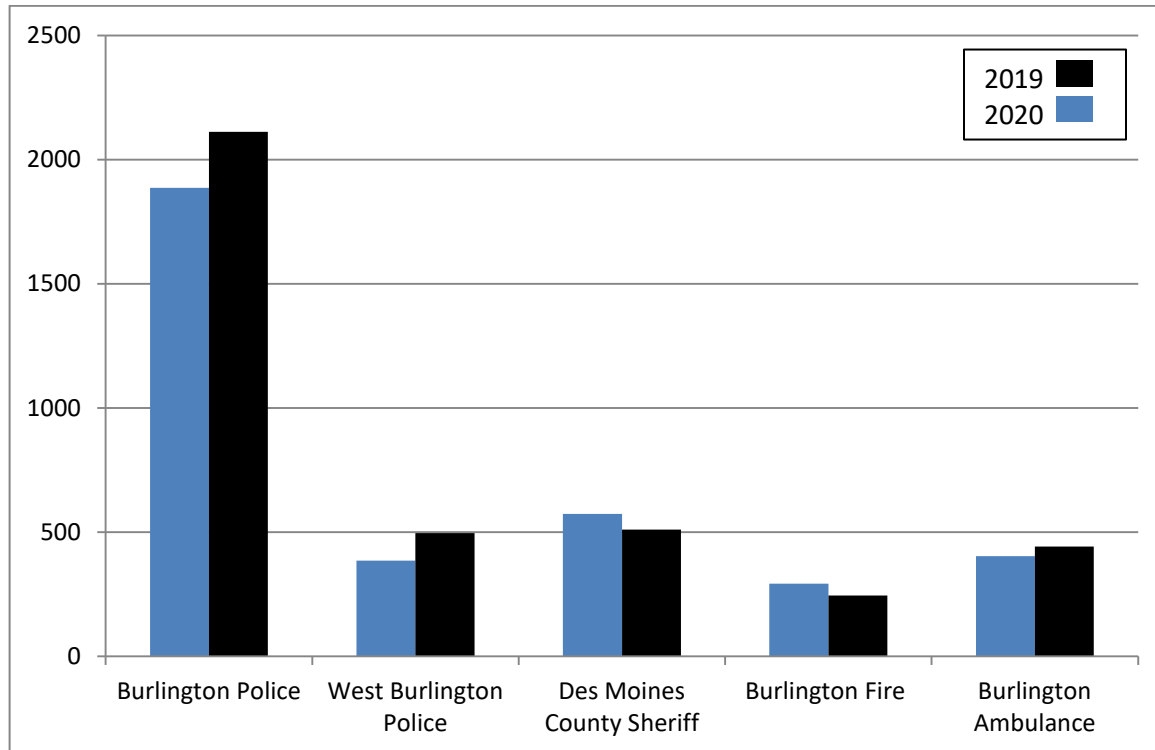
- Chief Kramer participated in City Council Work Session and Meetings.

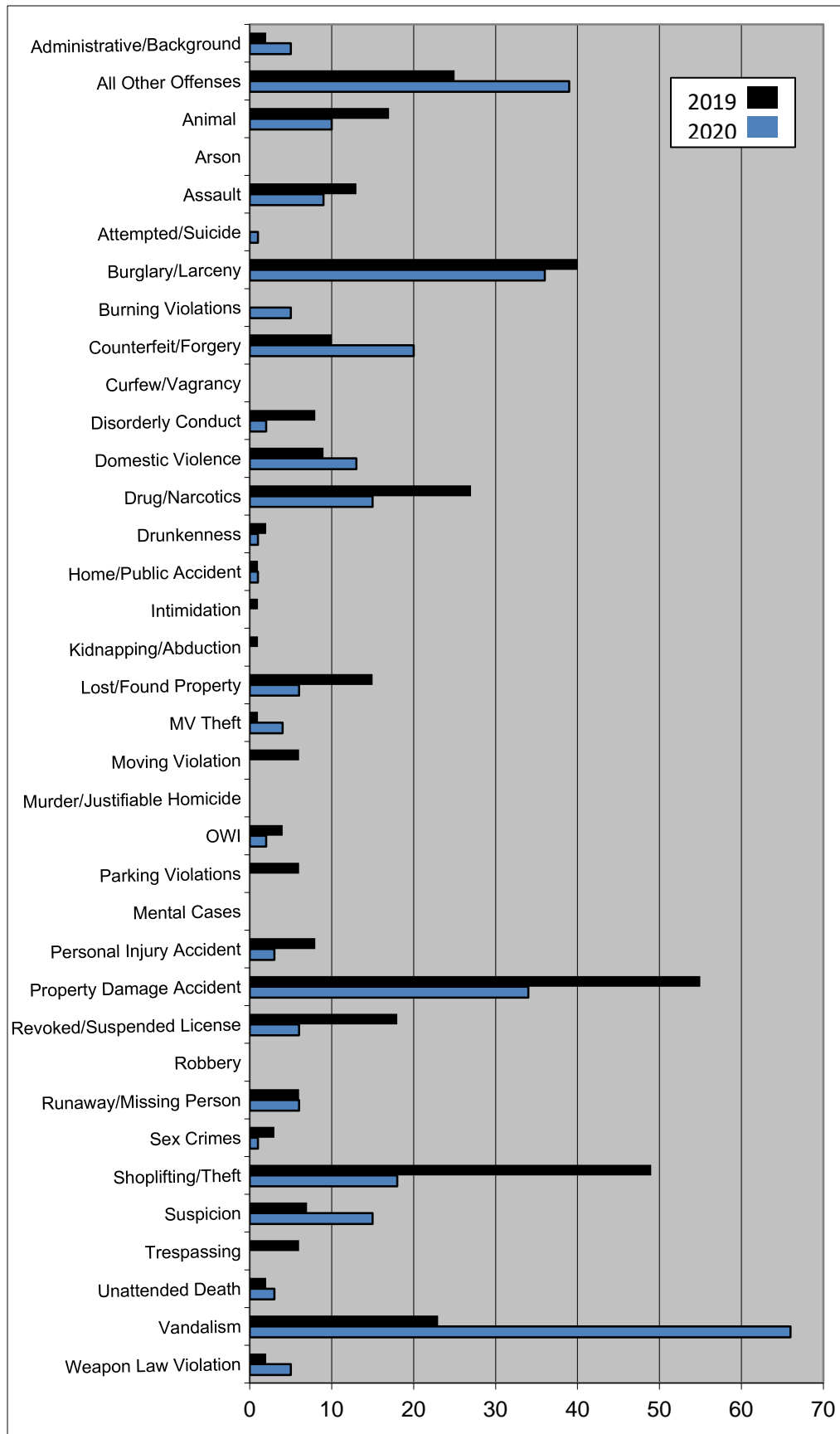

### Calls Requiring an Emergency Response by Agency April 2020 vs. April 2019

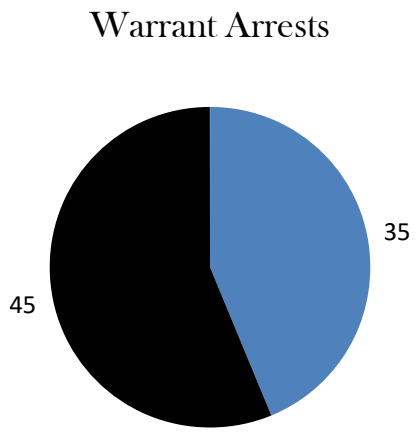
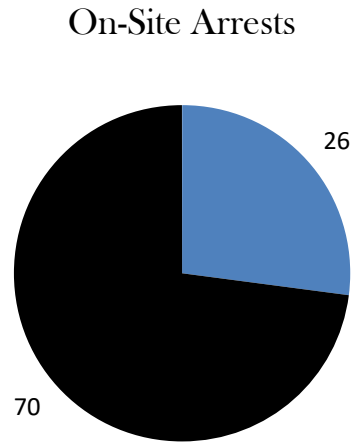
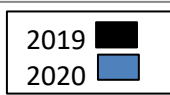

April 2019 vs. April 2020

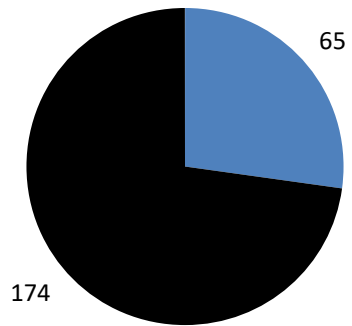


Arrest Types  
April 2019 vs. April 2020

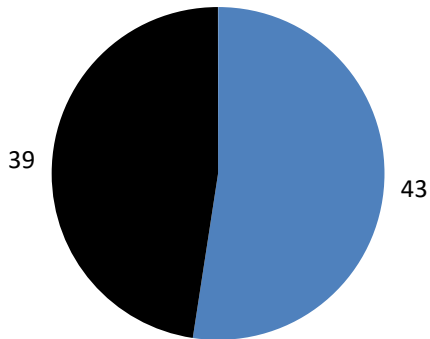


Charge Types

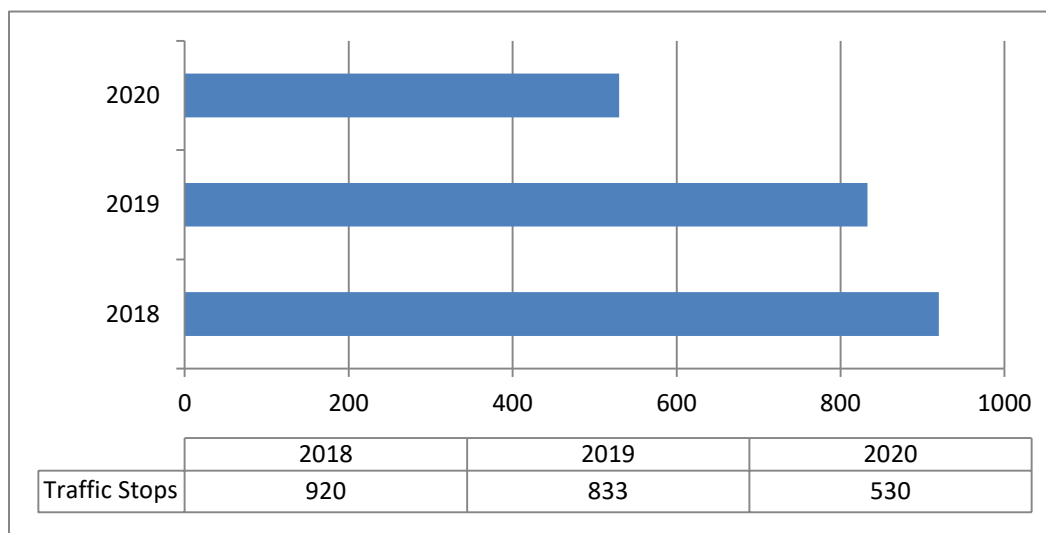

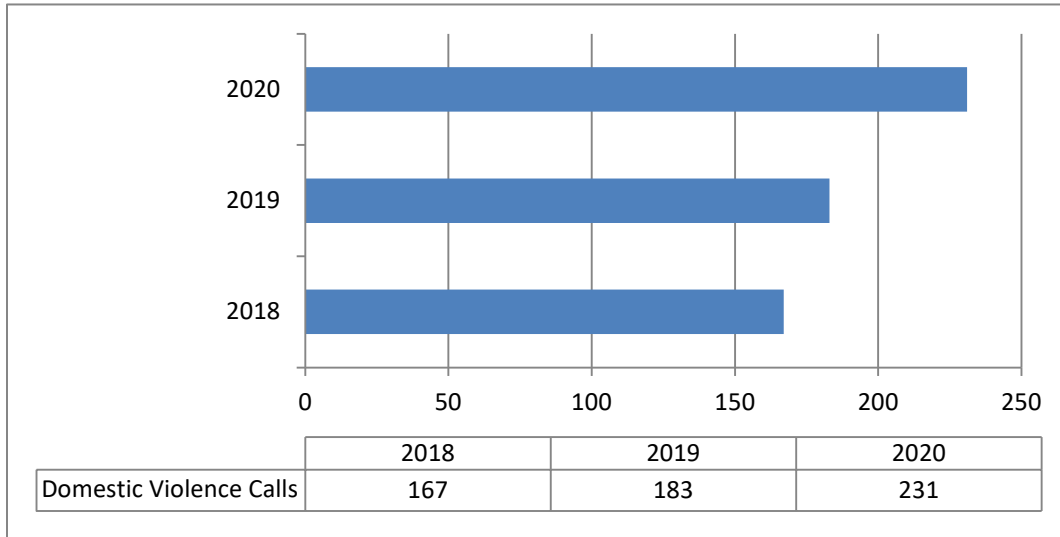
### Traffic Stops
