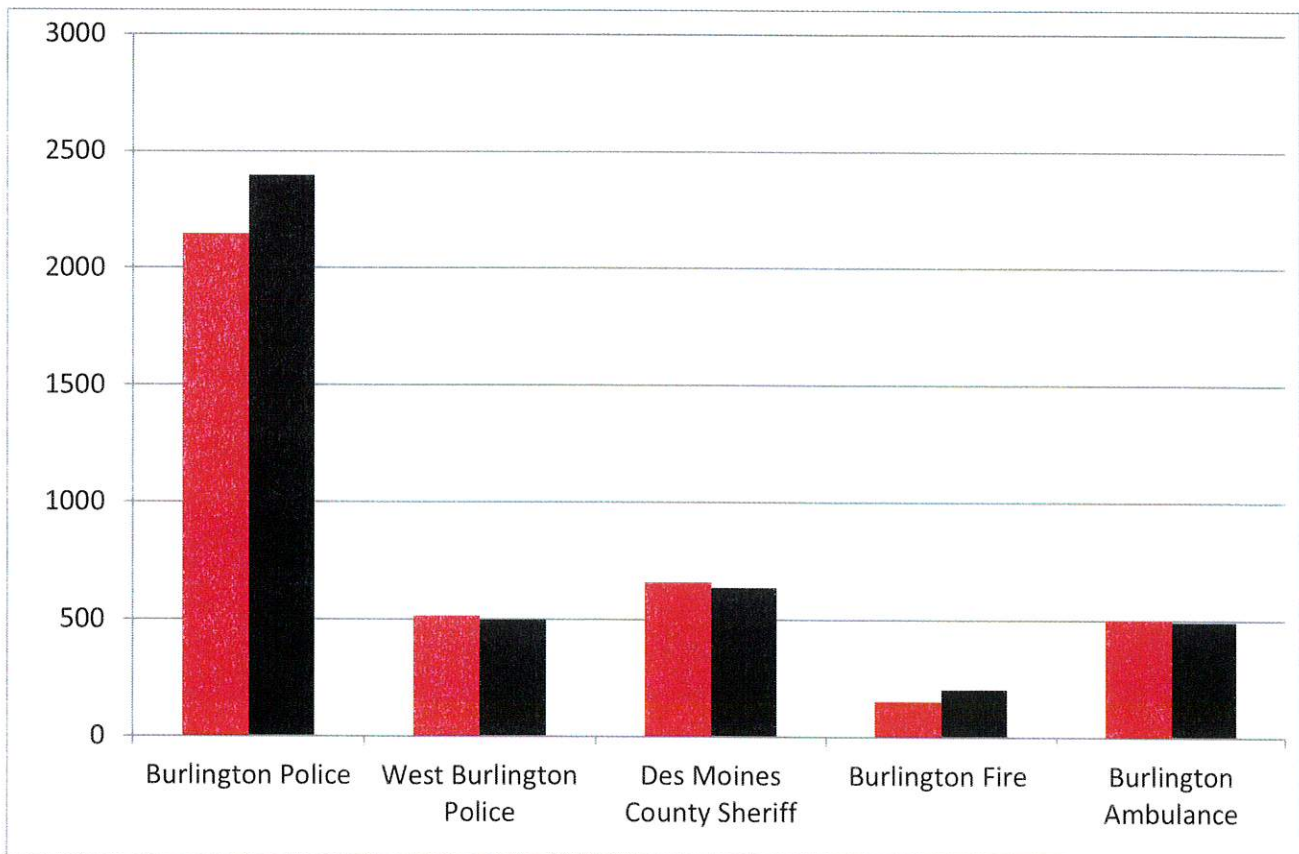

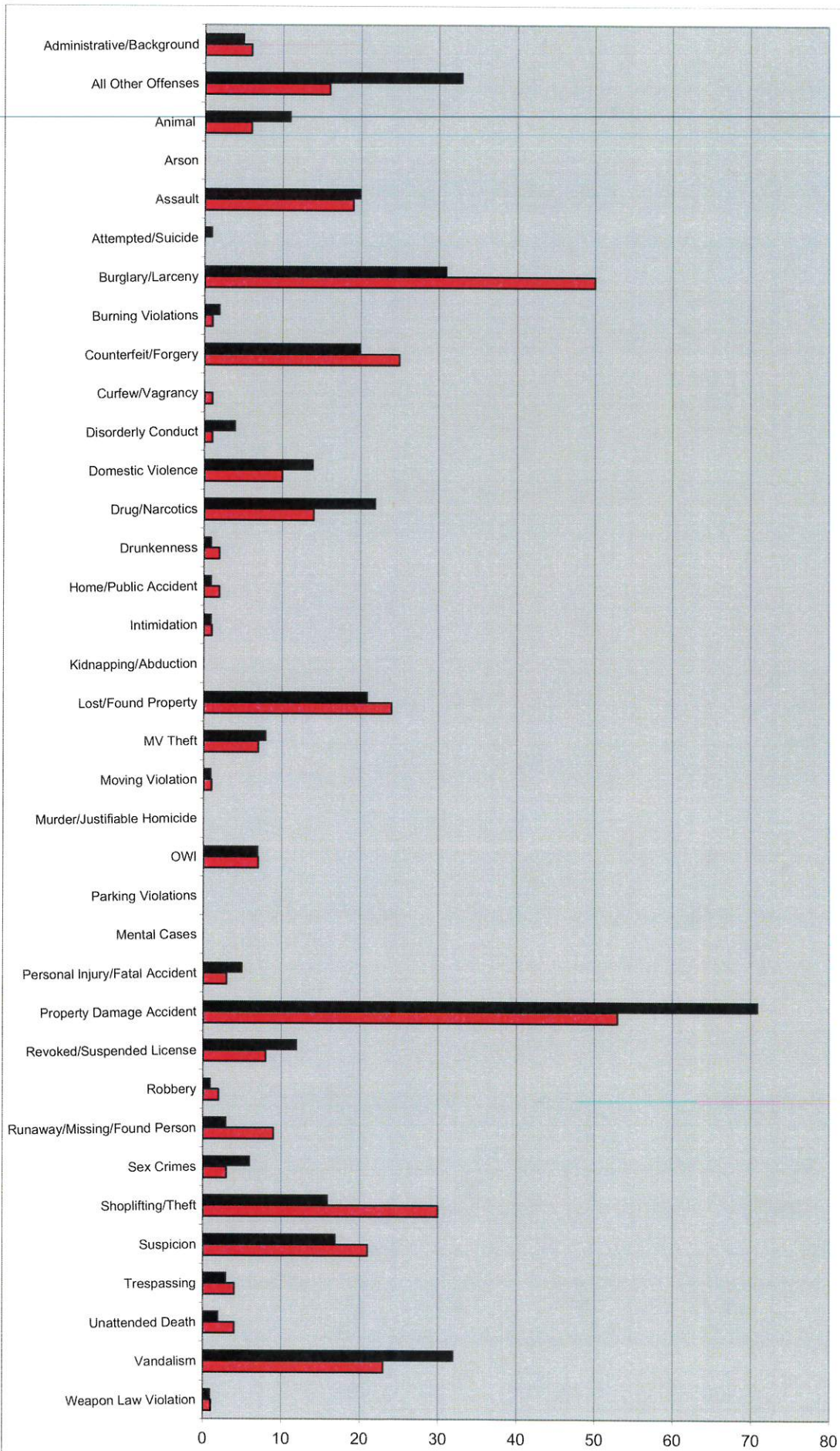

July 2022 vs. July 2021



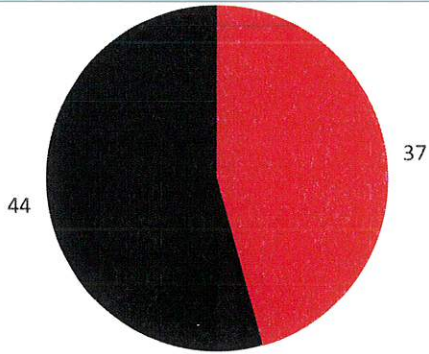

July 2022 vs. July 2021

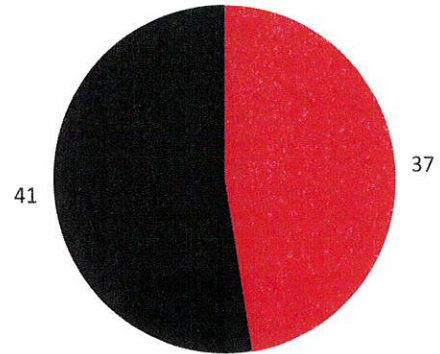


Arrest Types

On-Site Arrests

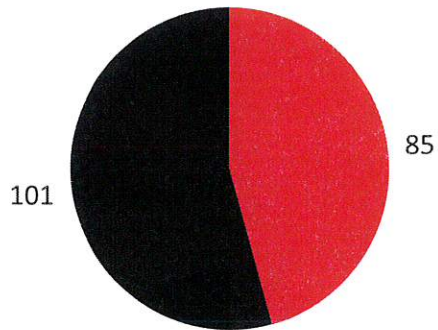


Warrant Arrests

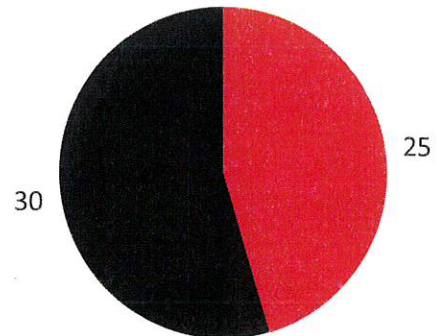


Charge Types
