Re: Police Department Activities – May 2020

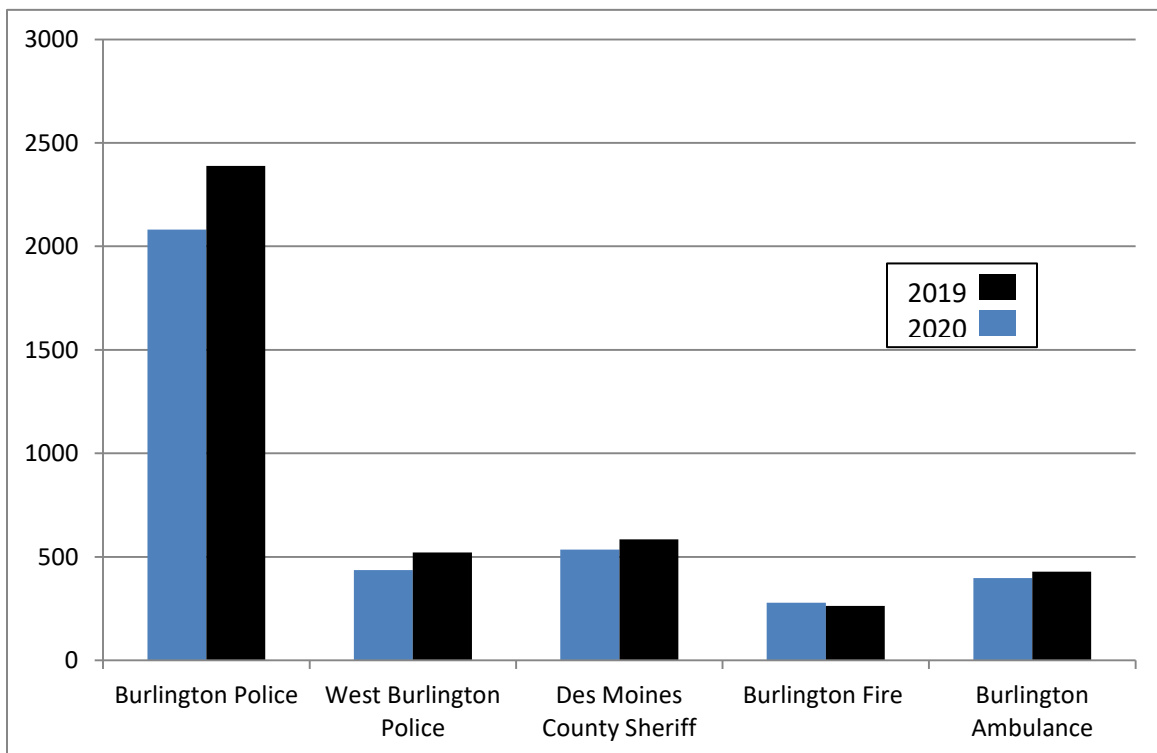

  - Criminal Investigations Cases

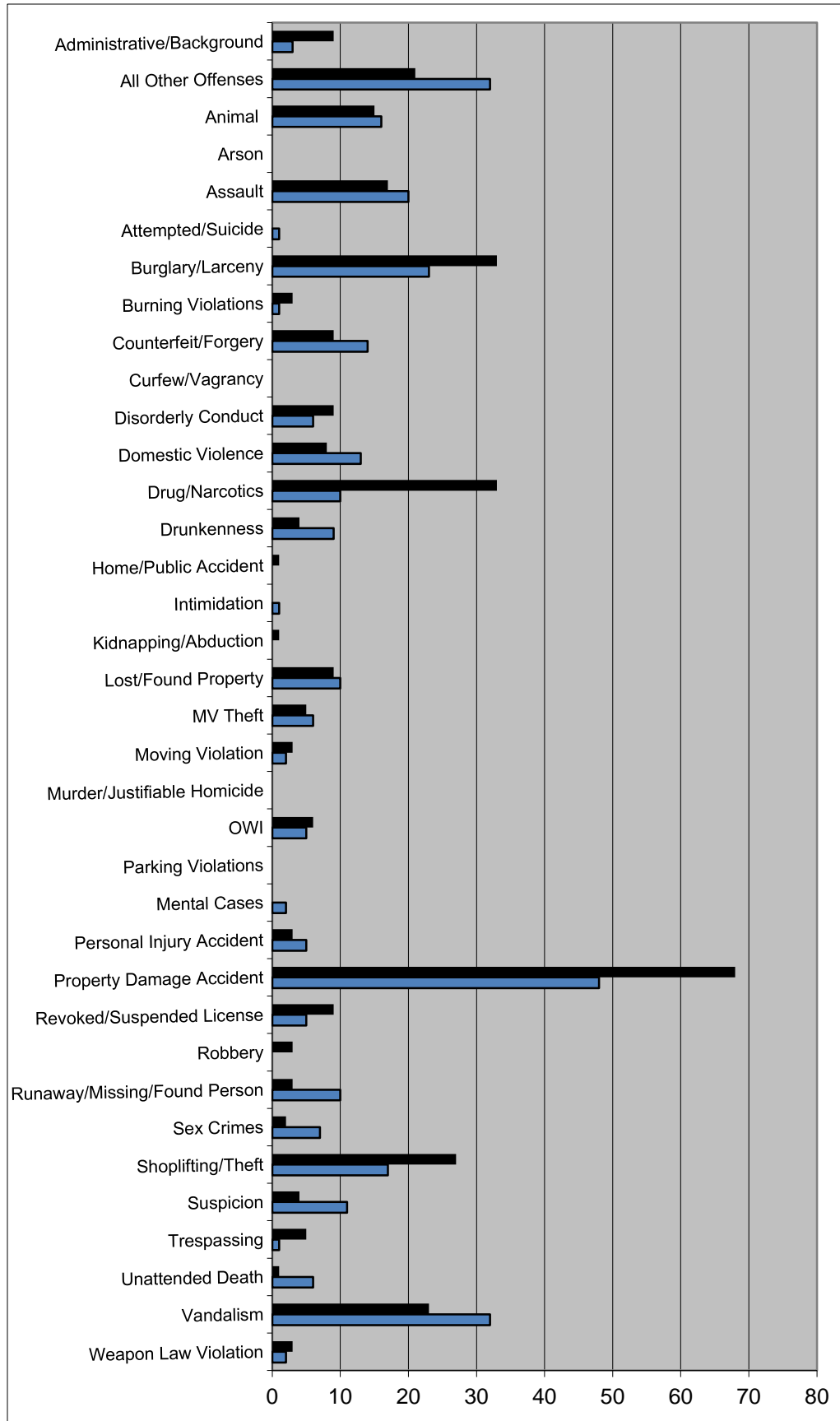

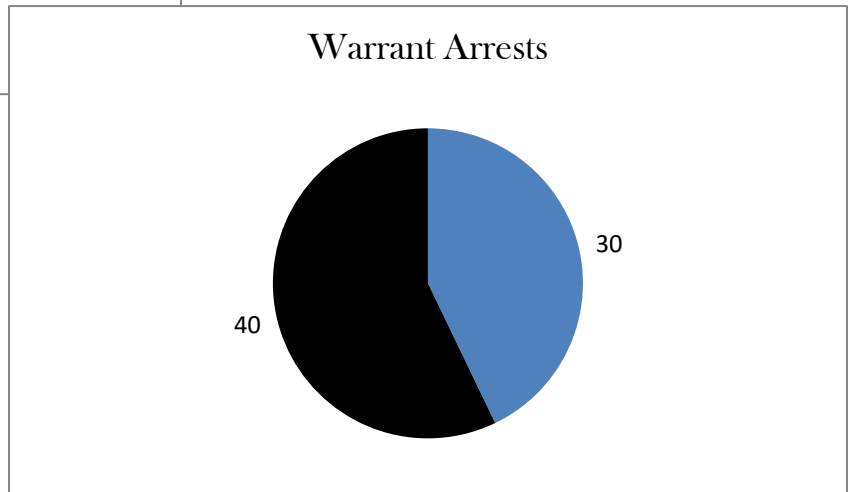
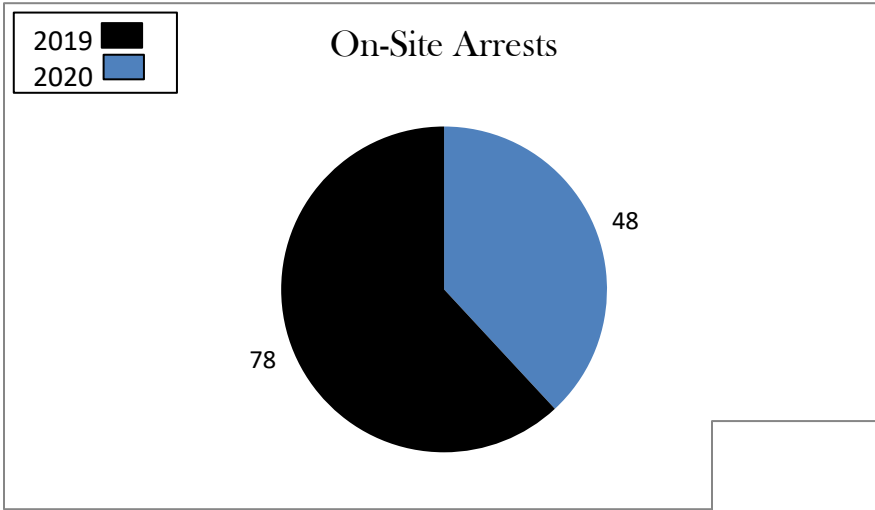

### May 2019 vs. May 2020



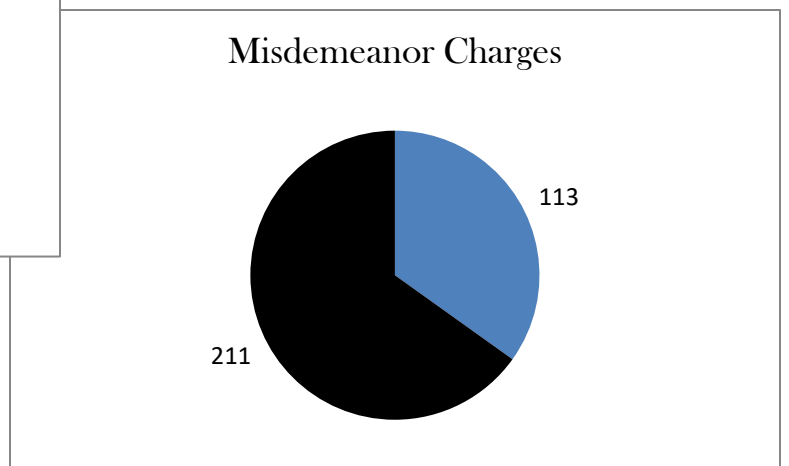
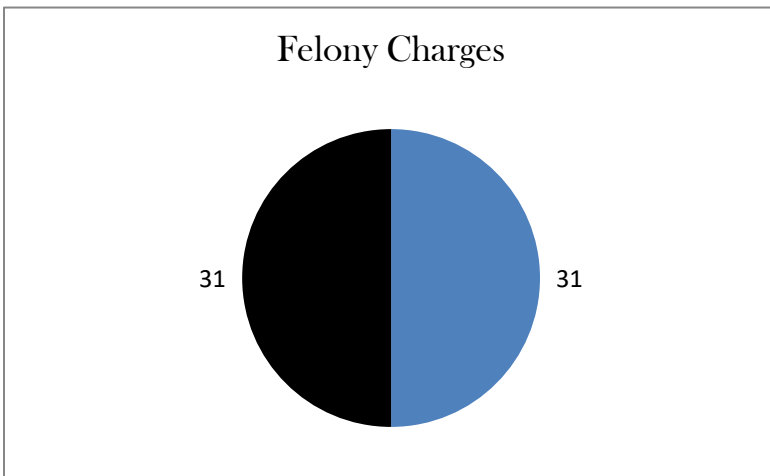
## Arrest Types

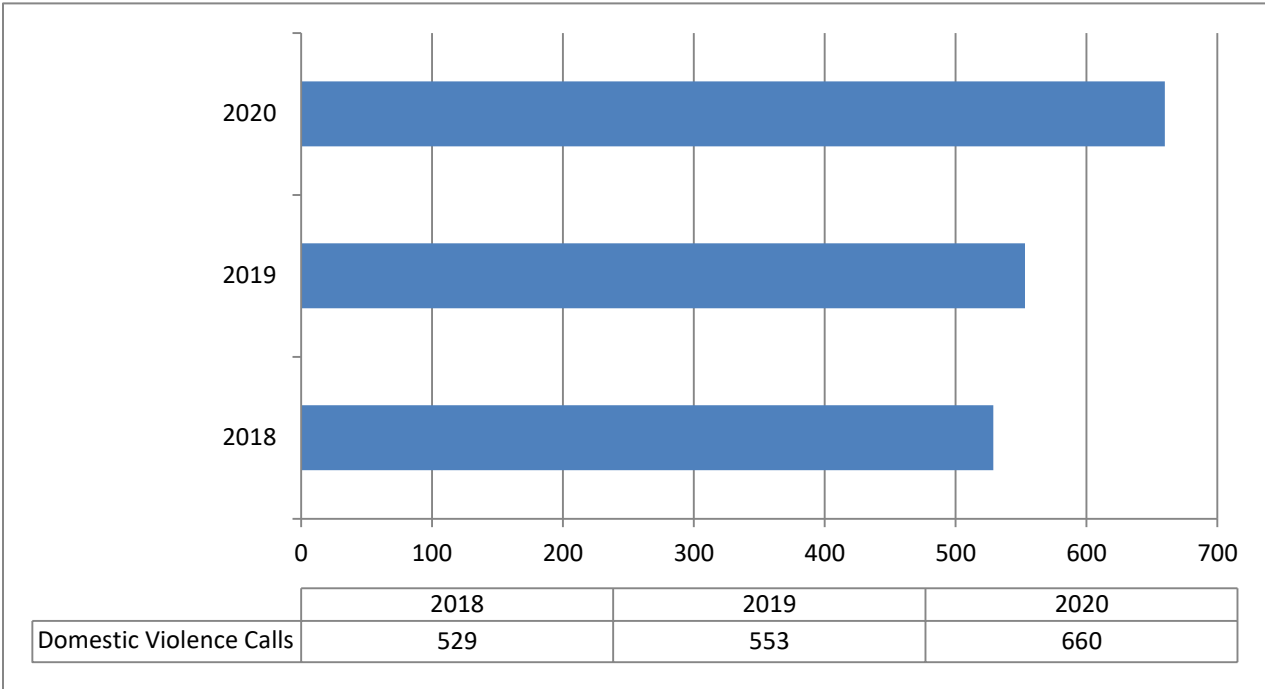

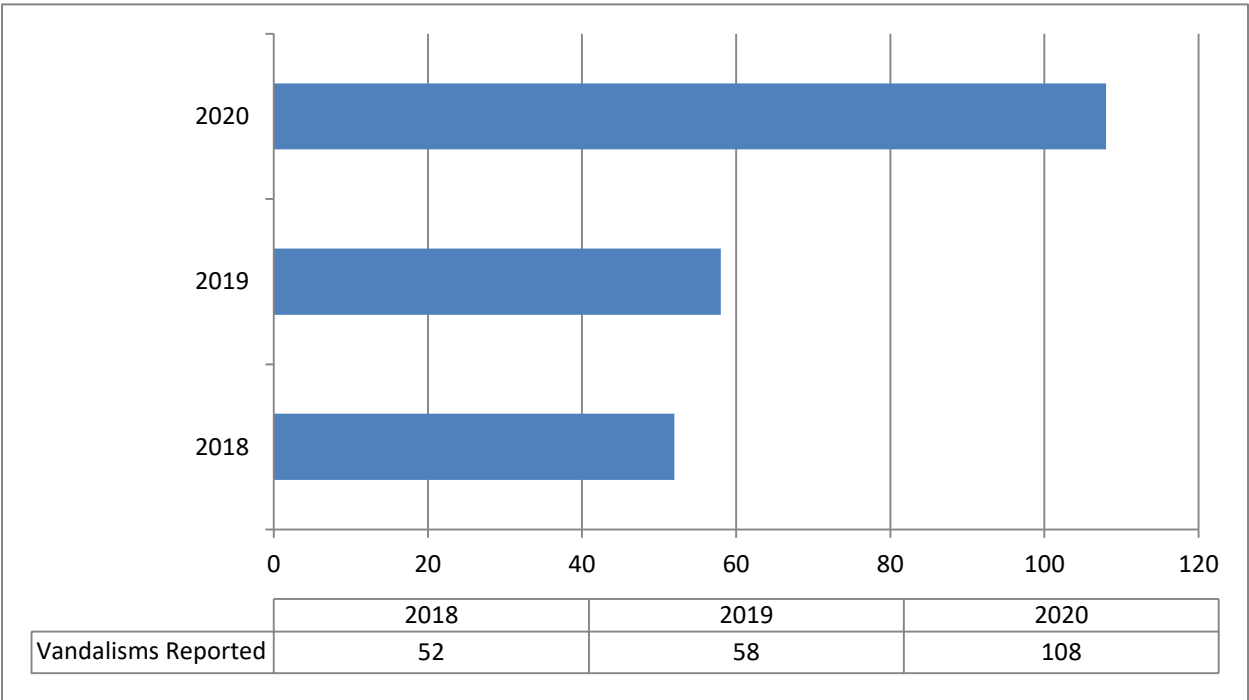
## Domestic Violence Calls
