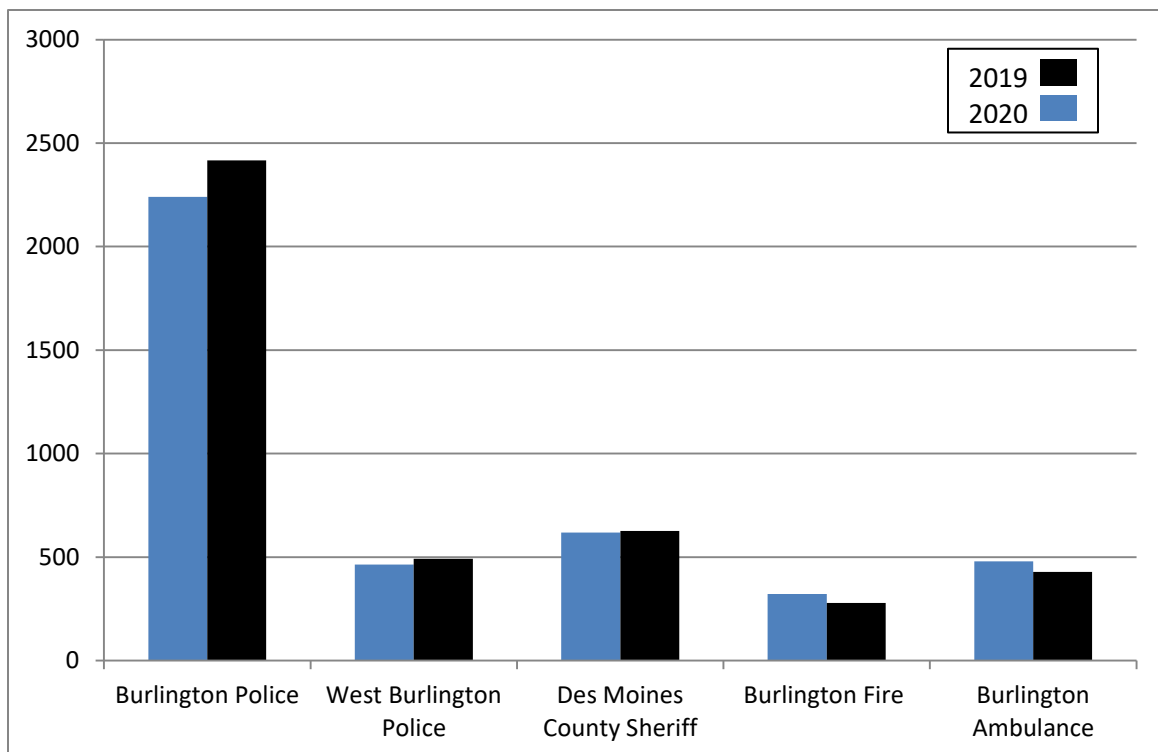

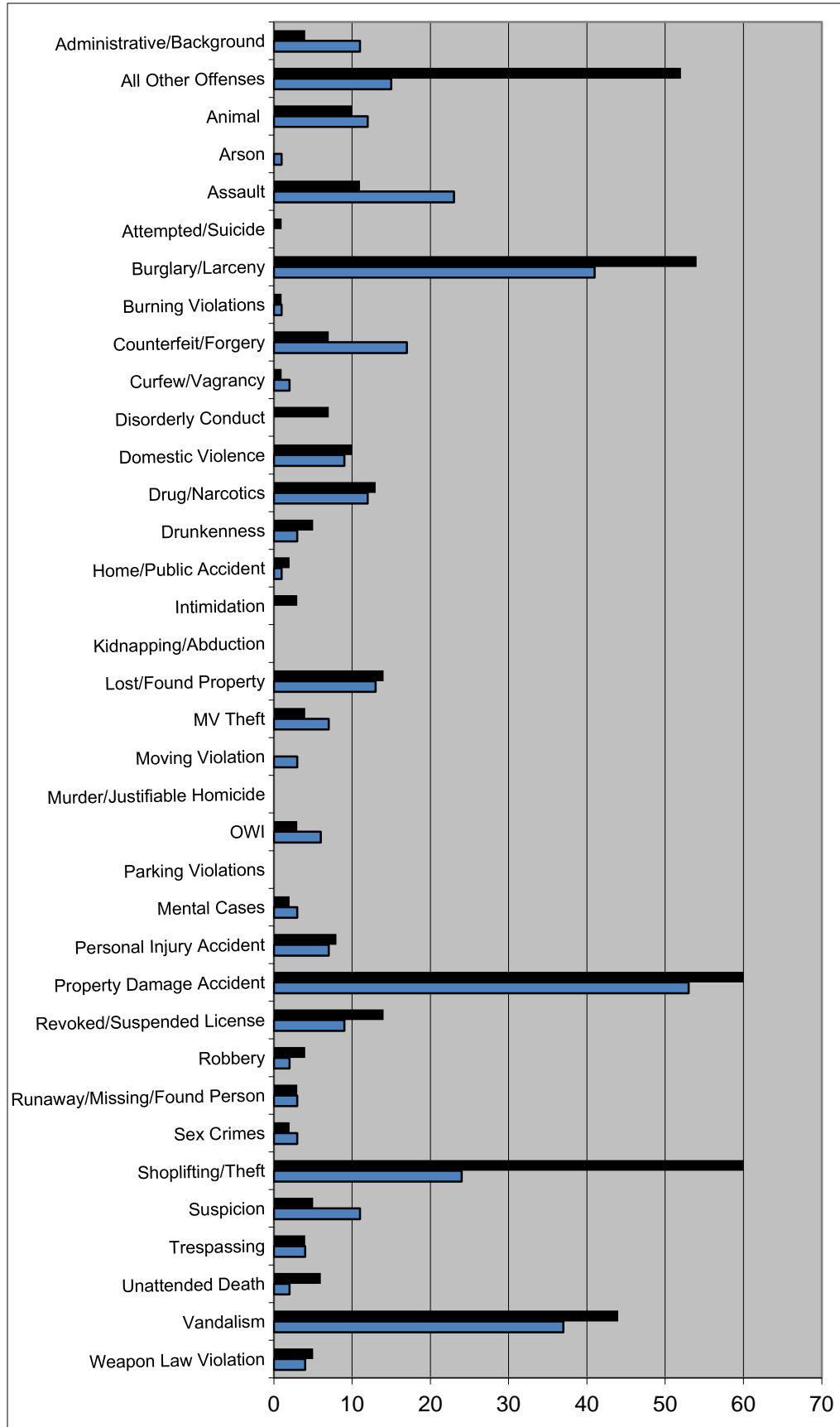

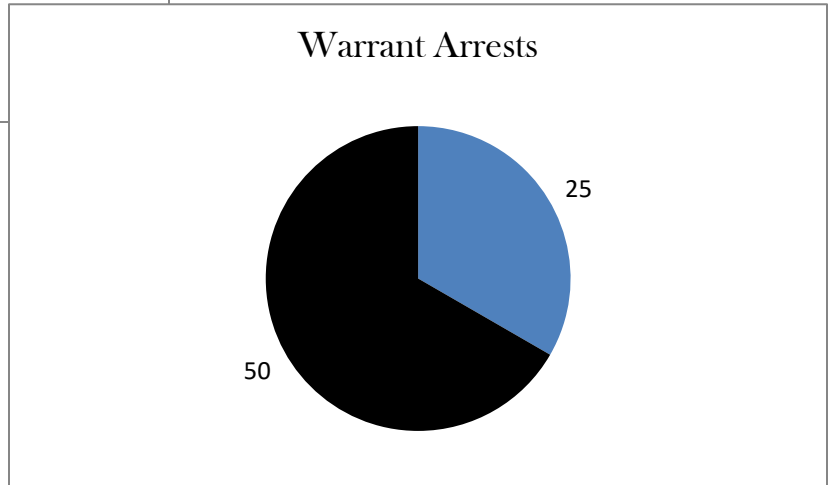
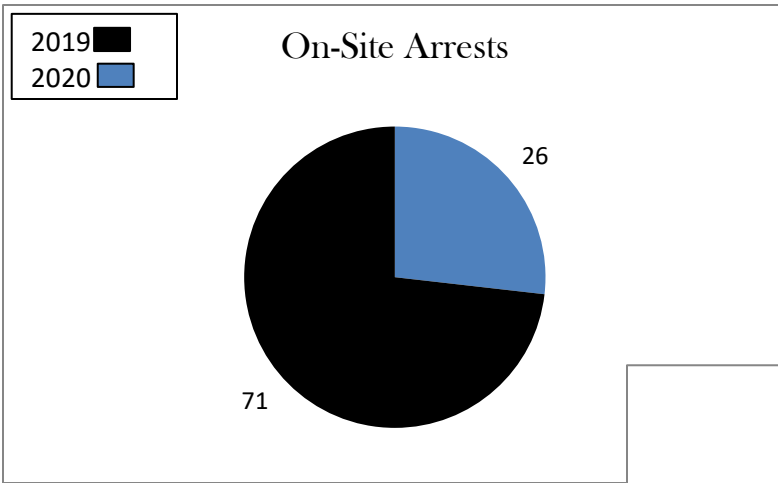
Incidents

July 2019 vs. July 2020



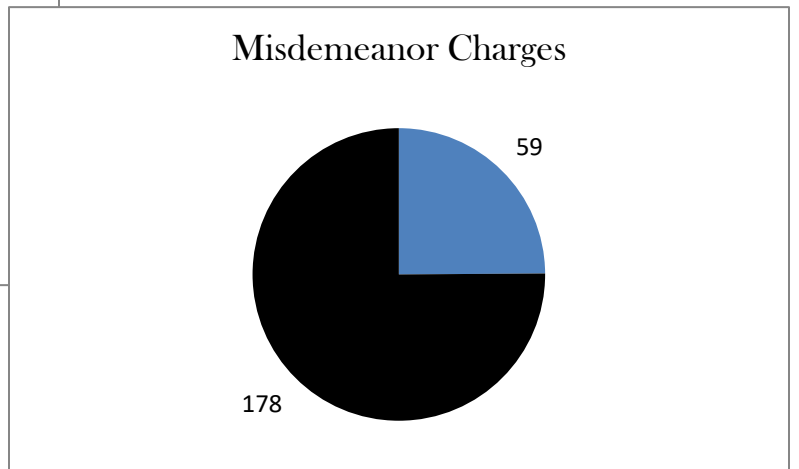
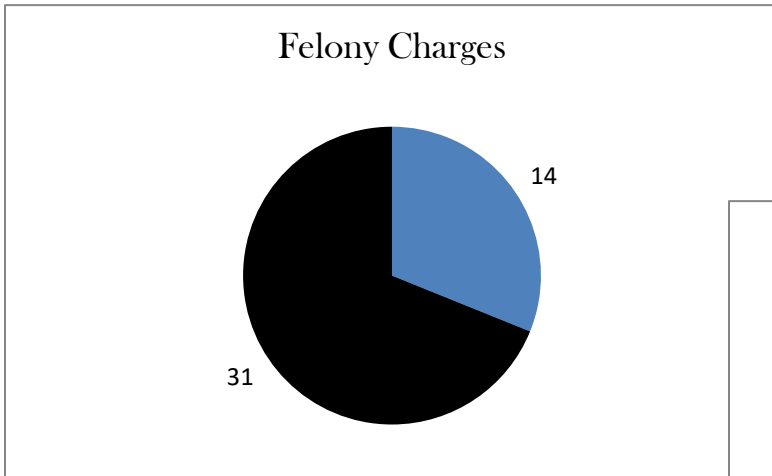
Arrest Types
