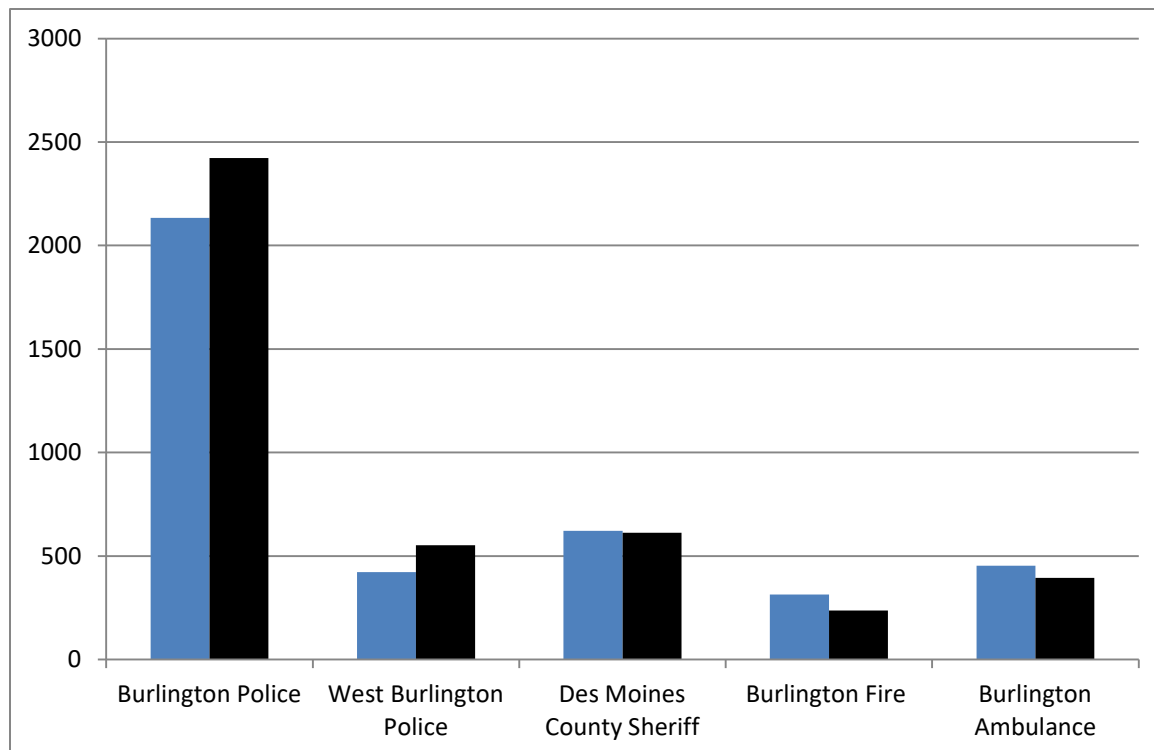
- Chief Kramer participated in City Council Work Session and Meetings.

- Many officers attended the organized demonstration on June 2nd that started outside of the Burlington Police Department and concluded at Memorial Auditorium.

- The front counter of the Burlington Police Department was reopened to the public needing assistance in obtaining police reports or to speak with an officer.
- During the month of June, sworn officers participated in rifle and handgun qualifications, stop stick training, PoliceOne Academy training and reviewed Daily Training Bulletins. Additionally, two officers obtained Basic FTO Certification and two officers were re-certified as Firearms Instructors. There was one presentation given to a small group at the Police Department and two Zoom presentations with 103 people watching. 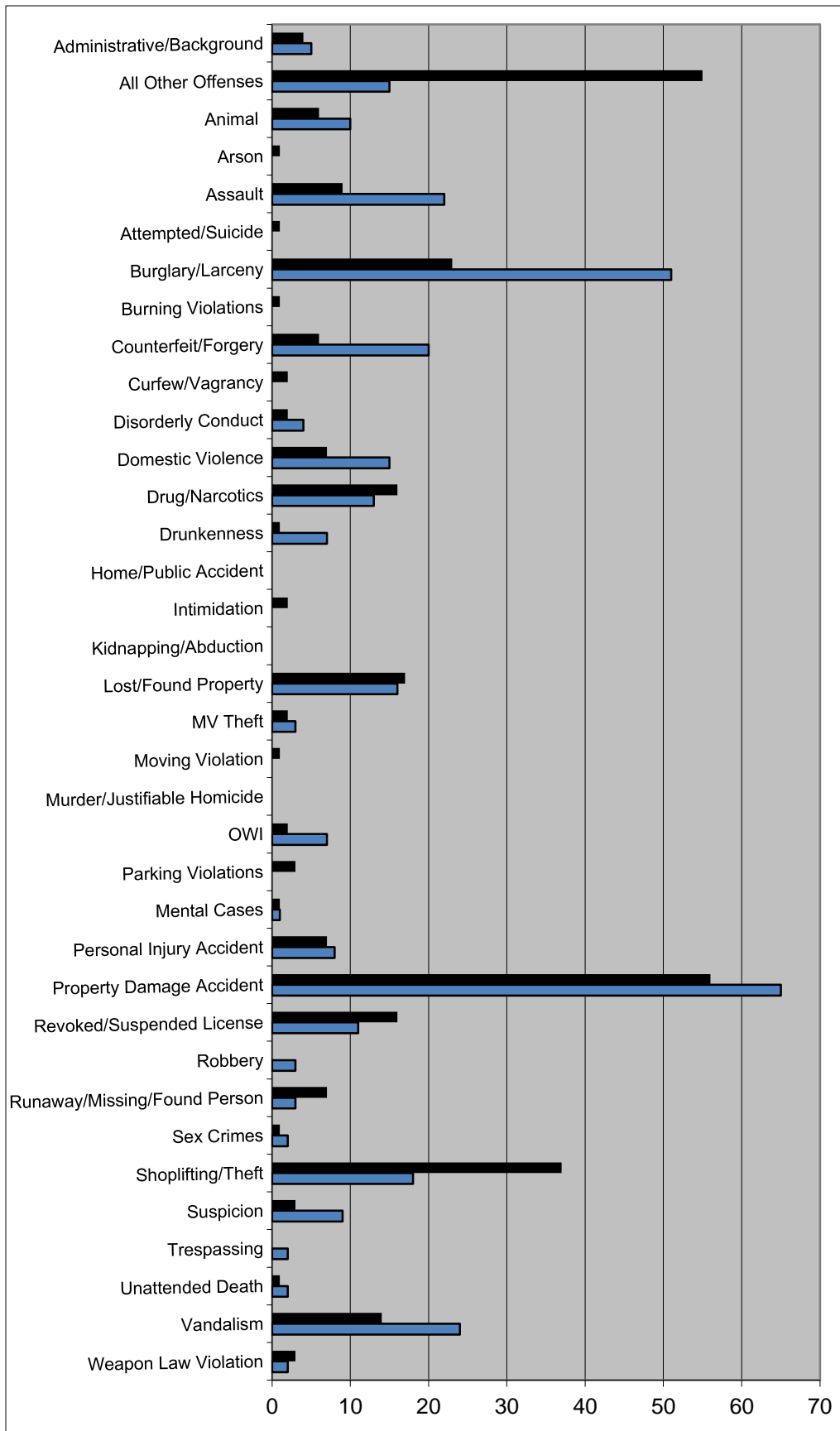
Additionally, since the Emergency Proclamation was issued, there have been some changes realized in three call types (Traffic Stops, Vandalism and Domestic Violence).

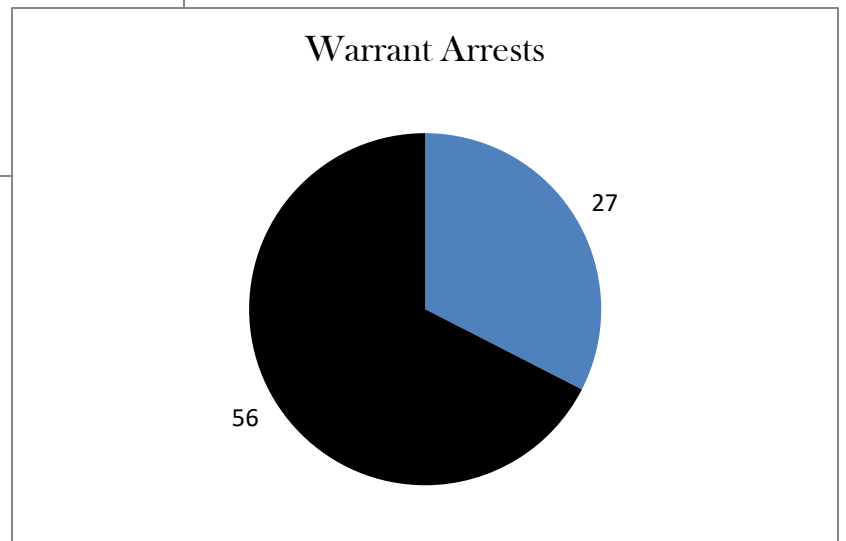
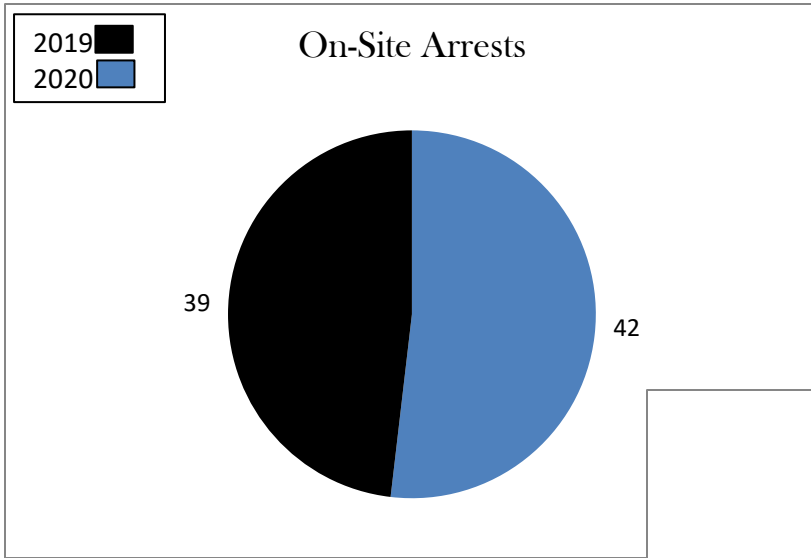
Incidents

June 2019 vs. June 2020



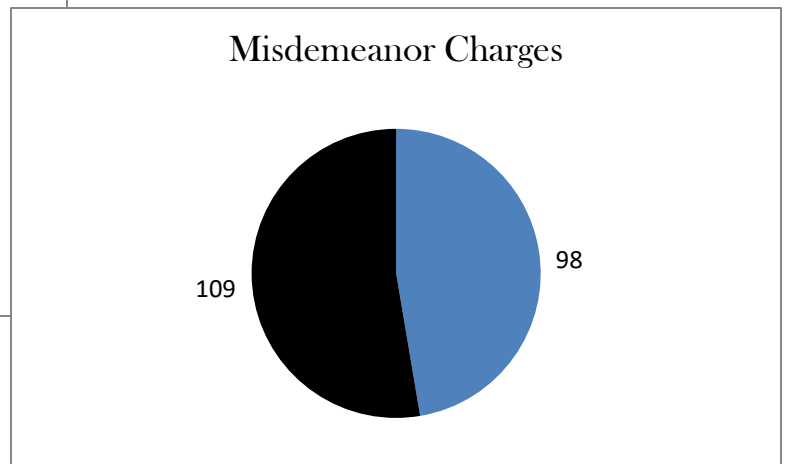
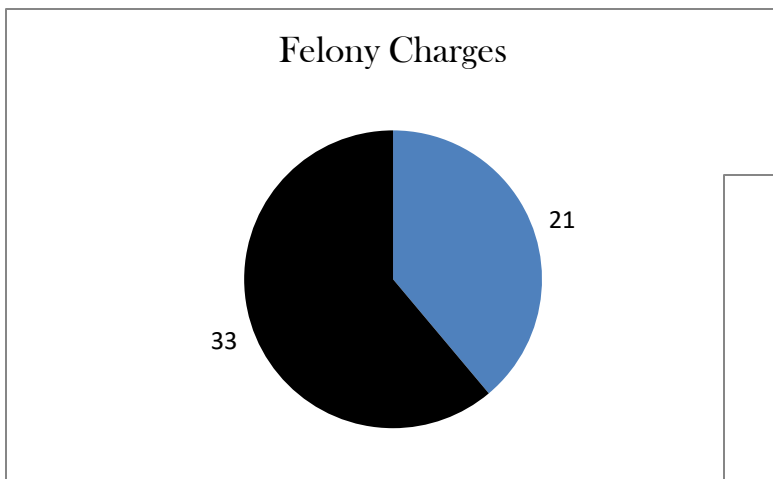
Arrest Types

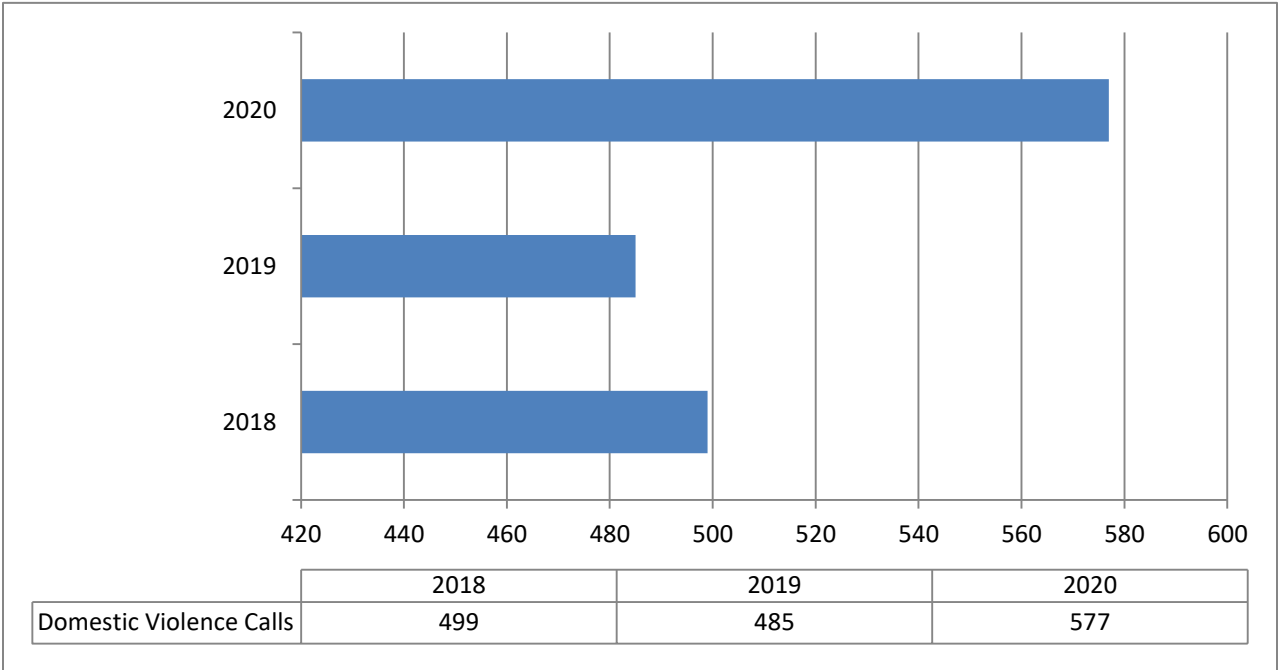

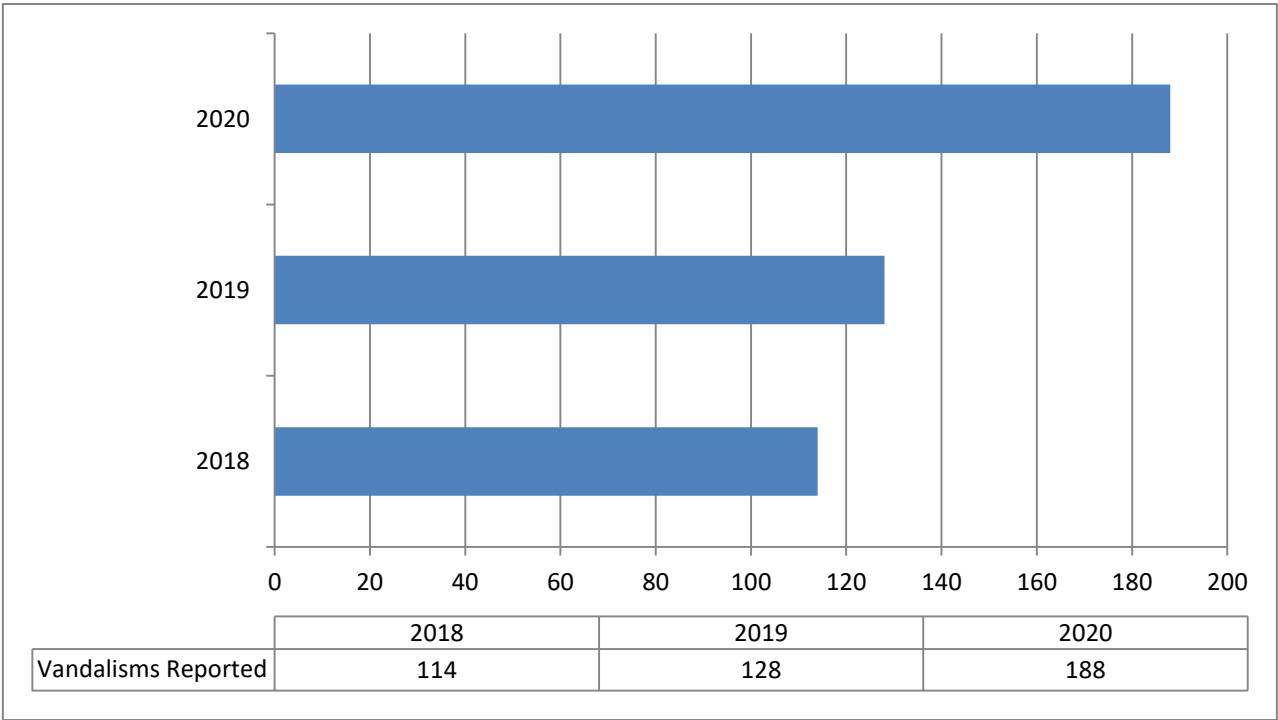
Domestic Violence Calls
