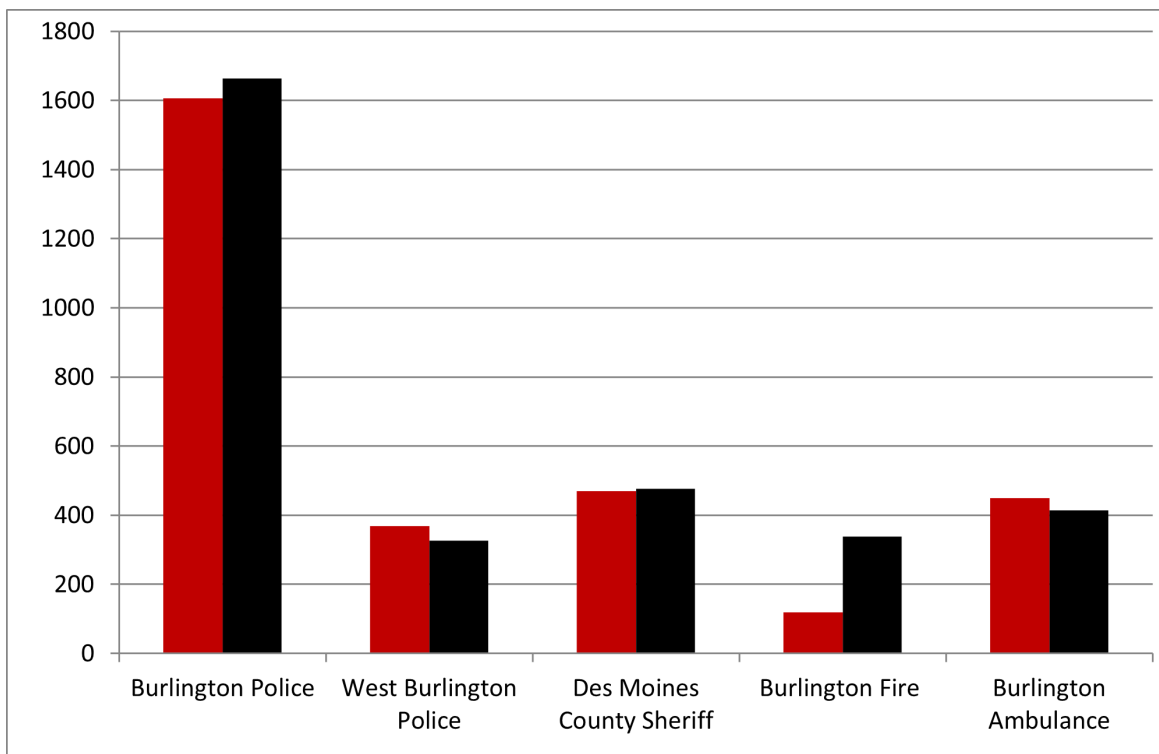

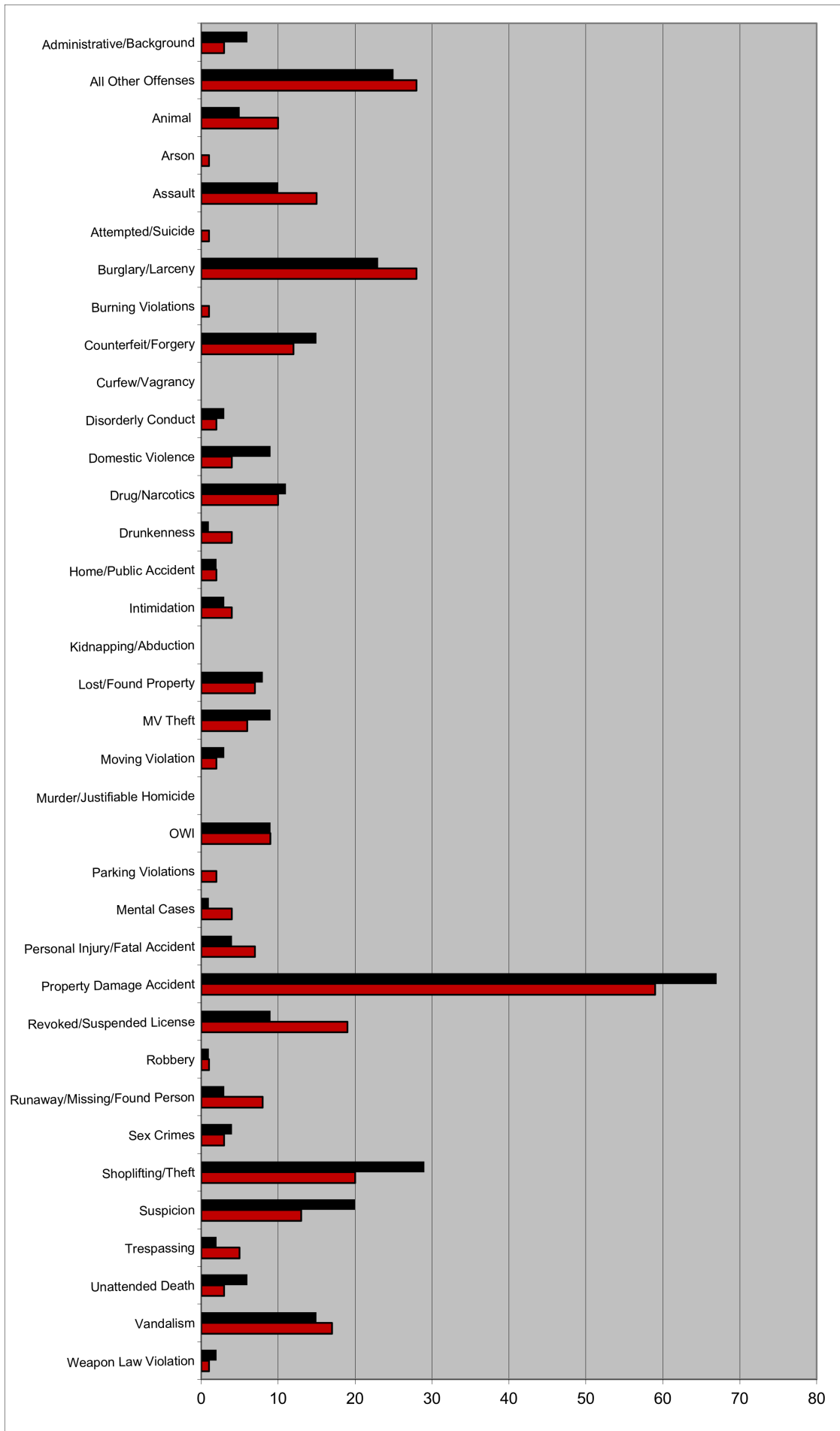

February **2022** vs. February **2021**

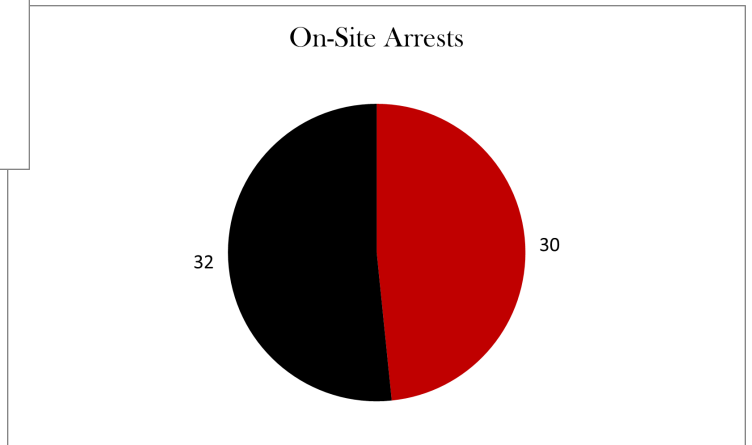
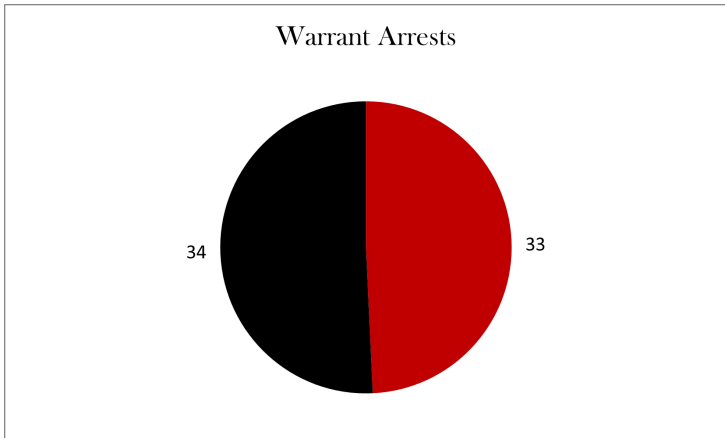

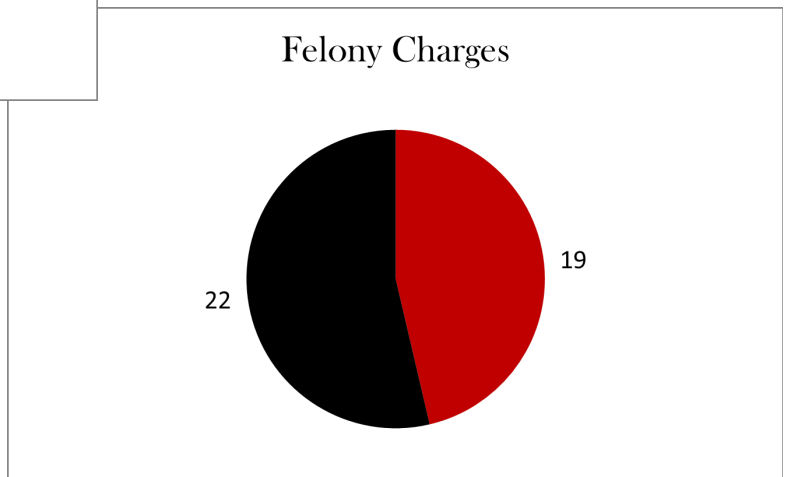
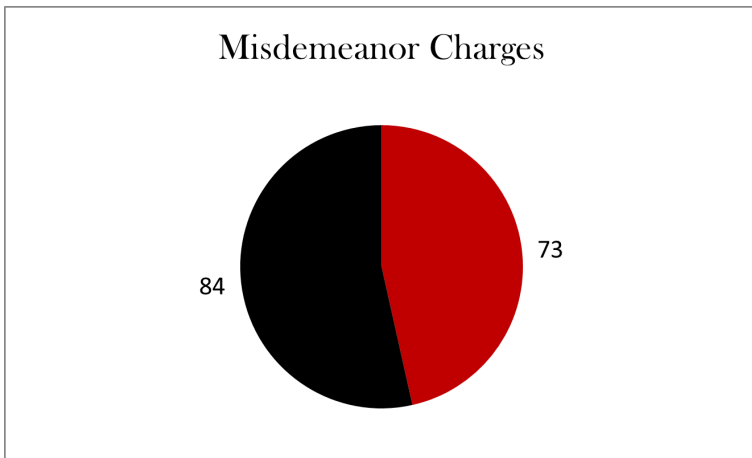
February 2022 vs. February 2021
