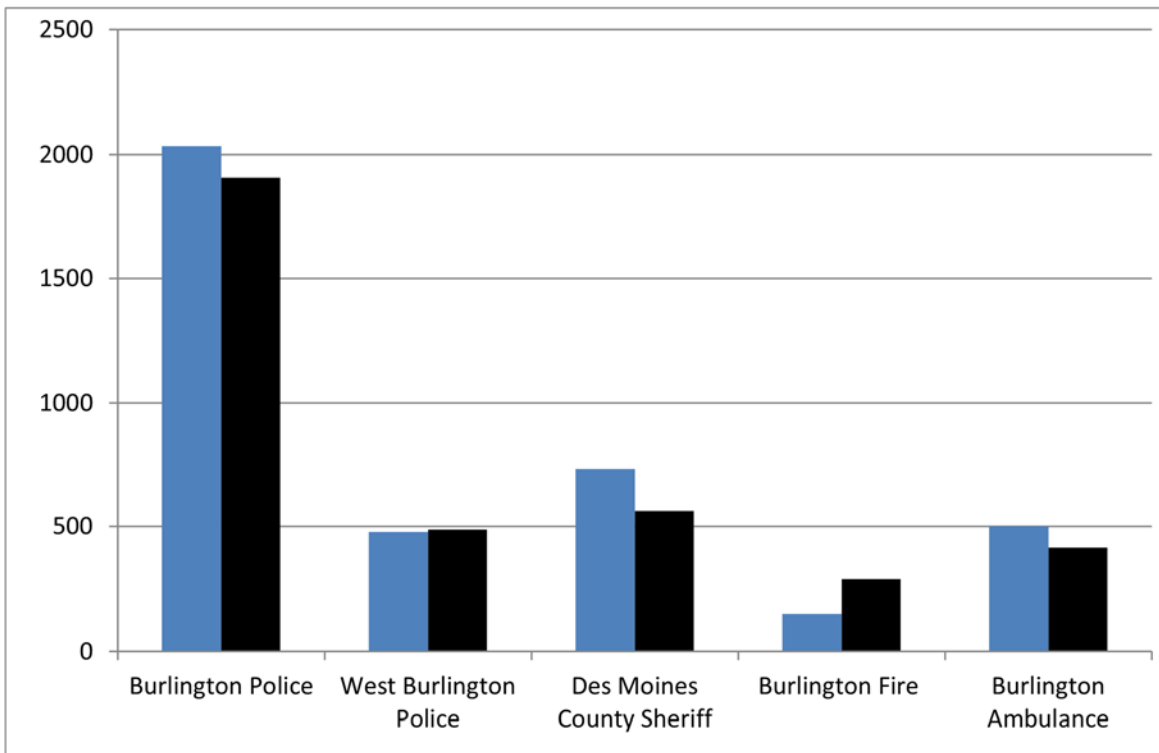

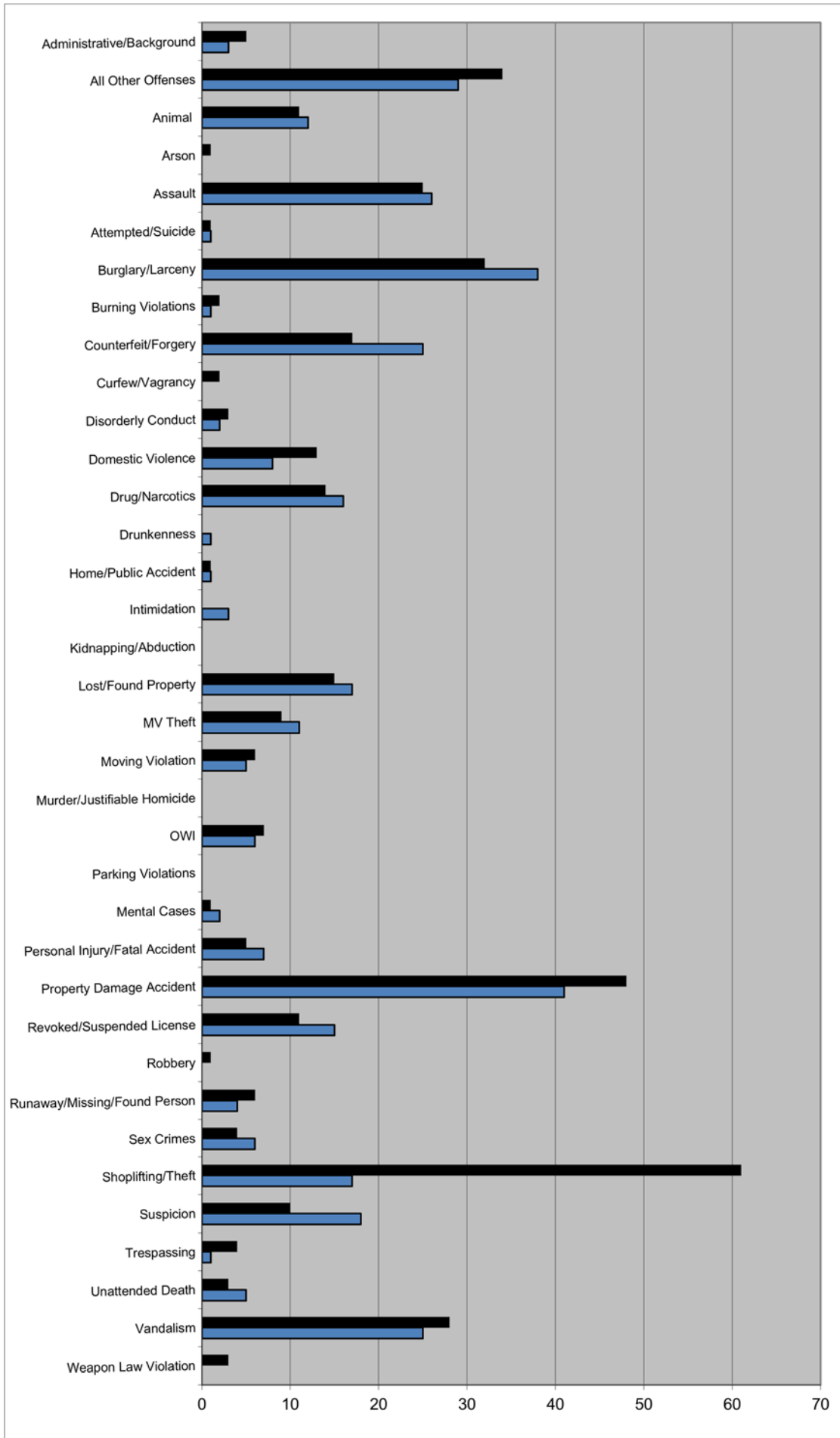

September 2021 vs. September 2020

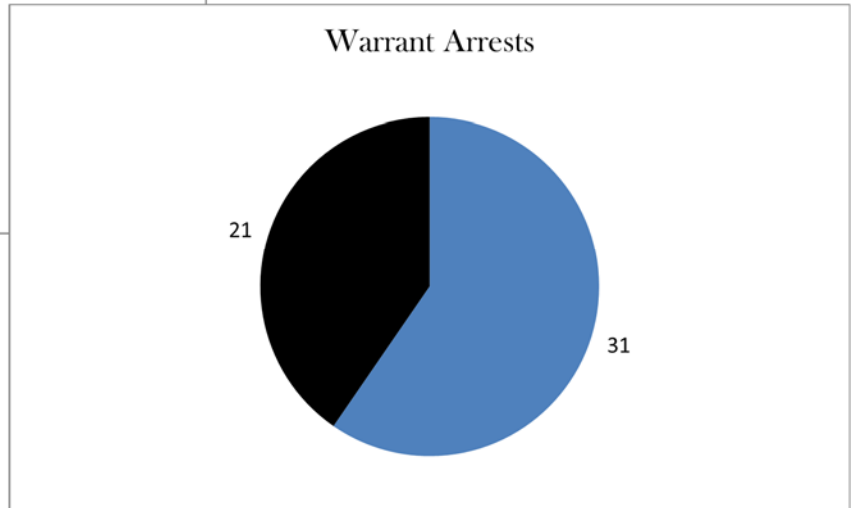
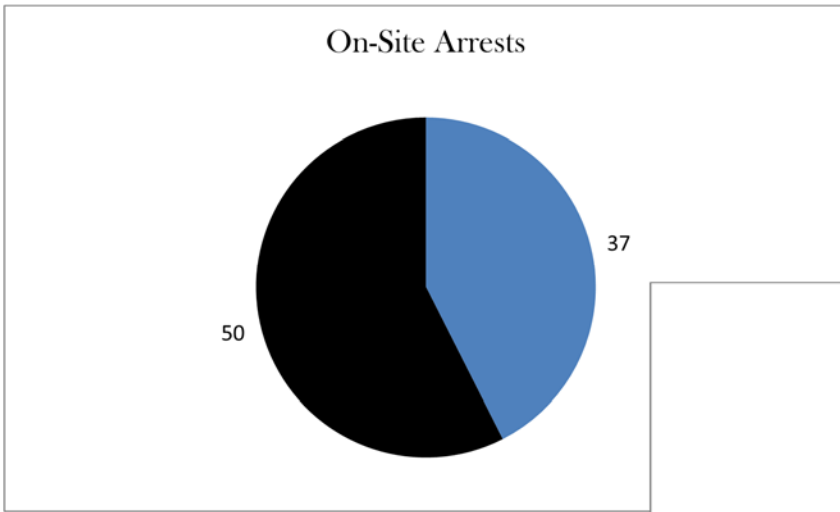

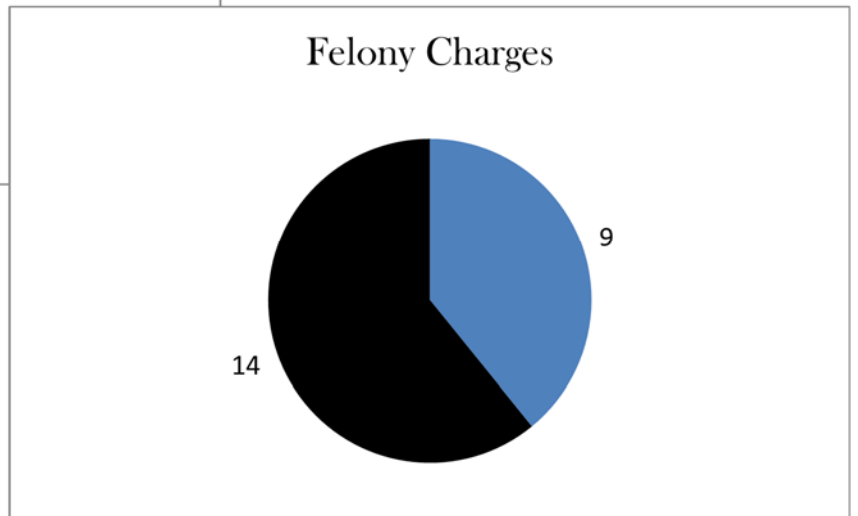
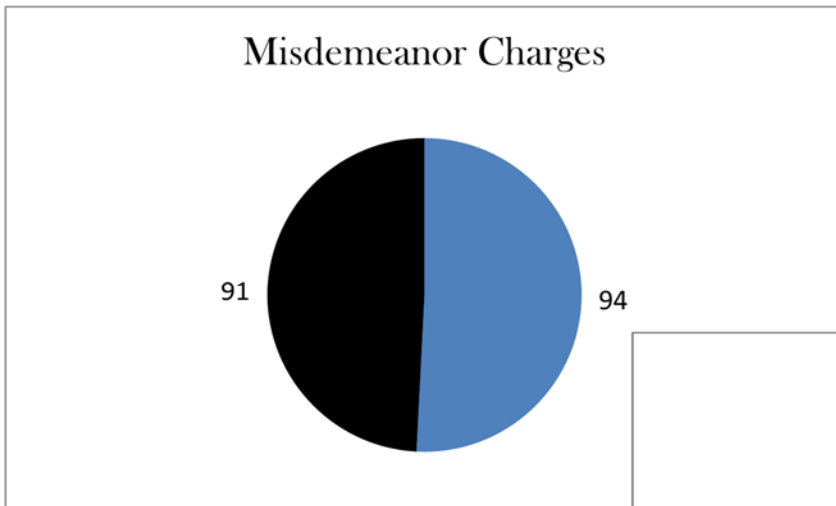
September 2021 vs. September 2020
