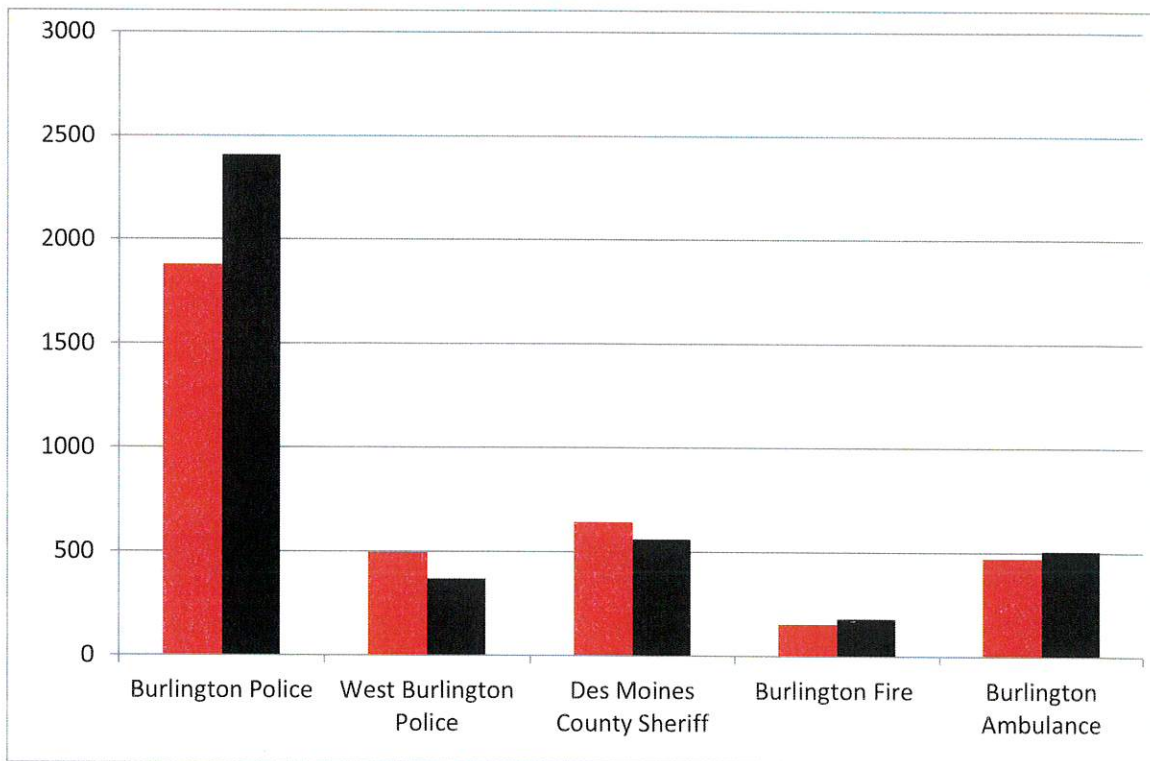

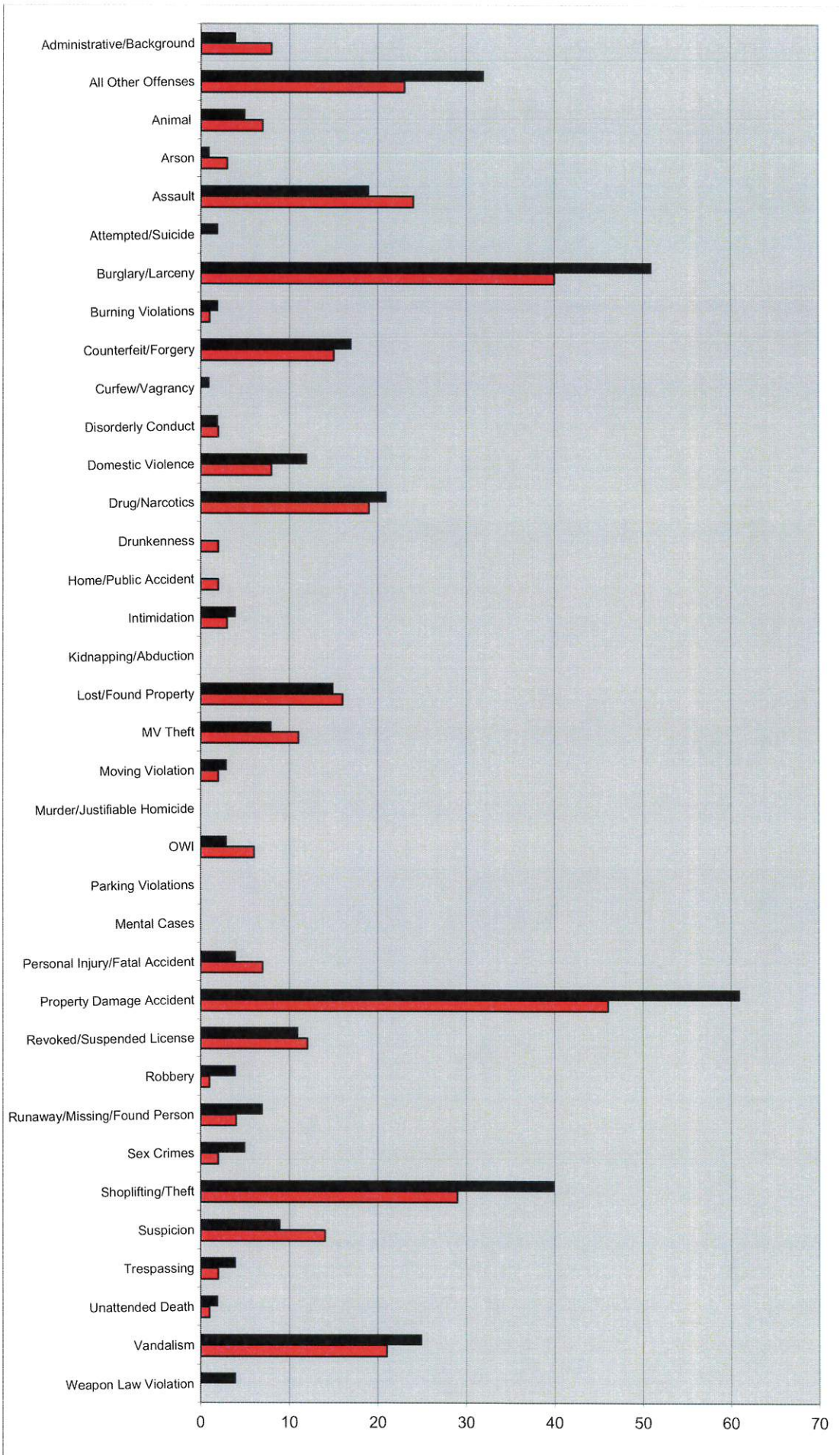

June 2022 vs. June 2021



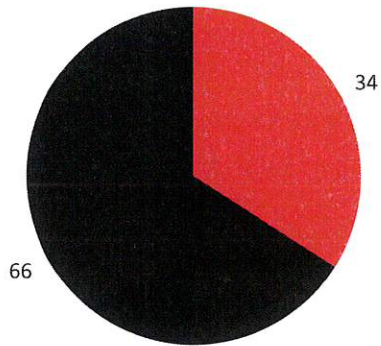

June 2022 vs. June 2021

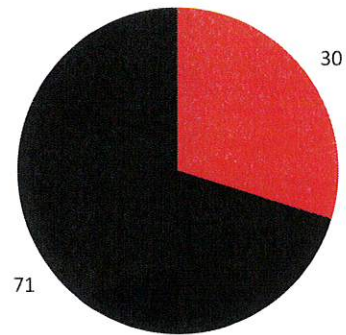


Arrest Types

On-Site Arrests

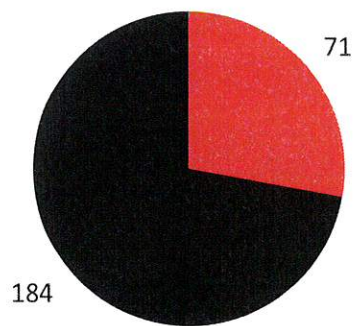


Warrant Arrests

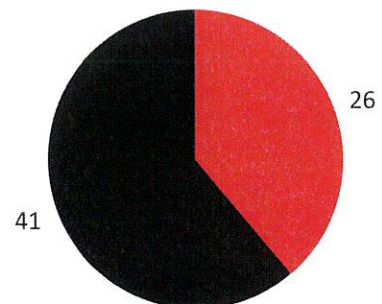


Charge Types

Felony Charges

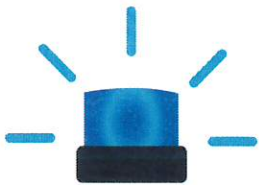
