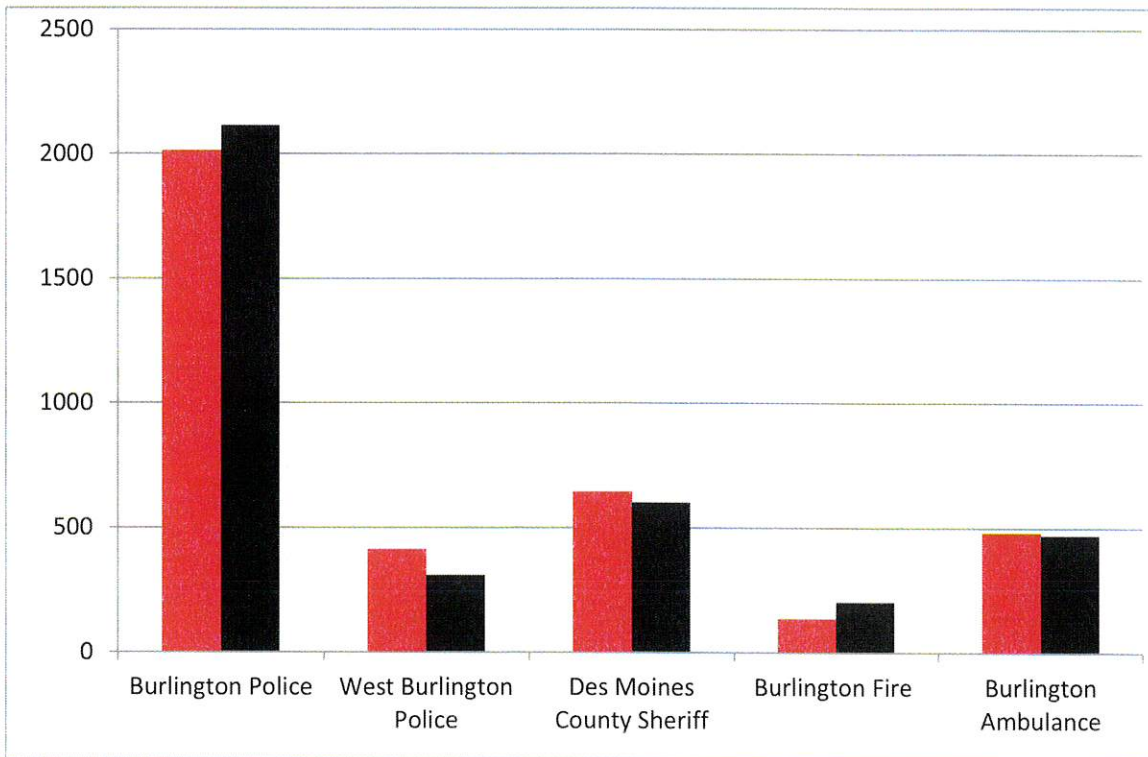

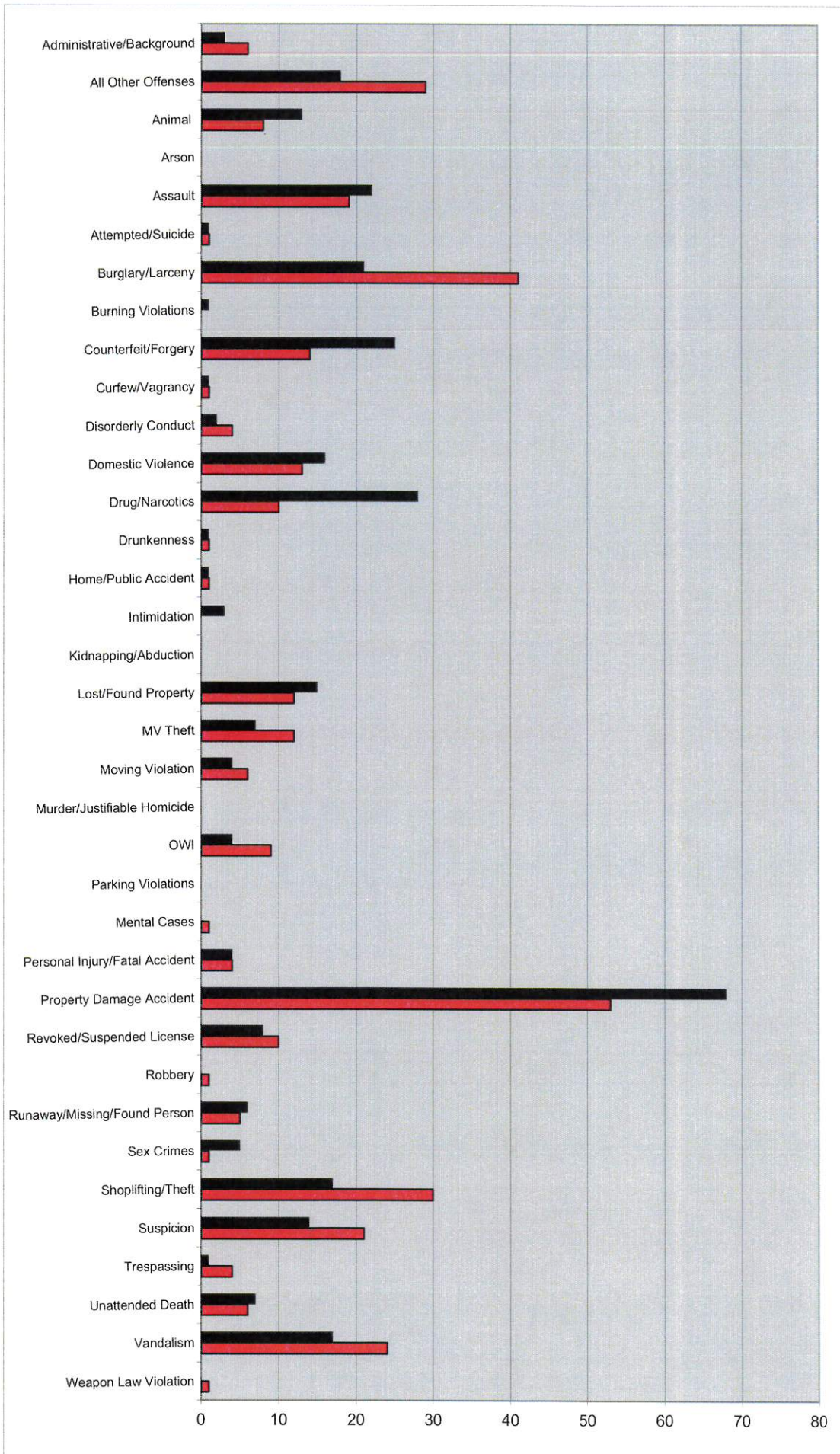

May 2022 vs. May 2021

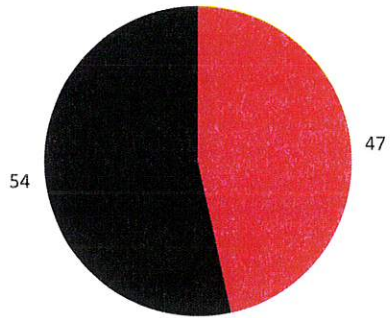


Incidents
May 2022 vs. May 2021

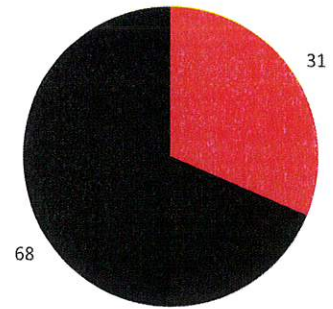


Arrest Types

On-Site Arrests

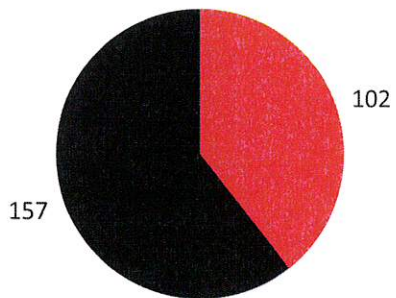


Warrant Arrests

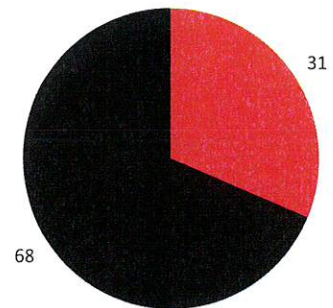


Charge Types

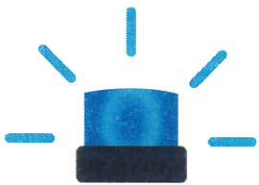
