***The issuance of a State of Public Health Disaster Emergency by Gov. Reynolds on March 17<sup>th</sup> and Mayor Billups Emergency Proclamation also on March 17<sup>th</sup> directly impacted the citizens of the community and daily operations of the Burlington Police Department as can be seen in the following activity report and statistics.***

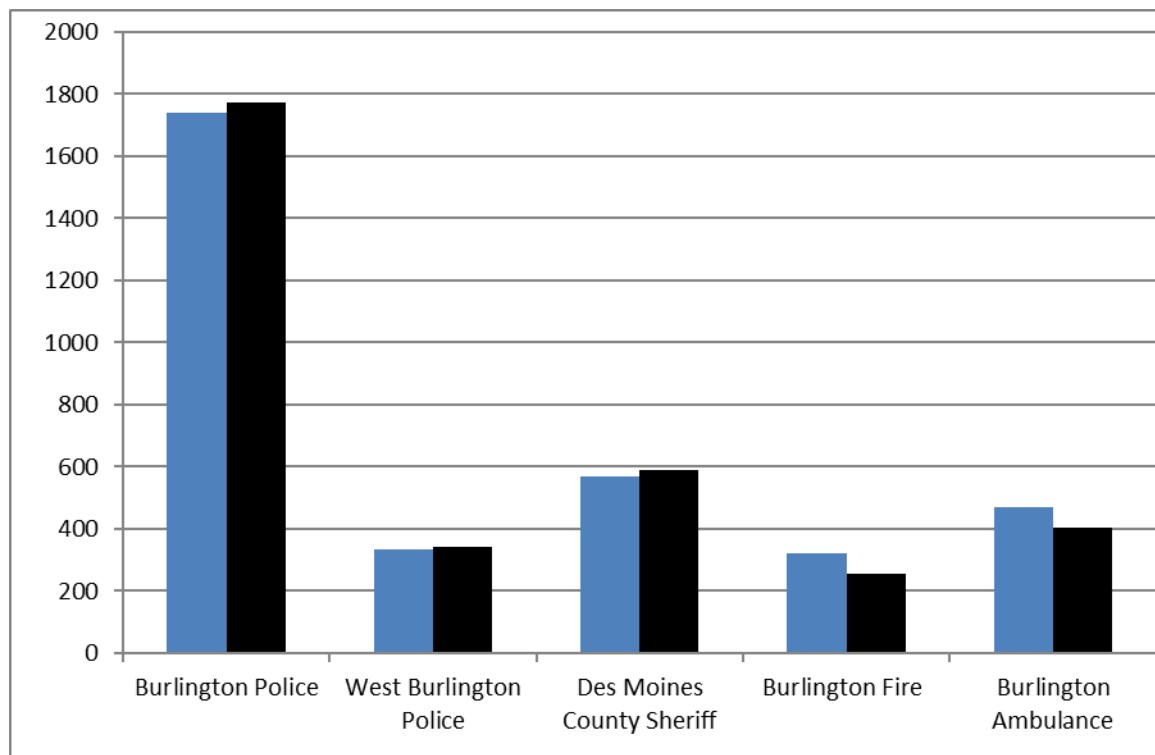
- Acting Chief Klein participated in City Council Work Session and Meetings.

- Sworn officers participated in Prolonging a Law Enforcement Career via the PoliceOne Academy, daily training bulletins, Lexipol policy updates and utilized the Firearms Training Simulator. Individual officers obtained his/her Glock Armorer's Training Course, Advanced K9 Training Certification (2-weeks), and Evidence Processing and Photography training. Additionally, officers and staff were invited to a First Responder Breakfast hosted by Harmony Bible Church. During the month of November, there was one ride-a-long and no presentations to community groups.
- During the month of November, one officer continued Basic ILEA training at Camp Dodge and two officers continued in step II of the FTO process. During the month of October, there were 102 animals

- Criminal Investigations Cases

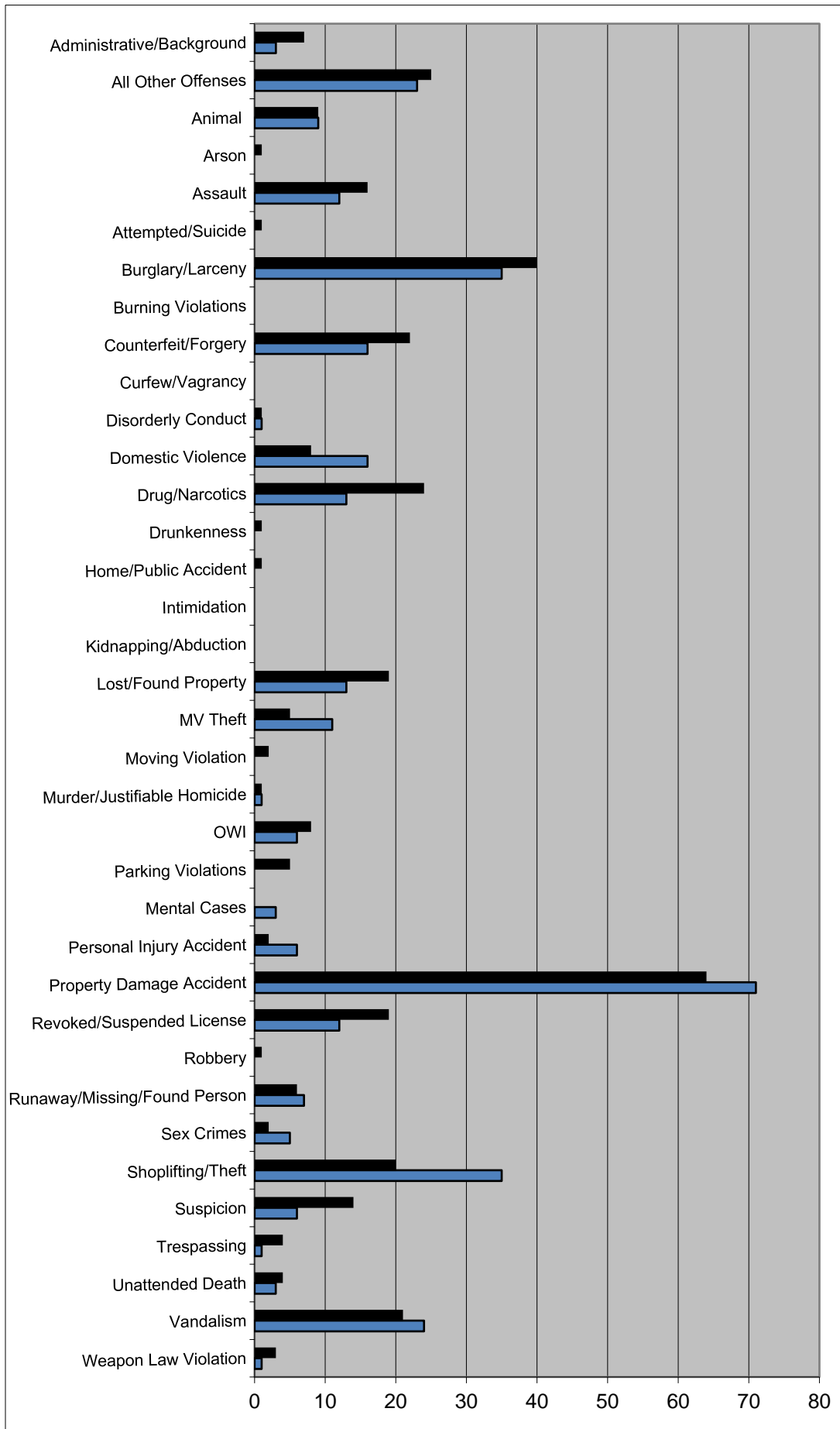

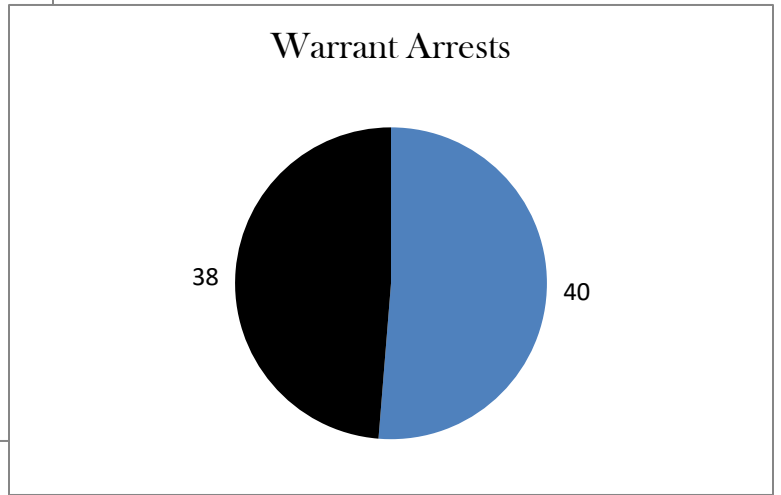
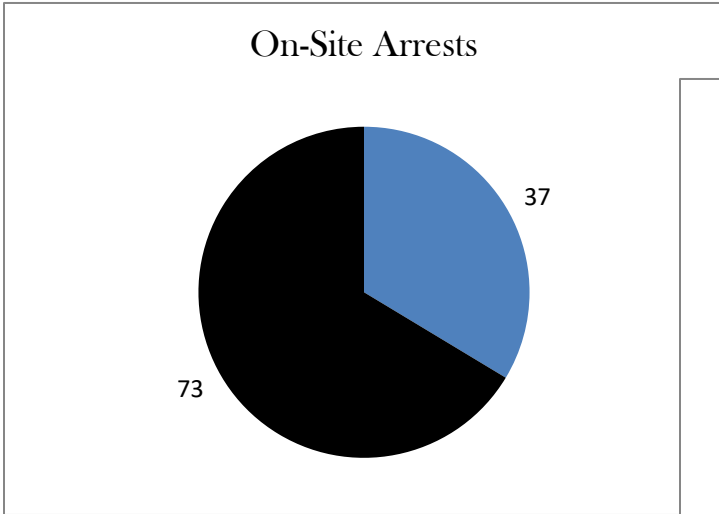

November 2020 vs. November 2019



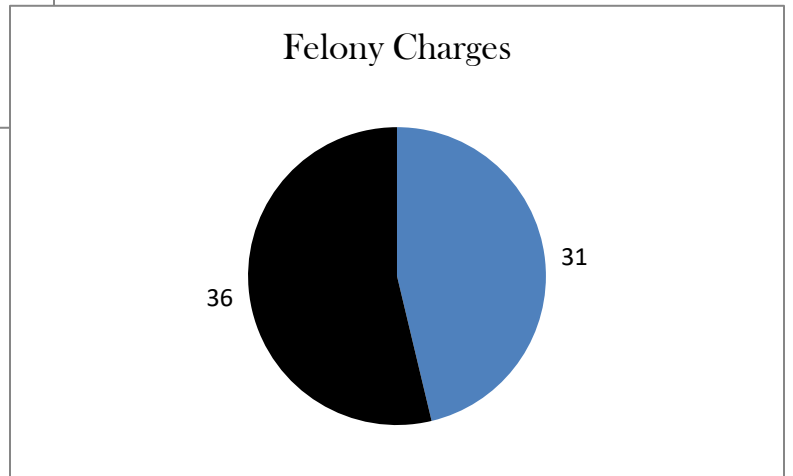
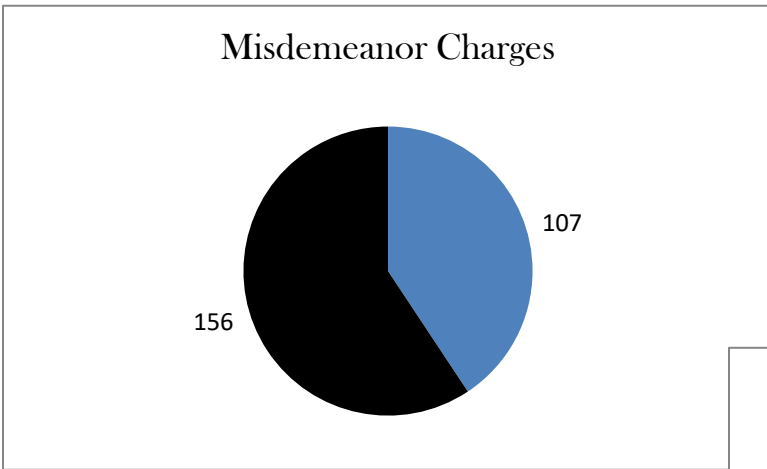
### Arrest Types
