Re: Police Department Activities – December 2020

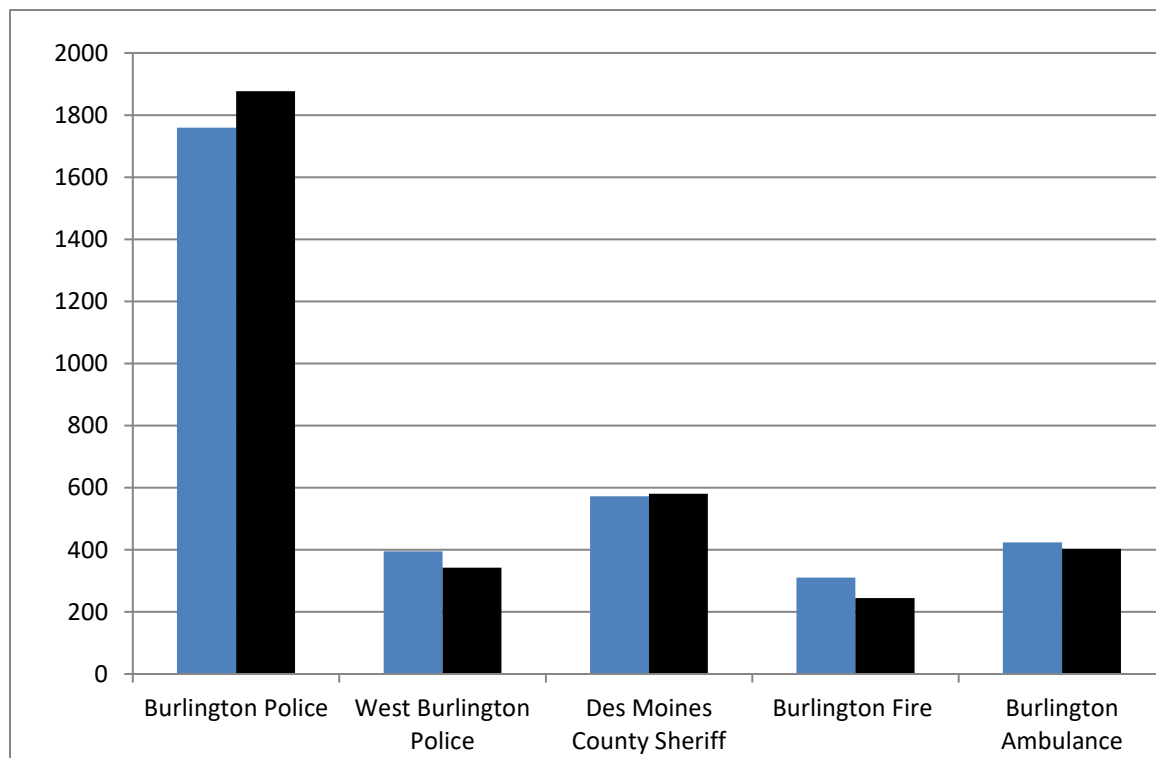
The issuance of a State of Public Health Disaster Emergency by Gov. Reynolds on March 17th and Mayor Billups Emergency Proclamation also on March 17th directly impacted the citizens of the community and daily operations of the Burlington Police Department as can be seen in the following activity report and statistics.

- Acting Chief Klein participated in City Council Meetings, a Special Meeting and Work Sessions.
- Acting Chief Klein participated in Department Head and Attorney meetings.
- Acting Chief Klein participated in:
 - The KBUR Peace Officer Talk Show
 - A DesCom Control Board meeting
 - A Des Moines County E911 Board meeting
 - City IT meeting
 - Several department level budget preparation meetings
- Major Schaefer participated in:
 - Weekly EOC COVID Briefings with Emergency Management
 - End-of-Step meetings with two Officers in the FTO process
 - Homeless Prevention meeting
 - WatchGuard deployment and data transfer
 - Des Moines County Cultural Equity meeting
- Sworn officers participated in De-Escalation training via the PoliceOne Academy, daily training bulletins, Lexipol policy updates and utilized the Firearms Training Simulator. Individual officers attended Celebrite training and certification, Operation LiveSaver Instructor training, Taser certification, Defensive Tactics Recertification training, OWI/Implied Consent/SFST Instructor recertification as well as continued in the Field Training process. Additionally, officers participated in the annual Shop with a Cop event. During the month of December, there was one ride-a-long and no presentations to community groups.
- During the month of December, one officer graduated from Basic ILEA training at Camp Dodge and two officers continued in step III of the FTO process. During the month of December, there were 61 animals received at the Animal Shelter. 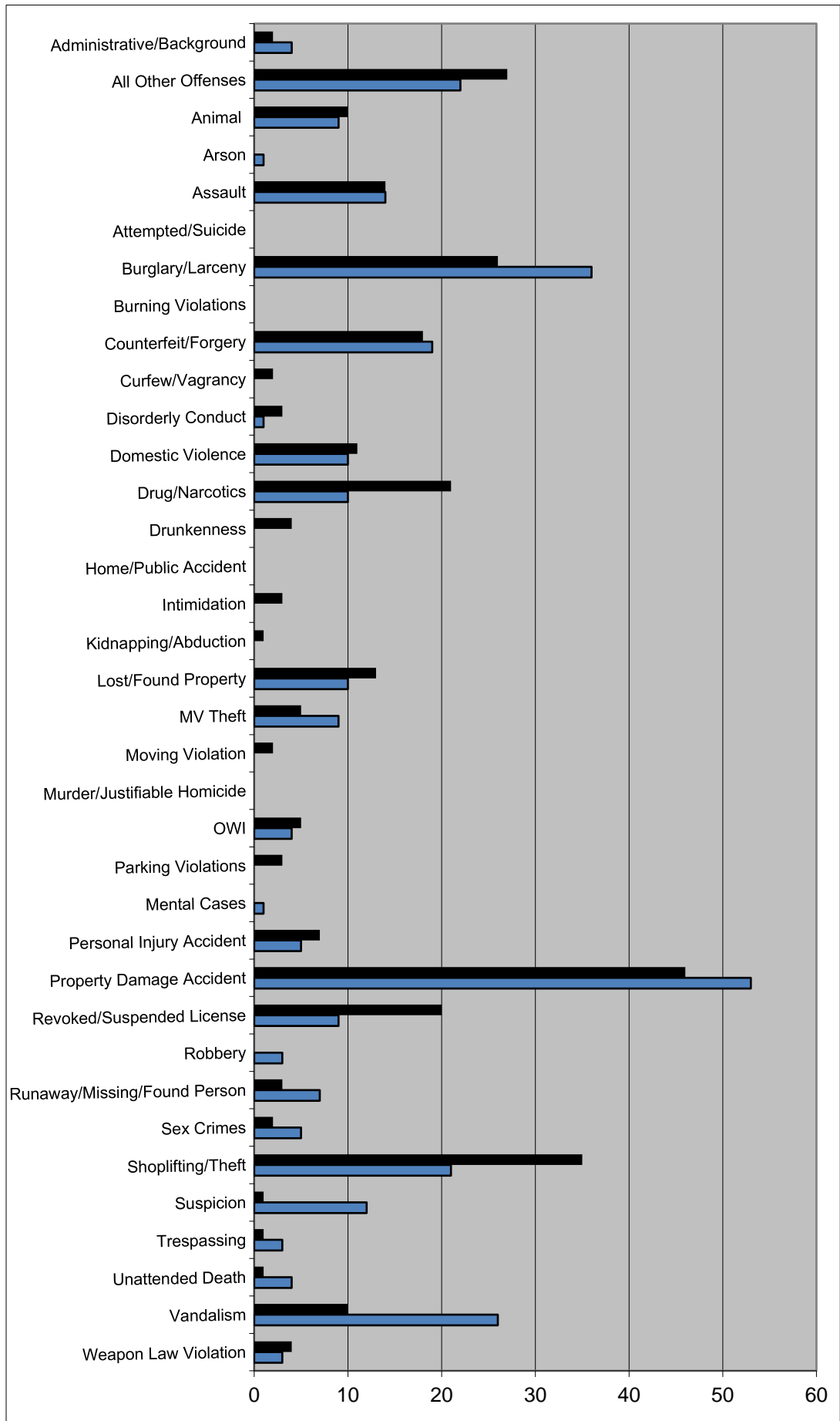

Since the Emergency Proclamation was issued, there have been some changes realized in three call types (Traffic Stops, Vandalism and Domestic Violence). Additionally, due to restrictions on inmates received at the Des Moines County jail, arrest numbers are reduced.

December 2020 vs. December 2019



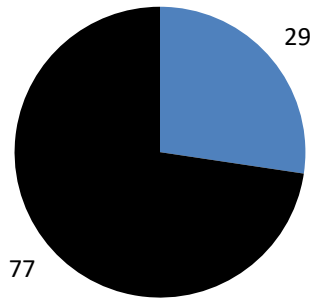

December 2020 vs. December 2019



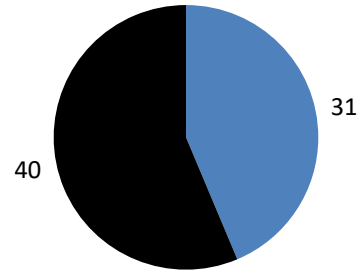
Arrest Types

On-Site Arrests



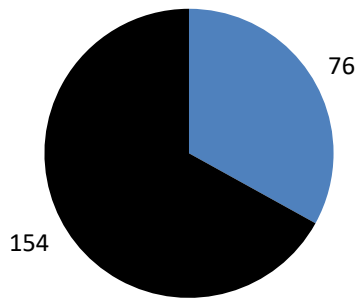
Warrant Arrests



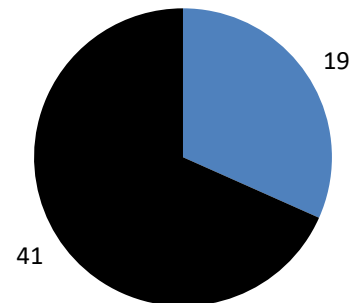
Charge Types
