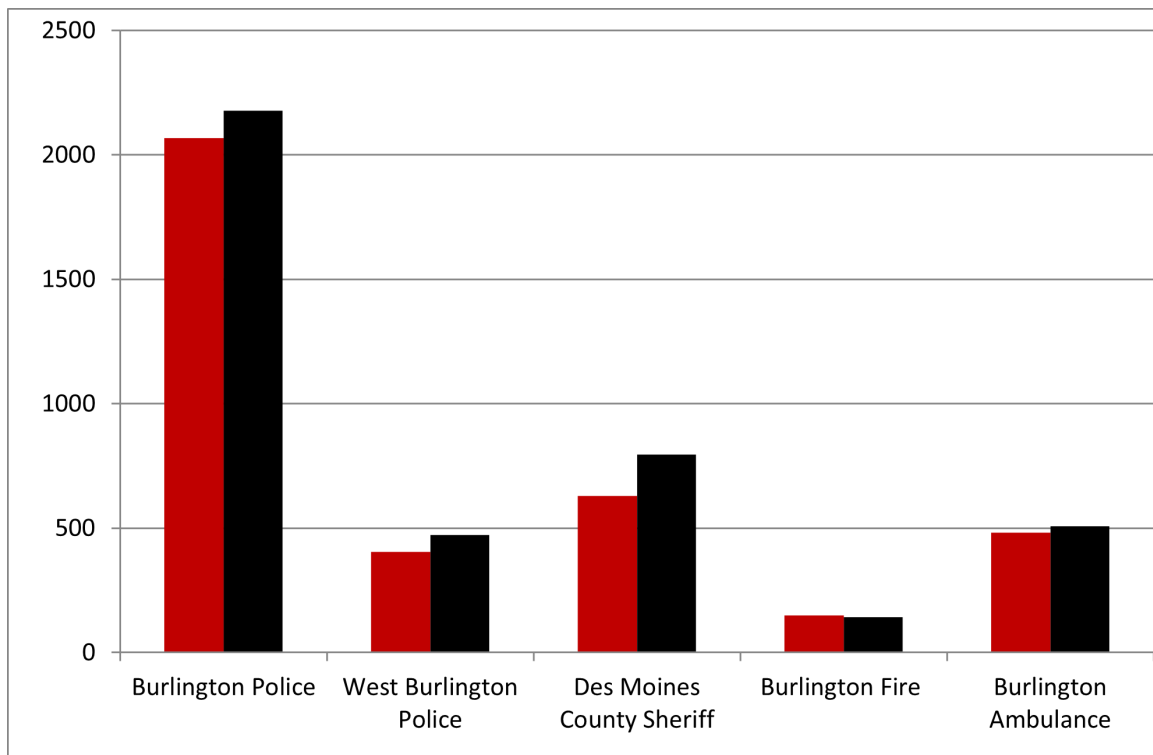

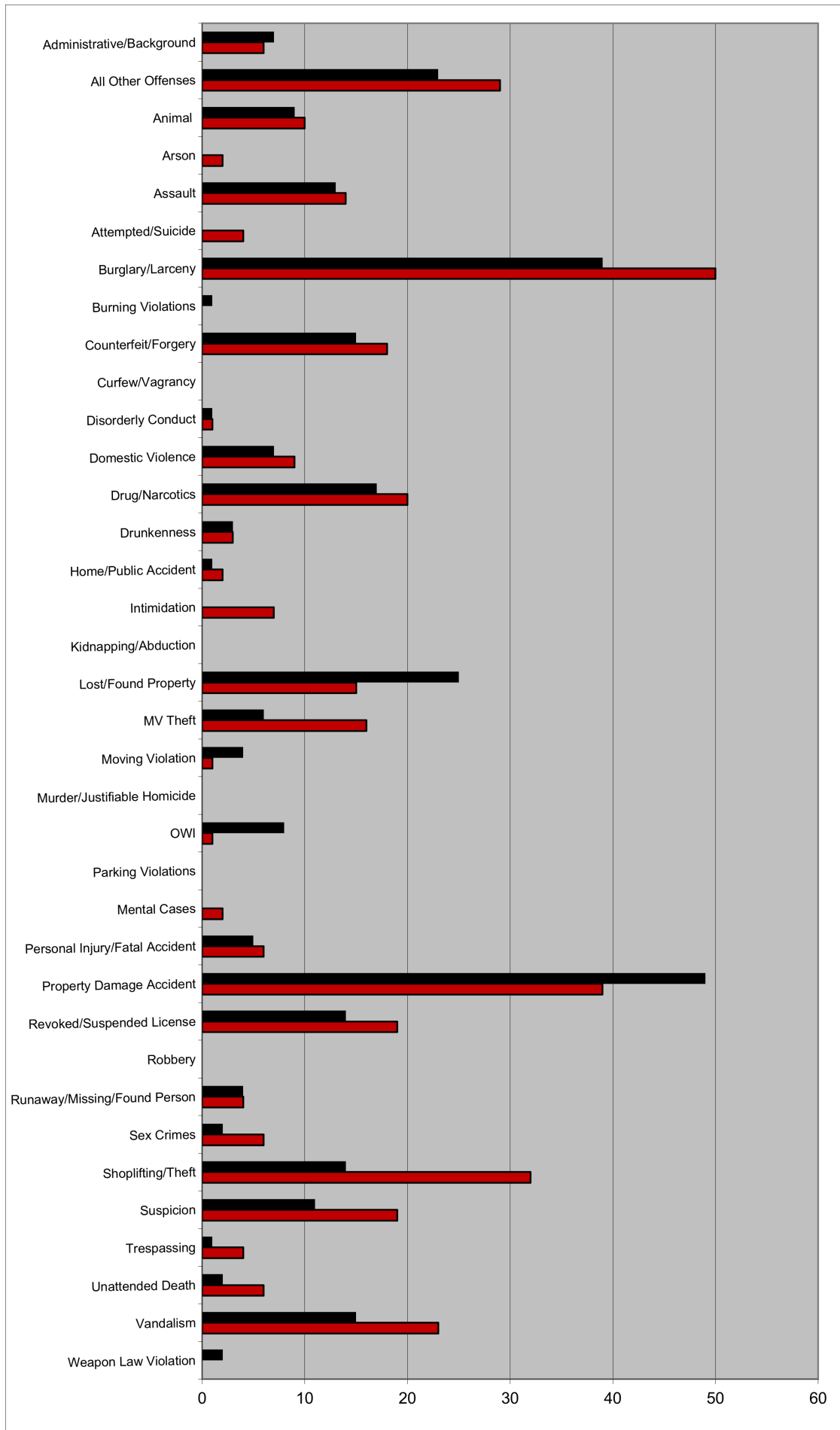

August **2022** vs. August **2021**



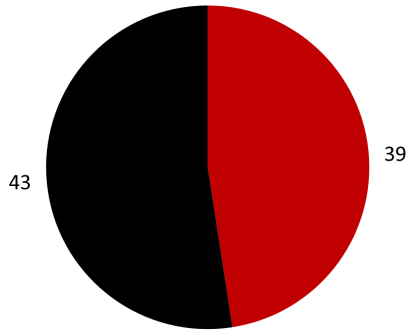

August 2022 vs. August 2021

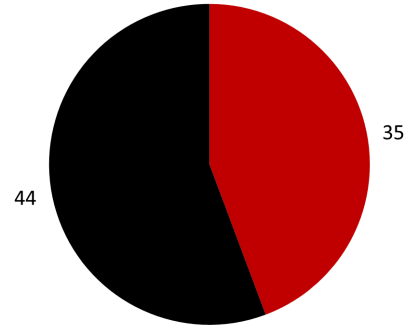


Arrest Types

On-Site Arrests

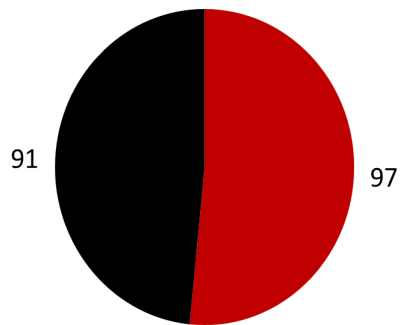


Warrant Arrests

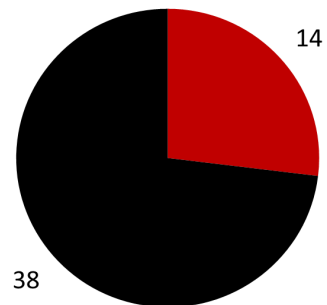


Charge Types
