Re: Police Department Activities – January 2021

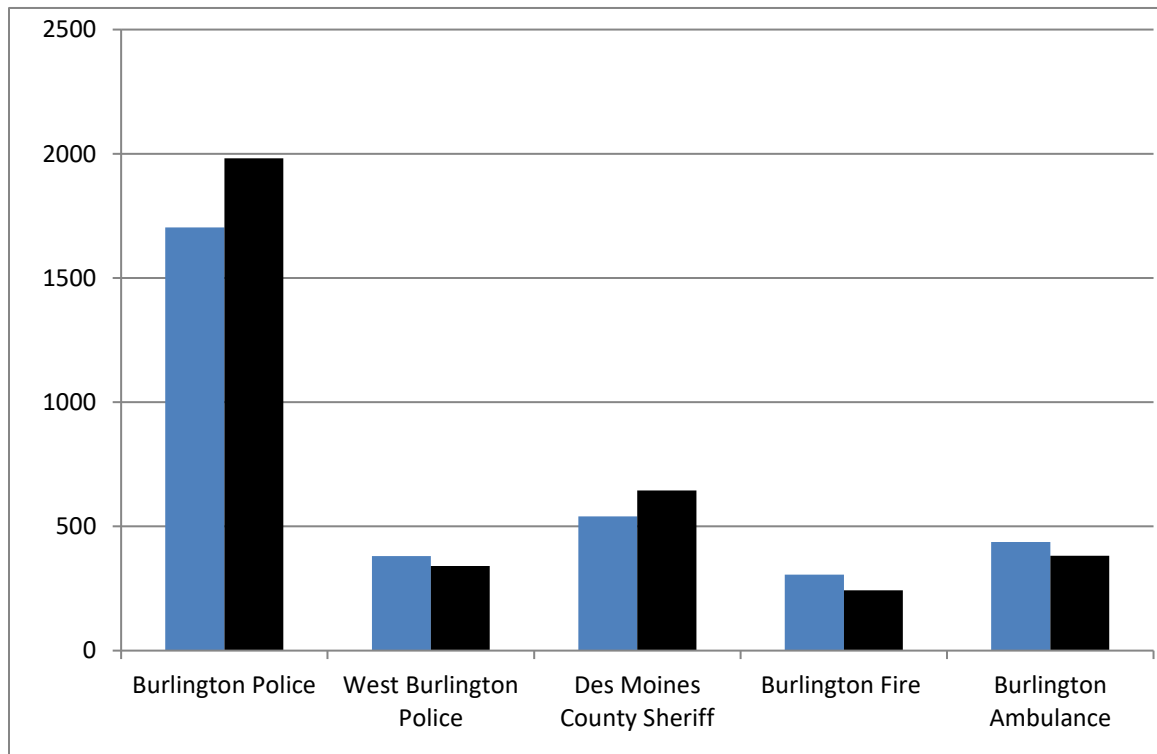
The issuance of a State of Public Health Disaster Emergency by Gov. Reynolds on March 17, 2020 and Mayor Billups Emergency Proclamation also on March 17th directly impacted the citizens of the community and daily operations of the Burlington Police Department as can be seen in the following activity report and statistics.

- Acting Chief Klein participated in City Council Meetings, a Special Meeting and Work Sessions.
- Acting Chief Klein participated in Department Head and Attorney meetings.
- Acting Chief Klein participated in:
 - A DesCom Control Board special meeting
 - A Young House Family Services board meeting
 - A Wunnenberg Foundation Board meeting
 - A meeting with Development Director Tysland
 - A budget presentation to City Council and City staff
- Major Schaefer participated in:
 - Weekly EOC COVID Briefings with Emergency Management
 - End-of-Step meetings with two Officers in the FTO process
 - Homeless Prevention meeting
 - Club M participation at Ed Stone and Aldo Leopold
 - Des Moines County Cultural Equity meeting
- Sworn officers participated in Active Shooter Response training via the PoliceOne Academy, daily training bulletins, Lexipol policy updates and utilized the Firearms Training Simulator. Individual officers attended De-escalation Train the Trainer certification, Law Enforcement Manager and Supervisor Training and the Tactical Response Unit conducted in a monthly training. The Records Department completed a Managing Police Records on-line training and there are five officers in the Field Training Officers program at various Steps or at the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy. During the month of January, there was one ride-a-long and no presentations to community groups.
- During the month of December, there were 54 animals received at the Animal Shelter. Please see the attached police department statistics for the month of January 2021 as well as comparative stats from January 2020:

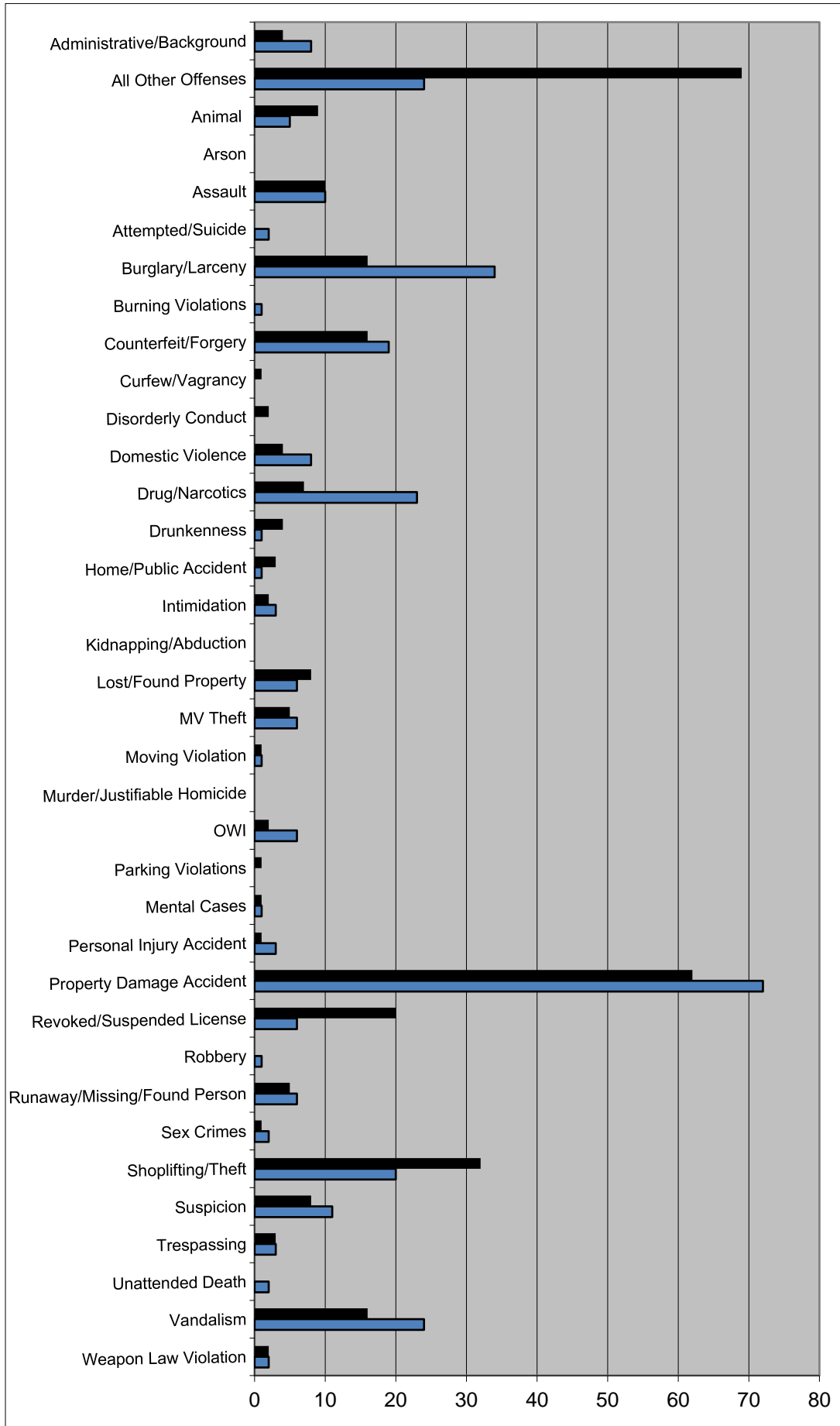

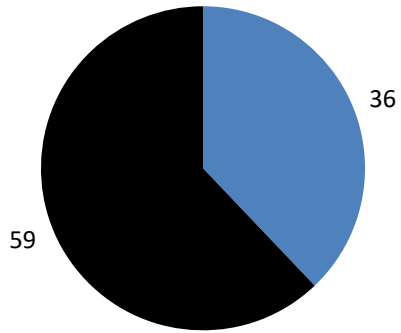

January 2021 vs. January 2020



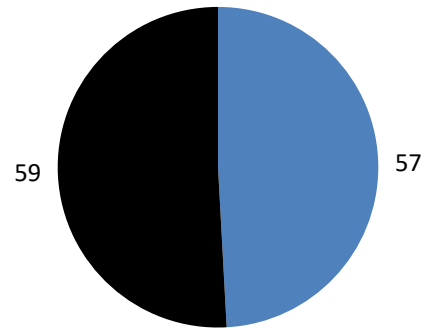
Arrest Types

On-Site Arrests



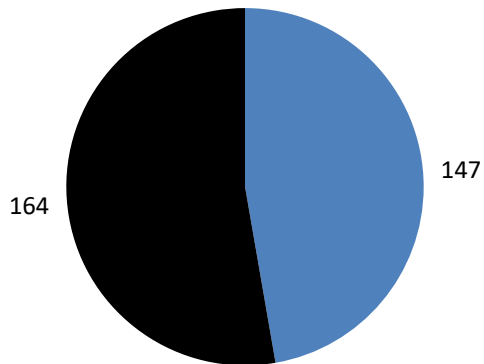
Warrant Arrests



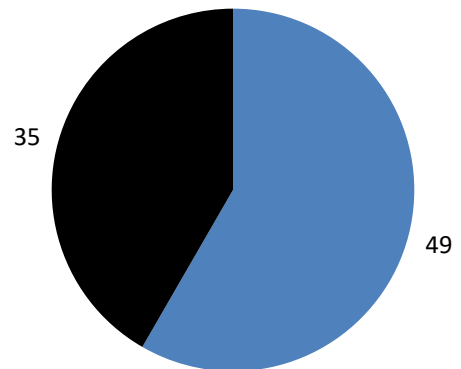
Charge Types
