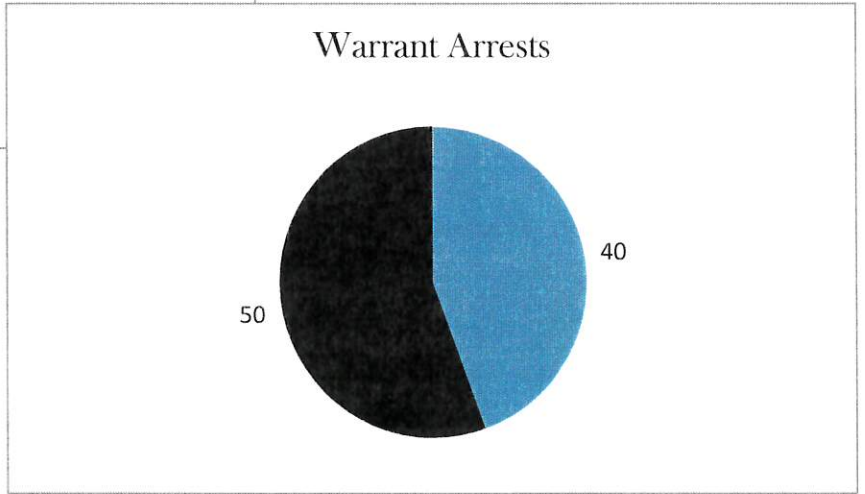
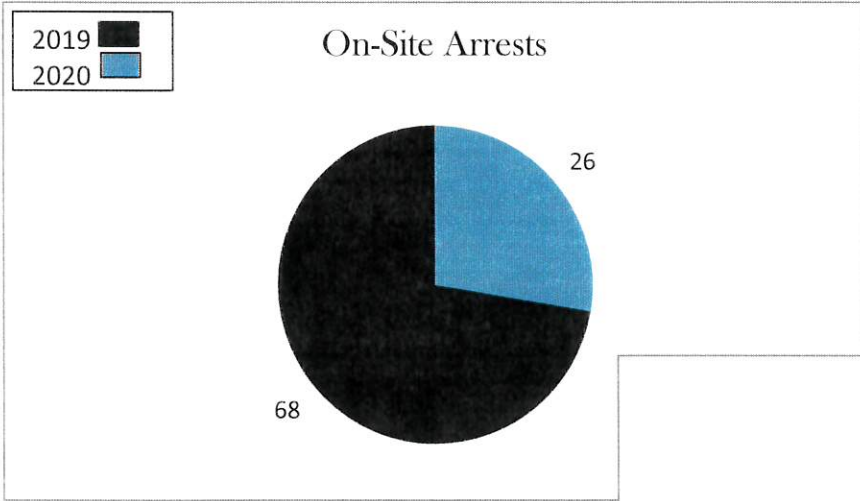

## March 2019 vs. March 2020



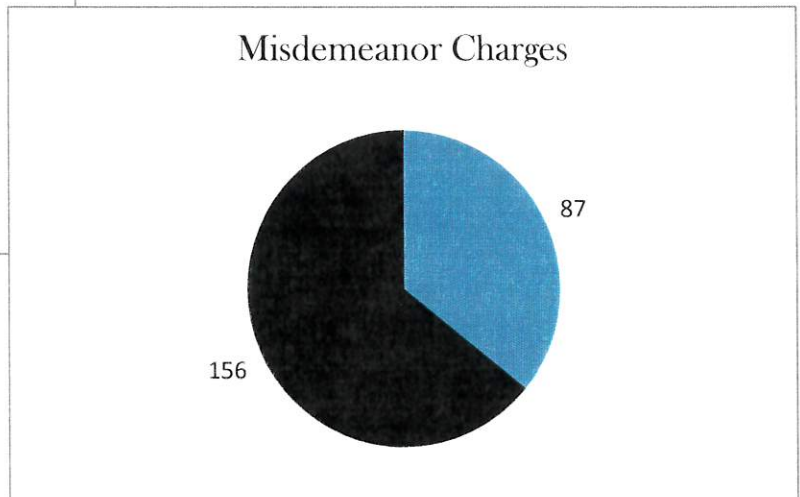
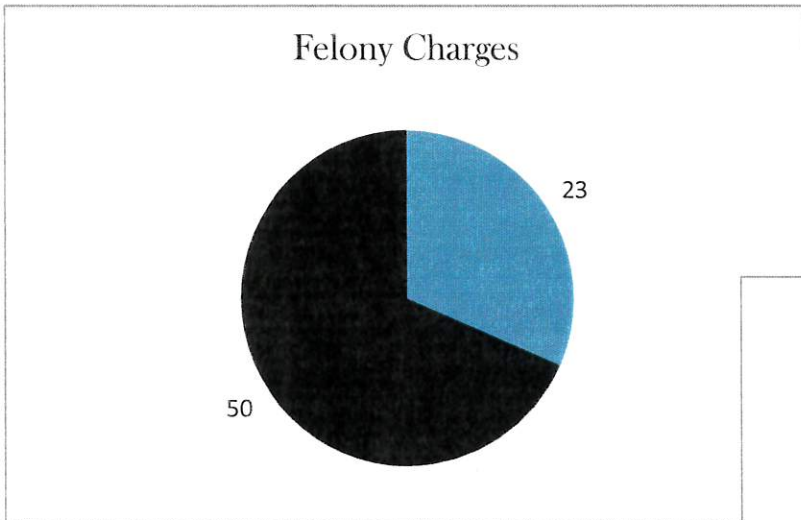
### Arrest Types
