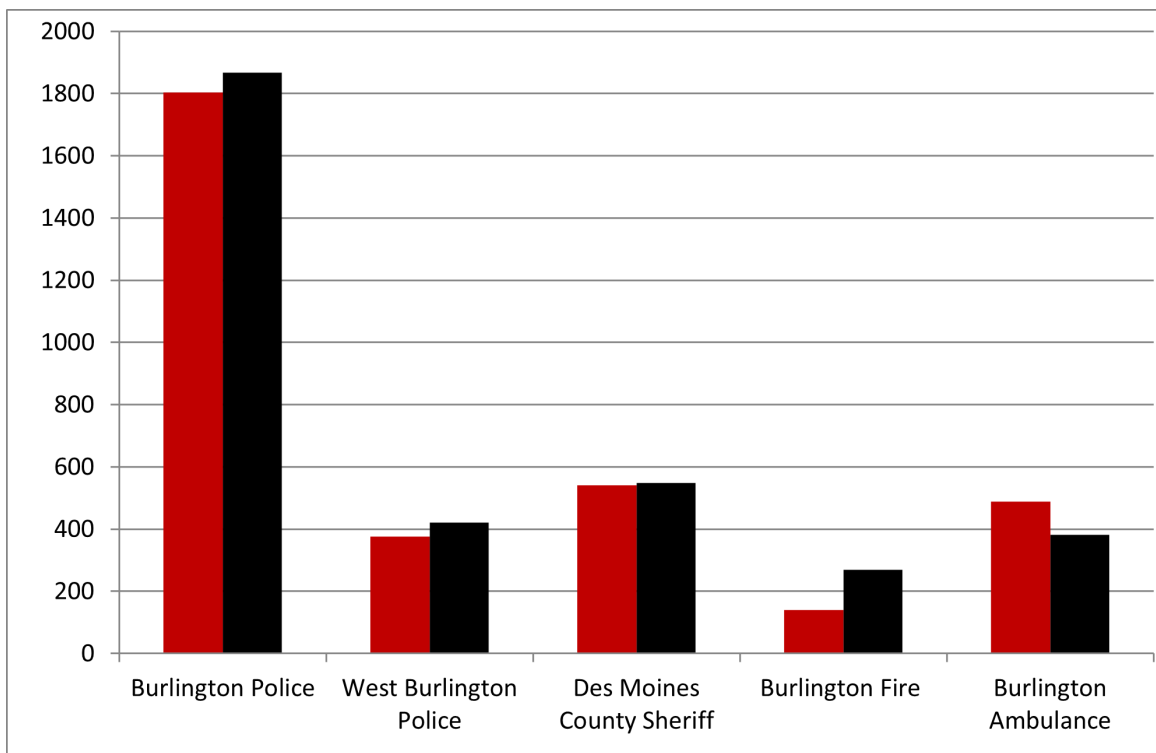

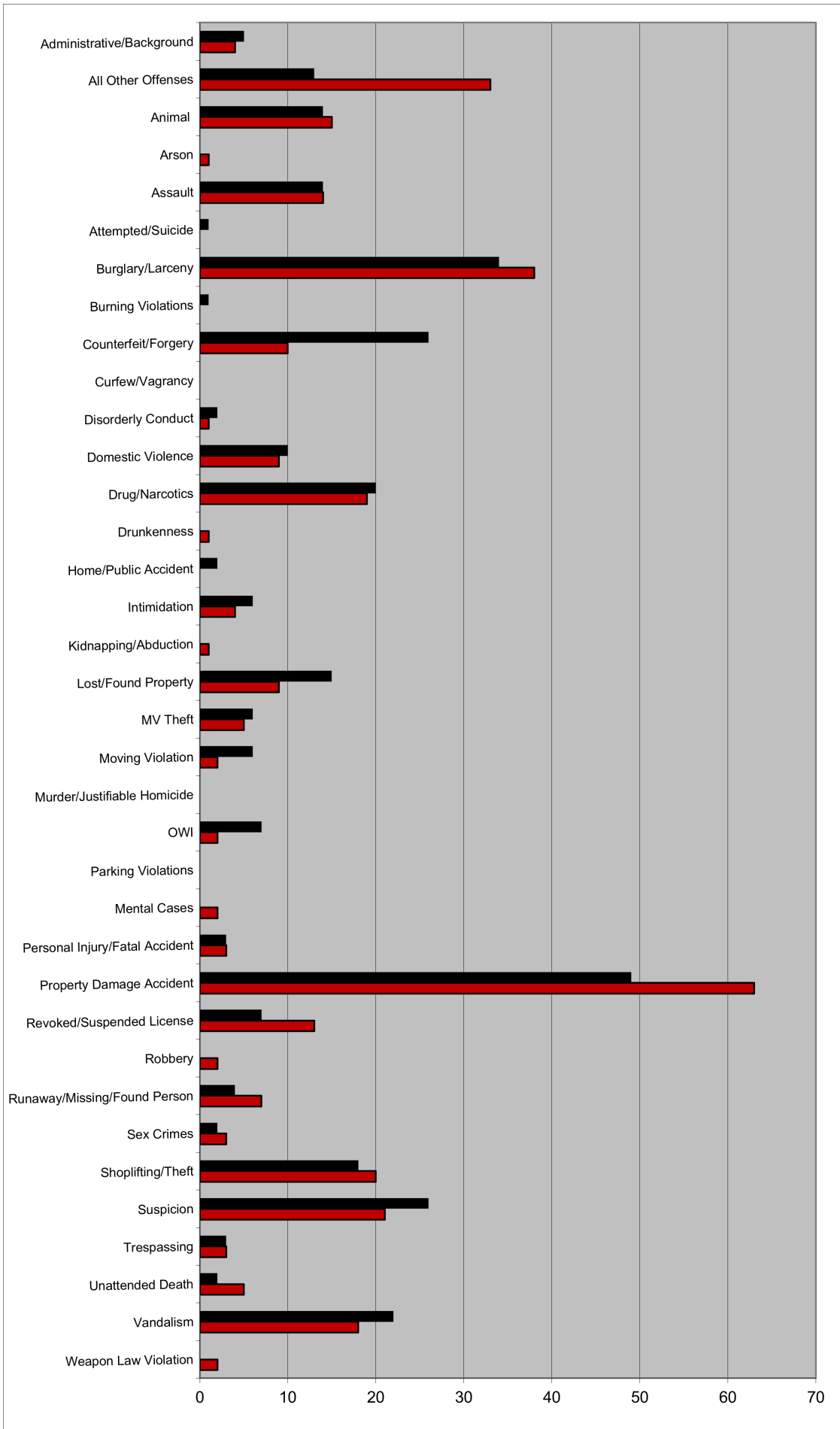

**March 2022 vs. March 2021**



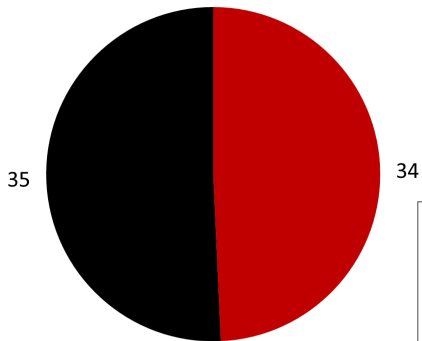

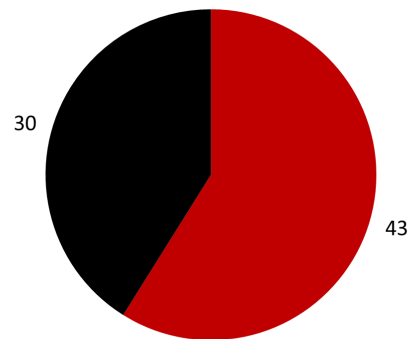


### Arrest Types March 2022 vs. March 2021
