Events attended by various Command Officers and Police Officers included:

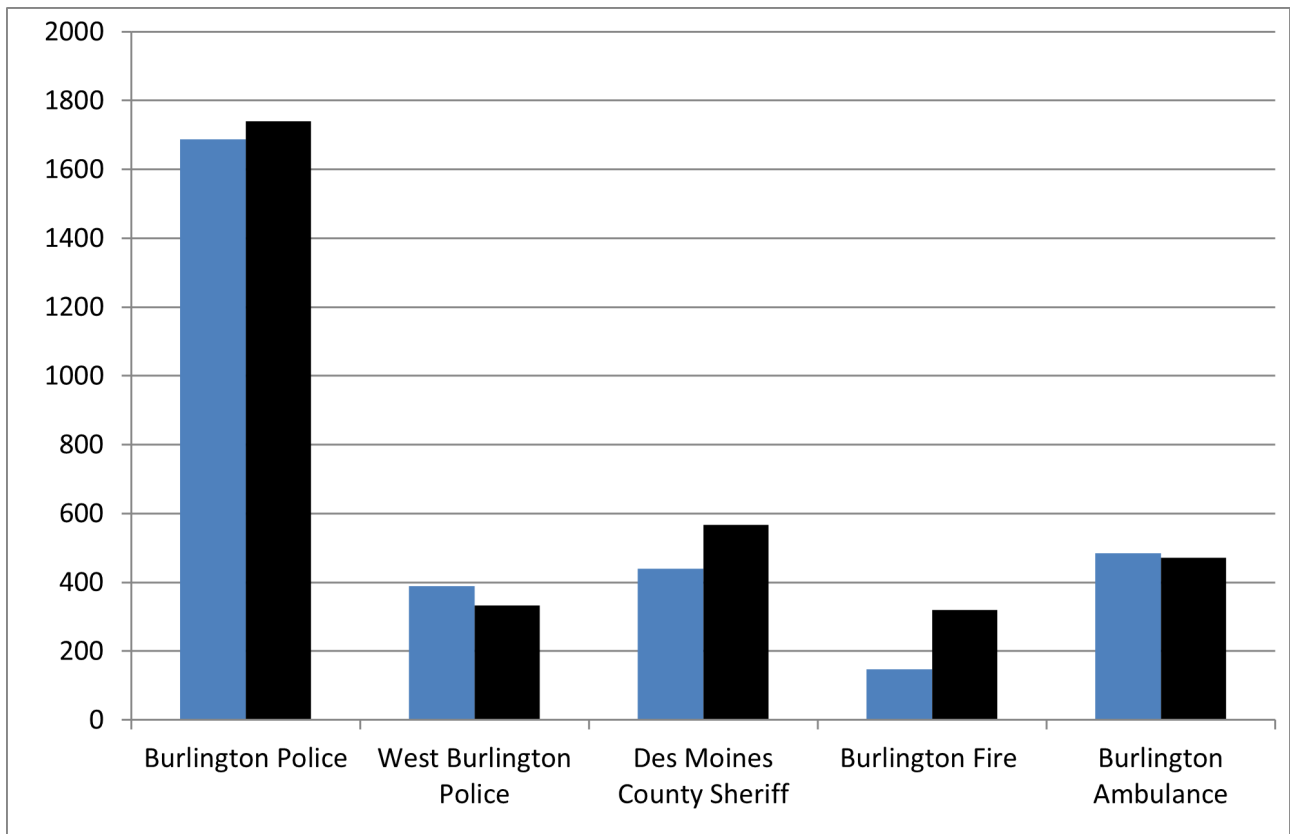
- * Police Officer applicant interviews.

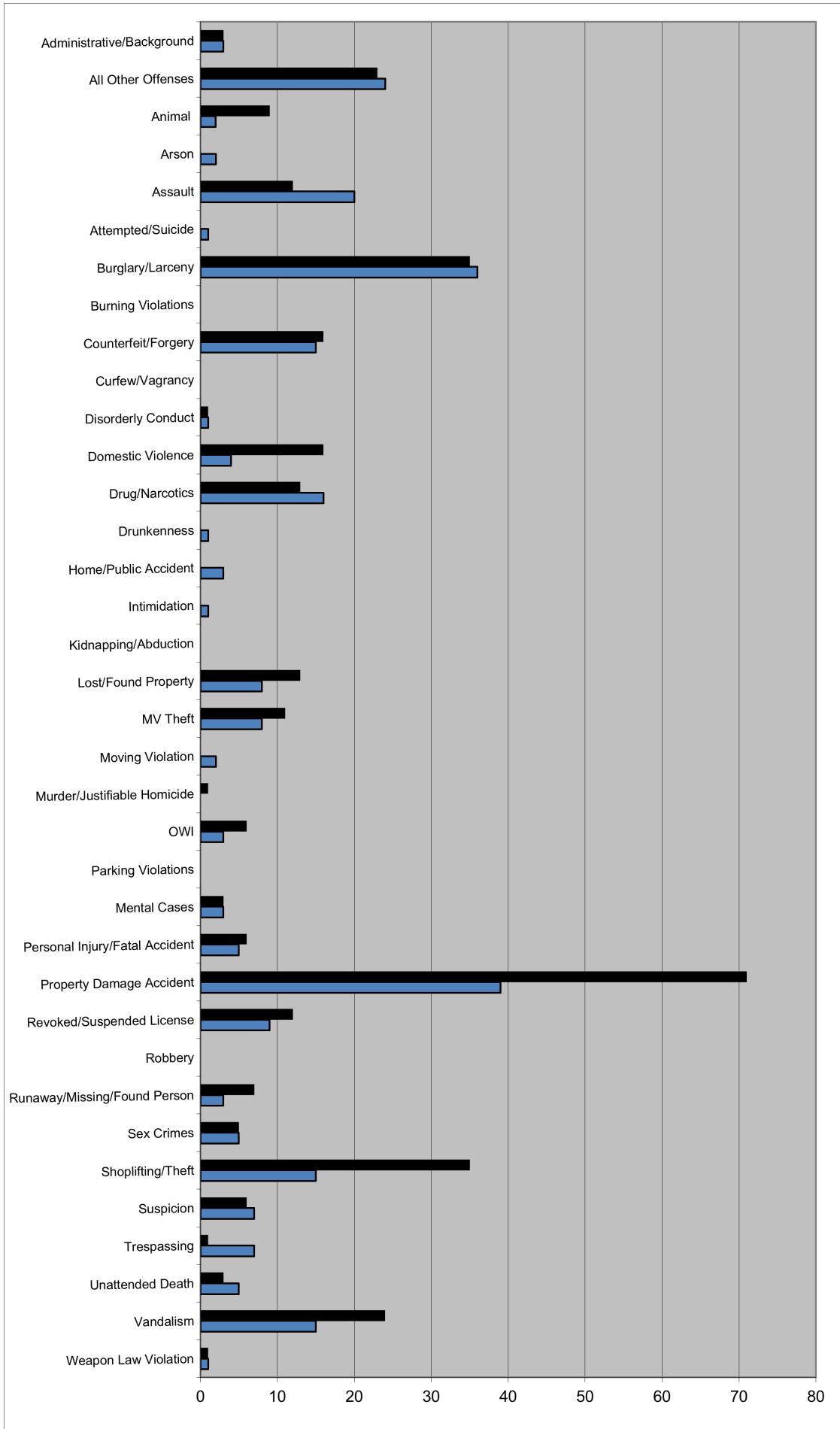

November 2021 vs. November 2020



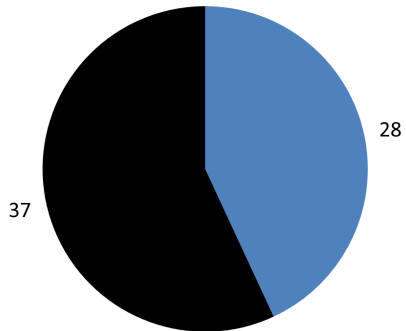

November 2021 vs. November 2020

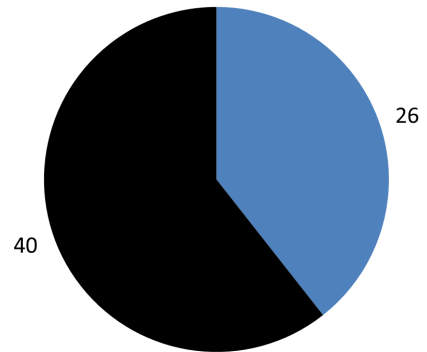


Arrest Types

On-Site Arrests

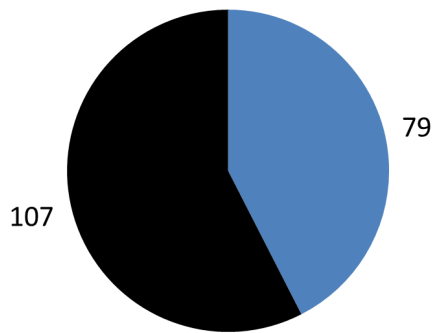


Warrant Arrests

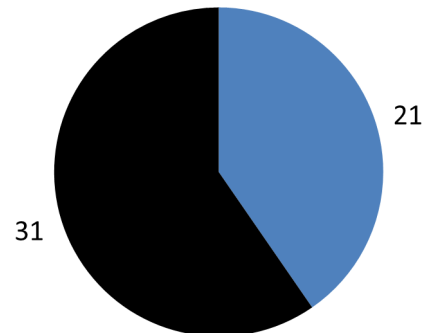


Charge Types
